Approved Papers for the week ending Saturday, October 5, 1889.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to Charles F. Petry to place and keep a watering-trough on the sidewalk, near the curb-line, in front of his premises, No. 976 Tenth avenue, the work to be done and water supplied at his own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

METERS

Under the provisions of section 352, Consolidated Act
88a, water-meters, of approved pattern, shall be herefler placed on the pipes supplying all stores, works ops

hotels, manufactories, public edifices, at wharves, ferry-houses, stables, and in all places where water is furnished for business consumption, except private dwellings. It is provided by section 352, Laws of 1882, that "all expenses of meters, their connections and setting, water rates, and other lawful charges for the supply of Croton water, shall be a lien upon the premises where such water is supplied, as now provided by law." * All manufacturing and other business requiring a large supply of water will be fitted with a meter. Water measured by meter, ten cents per one hundred cubic feet.

No horse-troughs or norse-watering fixtures will be permitted in the street or on the sidewalk, except upon a license or permit taken out for that purpose. All licenses or permits must be annually renewed on the first of May. Such fixtures must be kept in good order and the water not allowed to drip or waste by overrunning the sidewalk or street, or to become dangerous in winter by freezing in and about such troughs or fixtures.

The man object of the use of water-meters is to enable this Department to detect and check the useless and unavarnantable waste of an element so valuable and essential to the health and comfort of all the citizens, and this object can only be accomplished by enforcing payment for the water wasted.

Under the law all charges for water supplied through meters at val lien against the respective premises, and he law therefore holds the owner of the premises responsible for the amount of water used or wasted.
