POLICE DEPARTMENT.

Report for the Quarter Ending June 30, 1900.

Police Department of The City of New York, New York, July 1, 1900.

Hon. ROBERT A. VAN WYCK, Mayor, New York City:

SIR—Pursuant to section 1544, chapter 376 of the Laws of 1897, the Police Board of the Police Department of The City of New York hereby submits the following report of the operations and transactions of the Police Department and Force, for the three months ending June 30, 1900:

REPORT.

On the 30th day of June, 1900, the number of the Force of all grades, including persons on probation (67), was 7,477.

The time lost by members of the Force by reason of sickness, disability and injuries received, tor the quarter, and the details thereof, will be found in Schedule annexed, marked "A," from which it will be seen that the sick time lost was 18,577 days. Sick time paid, 9,288½ days; sick time unpaid, 9,288½ days. Total days' time of the Force was 671,693 days. Per cent. of sick to full time, 2.76. For preceding quarter, 3.65. Amount paid for sick time, \$31,935.95, a decrease of \$12,275.20 over that paid for preceding quarter.

The total number of persons arrested by the Police Force during the quarter was: Males, 29,046; females, 7,457. Total, 36,503. Number arrested for principal felonies, 2,749; number discharged without trial, 770; number acquitted, 424; number convicted, 520; number sent to other authorities, 49; number died, 6; number pending, 980.

LOST CHILDREN-(see Schedule "B").

Males, 941; females, 566. Total, 1,507. Restored to parents or guardians, 1,476. Other dispositions, 31. Of this number there were disposed of from Central Office, 932.

Schedule "B" contains a valuable collection of miscellaneous statistics, to which attention is

respectfully called.

Note—The discrepancy existing between the number of arrests for particular offenses in Felony Report and General Report (in Schedule "B") is accounted for by the fact that the General Report is made up from the daily returns from the Station-houses, and the Felony Report is made from the quarterly returns. An offense charged in the Station-house at the time the arrest is made is liable to be, and often is, changed to a greater or less offense on evidence elicited before the Magistrate. before the Magistrate.

SIR-I have the honor to submit herewith the quarterly report of the operations and financial condition of the Department of Parks of the boroughs of Manhattan and Richmond, required by the Charter, for the three months ending June 30, 1900.

Work of the Landscape Gardener and Force.

Pruning work was continued during the quarter and completed in April, all of the trees and shrubs receiving attention in this direction. The usual work of removing trees which had failed to survive the severe winter was attended to, involving considerable labor. The spading in of manure on bare ground and in the shrubberies continued and was completed early in the quarter.

The lawns in front of the American Museum of Natural History Building in Manhattan square were renovated, regraded and seeded early in the season, as were large plots in the Ramble and the upper portion of the Central Park and the parks generally where such work was necessary. The grass has grown well and the work will greatly improve the appearance of the parks unless damaged by the dry summer weather. The incomplete condition of the Central Park irrigation system is a drawback in this connection.

The display of spring flowers was a source of delight to visitors for about two months. With the completion of the Central Park irrigation system this feature will soon be established upon a very satisfactory basis and the flowers will appear in masses in locations where they would naturally be found. Masses of plants may now be seen in the Ramble and along the drives in sheltered places, and thousands of indigenous plants have been established as undergrowth, including native asters, golden rod, spotted geraniums, blue violets and others. The spreading of the wild flowers in the woods is giving them a more rural appearance.

The formal planting for spring display in the smaller parks was commenced early in April

The formal planting for spring display in the smaller parks was commenced early in April and proved satisfactory. Sixty thousand plants were used for the purpose. Planting for summer display commenced the latter part of May and continued during June. This work was somewhat delayed owing to the new Labor Law which prevented employing the gardeners overtime. Owing to the necessity of doing a great deal of this kind of work in a few weeks in the spring, heretofore it has been customary to employ the gardeners ten hours a week overtime, and the impossibility of continuing the practice will, in some instances, prevent the display of the flowers at their best until August. The usual spring planting of trees and shrubs was undertaken, about five thousand trees and shrubs and eight hundred evergreens being set out. In addition to these, twenty thousand herbaceous plants and bulbs were planted.

