At the same time, this direct eastern extension of the city line was to form a basis from which the boundary-line of the City of New York, described as running from the centre line of the Bronx river to the middle of the channel, between Hunter's Island and Clen Island, weuld approximately be located.

from the centre line of the Bronx river to the middle of the channel, between Hunter's Island and Glen Island, would approximately be located. This work was completed and will be tested in the coming triangulation of the district. This line is marked on the ground by 6 stone monuments and 30 stakes. The survey of the territory east of the Bronx river is to be prosecuted after the methods adopted by the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, and is to be connected with the Coast Survey triangulation. All charts and publications issued by the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, and relating to this district, giving the geodetic and astronomical stations, with the latitude, longtitude, azimuth, distances, etc., have to be received and the coast survey points examined. The preliminary reconvaisance of the entire district was made for the purpose of testing the locality of stations, their nature, availability, intervisibility and other requirements. A series of observations and a number of magnetic bearings with transit were taken at prominent points of the district. One base-line, designated the Unionport base, on the Eastern Boulevard, was selected from which triangles and quadrilaterals for the survey will be developed, and an additional base-line will be established in the northern section of the district.

A line parallel to 10th ave, and distant 16,400 feet easterly therefrom was cut through and measured with the spring balance chain and connected with the monuments on Whittier street at Hunt's Point ; this line has a length of 33,000 feet.

Independently of the triangulation the district has been subdivided into 11 divisions, and the complete topographical survey of each division will be made and connected afterward with the triangulation. Three (3) field parties are at work at the present time on Divisions 1 and 2. An office for Computers and Draughtsmen was established at Williamsbridge where field notes of surveys are being plotted and where the force engaged in this new territory is to report. The designs for observation towers, tripods, signals, measuring apparatus, are fairly under way. "G."—Copying Records at White Plains. The copying of property maps and maps of villages in the newly annexed territory of the 24th Ward is in progress.