The Entomologist and his force were employed during the quarter in the destruction of insect pests and the prevention of injury by them to the plantations; also in the destruction of mildew and other fungi, with excellent results. The trees and shrubs of the parks are exceedingly clean and healthy and demonstrate that it is possible to combat insect pests, such as the Tussoch moth and others, if due precaution is taken.

Nearly 145,000 tender plants were raised in the old propagating houses, the work being

Nearly 145,000 tender plants were raised in the old propagating houses, the work being accomplished by about six men. The total value of these plants is not less than \$16,000. The total value of the plants raised during the season by the Department is \$27,000.

Although the conservatory has been maintained in good condition and the collection slightly increased by propagation and purchase, the collection is still not up to the standard of excellence that it is desired to reach. This can be remedied during the coming season, however, if a sufficient appropriation for the purpose is obtained. A collection of tropical tree ferns was presented to the Department by the Landscape Gardener during the quarter. The average number of visitors to the conservatory was maintained, being in excess of 1,000 per day.

A flower parter was laid out in the grounds immediately north of the conservatory, the work

A flower parterre was laid out in the grounds immediately north of the conservatory, the work being somewhat restricted by the funds available for the purpose. With proper development this can be made a very attractive feature of the park.

The following plants were received for the conservatory and other displays: 631 orchids, 38 large palms, 675 choice stove and greenhouse plants, 2,125 trees, shrubs, vines and hardy plants, plants were received for the conservatory and other displays: 631 orchids, 38

large palms, 675 choice stove and greenhouse plants, 2,125 trees, shrubs, vines and hardy plants, 4,225 tender corms and 90 specimens of seeds.

Two double propagating-houses, with a surface area of about 5,000 square feet, were completed during the quarter. These houses bring the glass intended for the propagation of plants for summer display into one range, all unsightly features having either been eliminated or hidden from public view. The old range, which has long presented an unsatisfactory appearance, will now be dispensed with, and the ground occupied graded and the neighborhood made attractive.

About 350,000 feet of sod was supplied and laid under contract, leaving the Park lawns in good condition. In the Central Park the ground adjacent to the southern shore of the Harlem Mere was renovated and sodded and the intrenchments of the old fort restored. A large area adjacent to the Pool, near Central Park, West, was renovated and resodded. This location has been frequented by undesirable visitors, but a watchman has been stationed there and it is now clean and orderly.

clean and orderly.

The sod on Seventy-second street, from Central Park to Riverside, which was destroyed during the winter, was restored, and considerable of this work was also done in connection with the regrading of the steep embankments of Mount Morris Park.

Two-rail pipe fences were erected in Mount Morris Park, and also in the Central Park, where necessary, to protect the edges of the lawns from destruction. These fences present a very neat

appearance and are of great service in preserving the lawns and shrubberies. Frequently they will more than repay the cost of construction in a single season through preserving park property from damage and obviating the necessity for repairs and restoration.

A large quantity of mould was used in the grading of the slopes of Mount Morris Park and in the upper end of Central Park. This material was supplied and placed at a low cost to the Department. The work of removing a quantity of rock immediately west of the conservatory was also accomplished at a low cost.

A new fountain, designed in the Department, was erected in the Harlem Mere, greatly enhancing the beauty of the locality. This fountain throws a mass of water to a height of twelve feet, and on sunny days the sun shining through the water shows all the colors of the rainbow, producing a very beautiful effect.

In addition to the above the following work was undertaken:

Mould to the extent of 4,500 cubic yards was used in grading Riverside Park north of Ninety-sixth street, and considerable sodding also done in the same section. Two and three rail pipe fences were put up to protect the new lawns, etc., and a number of large, dead trees removed between Ninety-sixth and One Hundred and Twentieth streets. A retaining-wall was constructed at One Hundred and Seventh street and Riverside Park and in the section south of Ninety-sixth street considerable ground was graded and a quantity of refuse removed from the Property Road. Planting from Eighty-sixth street to One Hundred and Eighth street was carried on extensively, as well as grading, seeding, etc.

In addition to the regular routine work incident to the season about 2,000 loads of refuse was carted to the dumps. The bridle roads were regularly harrowed and kept in good condition. The cottages were kept open for the use of the public from 7 a. M. until 7 p. M., and in some cases until 10 p. M. The work of repairing the drives with shale and sandstone was commenced. The concert season of 1900 opened during the quarter with a concert in Hamilton Fish Park on June 1. The lawns also were opened for games and picnic parties during the quarter. The mechanical force was engaged upon extensive repairs to the Swellsh School-house, at the Casino, Central Park; at the Menageric, the Skate Building, the Men's Cottage, near the Casino; at the Stables, the Greenhouses, Arsenal Restaurant, McGown's Pass Tavern, Terrace Restaurant, the Dairy, several of the other park cottages, the rustic arbors, rustic fences, etc. Necessary repairs were also made at the Aquarium and at the Mount Morris and Washington Square music stands. During the quarter 1,333 settees were made up and repaired, as well as 85 new signs and 2,311 stakes for the Engineer Corps. Twelve new pieces of rolling stock were made, consisting of carts, water tracks, etc., and 28 old vehicles were repaired. The painters painted 1,232 settees, park railings, gates, animal cages, fountains, urinals and repairs to the woodwork of the various park buildings; also lettered and varnished the rolling stock, painted signs, attended to the necessary glazing, etc. The masons have been employed upon the drains, sewers, etc., and the fromworkers upon the railings, boiler, machinery, etc.

Work of Engineering Corps.

The work of constructing and improving Hamilton Fish Park was prosecuted to completion during the quarter and the park opened for public use on June 1, 1900. The work included 5,250 square feet of asphalt walk pavement laid, 830 linear feet of bluestone edging furnished and set, 390 linear feet of bluestone edging set, 2 exedras and four drinking-fountains constructed, 1 electric light tower built, 1,400 square feet of sod furnished and laid, one-half acre of ground seeded, and, on modification of contract, 13,410 square feet additional asphalt walks laid.

The work of removing the Forty second Street Reservoir was continued. It consisted of tearing down walls, excavations in basins of reservoir for cellars and trenches for foundations for the New York Public Library Building and the laying of concrete footings and building of walls of rubble masonry. About 11 per cent., or 13,750 cubic yards, of the old reservoir walls were removed, 14,000 cubic yards of earth and rock excavated and 400 cubic yards of concrete footings laid.

In connection with the construction of the sewer from the Swedish School-house, Central Park, 550 linear feet of 10-inch pipe sewer was laid, including excavation, refilling and building

manholes.

In improving the entrance to Central Park, Fifth avenue, Fifty-eighth to Sixtieth streets, 30 cubic yards of excavating of all kinds was done, 379 cubic yards of mould delivered in place, 23 cubic yards of rubble stone masomy laid, 135 linear feet of bluestone coping set, 73 linear feet of 8-inch bluestone straight curbing set, 373 linear feet of 8-inch curved bluestone curb set, 870 linear feet of 2%-inch straight and curved bluestone edging set, 270 linear feet of old bluestone curb redressed and reset, 60 linear feet bluestone sills, 16 bluestone base-blocks for electric lamp-posts furnished and set, 1 walk-basin, 57 linear feet of 6-inch vitrified pipe laid, 11,684 square feet of walk pavement of asphalt laid, 772 square feet of gutters of rock-asphalt pavement laid, 12,138 square feet of sod laid and 16 electric lamp-posts furnished and erected.

The work of laying water-mams in Central Park was completed during the quarter, involving 6,300 cubic yards of earth excavation, 477 yards of rock excavation, 6,691 yards of filling, 250 tons of straight, cast-iron pipe, 4-inch, 6-inch, 8-inch and to-inch; 19 tons special cast-iron pipe, 3,162 linear feet of 4-inch, 3,866 linear feet of 6-inch, 1,753 linear feet 8-inch, 2,768 linear feet ro-inch cast-iron pipe, straight and special laid; 3,007 linear feet 2½-inch wrought-iron pipe furnished and laid, five to-inch stop-cocks and brick basins complete, four 8-inch same, nine 6-inch same, thirteen 4-inch same, sixty-two 2½-inch stop-cocks and boxes complete, fo hydrants taken up, repaired and reset; 9 blow-offs with brick basin, cocks, etc.; 6 air-cocks furnished and set and 20,790 square feet sod lurnished and laid.

In addition to the above, the Corps was employed upon surveys, specifications, forms of contracts, etc., for new bridge at Eighty-seventh street, East River Park; laying gutters of rock asphalt, etc., East drive, Central Park; repairing walks with asphalt around Arsenal and Menagerie buildings, Central Park; proposed improvement, Thomas Jefferson Park; repairs to drainage, East drive, Central Park; road, High Bridge Park; park at west approach of Washington Bridge, new walks, etc., Manhattan square; extension to Riverside Park, Eighty-first and Eighty-fifth streets; also measurement of pipe-rail tences in the various parks, survey and map of Riverside Park in vicinity of One Hundred and Sixteenth street, survey defining northern boundary of Fort Washington Park, preparing maps in relation to occupation of Battery Park by Elevated railboad structure, maps for proposed widening of Fitty ninth street, Fifth to Eighth avenue; staking out existing water-pipe lines, etc., Riverside Park, Eighty-sixth to One Hundred and Twentieth street; survey of Riverside Park, Seventy-ninth to Ninety-sixth street, for construction map; outline map of Harlem River driveway and adjoining park property, tabulation of all bids received, inspection, measurements, etc.

The Aquarium.

At the Aquarium, Battery Park, the number of visitors, by a tual count, showed an excess of 90,507 over the same period of last year. An inventory showed that there were 1,372 specimens of live fish on exhibition, of 173 varieties, besides crustaceans, mammals, reptiles, marine plants, etc. The first installment of Bermuda fish for this season arrived on June 29, which added to the attractiveness of the collection materially.

DEAR SIR—I herewith submit report of work under the supervision of the Chief Engineer, Department of Parks, for the Borough of The Bronx, for the quarter ending June 30, 1900.

Contract for regulating, grading and constructing Spuyten Duyvil parkway; James Oliver,

construction on this work has progressed in a satisfactory manner during the past quarter, and all indications point to the completion of the work during the present quarter.

Percentage of work to date on this contract is as follows: Earth excavation, 90 per cent.; rock excavation, 90 per cent.; telford roadway, 80 per cent.; stone-block gutters, 75 per cent.; brick culverts, 100 per cent.; 24-inch stoneware pipe, 70 per cent.; 12-inch stoneware pipe, 90 per cent.; road basins, 75 per cent.; dry rubble wall, 95 per cent.; rubble masonry in cement, 100 per cent. The quantities of the original estimate will be considerably exceeded in the final, especially in the items of rock excavation and stoneware pipe.

The original estimates were made several years ago and were evidently not very carefully made, more especially in the matter of rock and earth excavation, which latter was made considerably too great.

The increase of the item of stoneware pipe was absolutely necessary to secure proper drainage. The total increase will, however, be within the limit of increase permitted by the contract. The above-named work is under the direct charge of Assistant Engineer Crane.

STATEMENT OF WORK PERFORMED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS OF THE BOROUGHS OF BROOKLYN AND QUEENS DURING THE THREE MONTHS FROM APRIL 1 TO JUNE 30, IN-CLUSIVE, 1900.

Prospect Park.

The regular work of keeping the park clean and in good condition has been carried on, the entire system of drives and bridle paths has received attention. All the gutters and basins have been cleaned and kept in order; trimming of trees and shrubbery has been continued, and spraying and brushing of same to destroy caterpillars and other insects has been carried on.

All the drives have been regularly sprinkled, as the weather required. The East and West drives have been partially picked up and repaired with road gravel, and this work will be continued until the whole system of drives in the park have been put in good shape.

Large numbers of hardy plants, vines and shrubs have been planted in the park and on the mounds at main entrance, around dead trees, police boxes and stone bridges.

All the lawns, meadows, etc., have been mown and borders trimmed from time to time as required; all the poor places have been sown with grass seed, borders sodded and wire guards erected to keep the visitors from making crosswalks on the lawns; banks around East Dale shelter and around shore at Trout Pond have been repaired, and lake cleaned. Banks in Rocky Pass have been sodded, over 3,000 square feet sod being used. The mounds at the main entrance and sidewalks on Eastern parkway have been mown and borders trimmed.

New asphalt walks (23,308| square feet) were laid south of Rose Garden and at new Miniature Yacht House at the peninsular; also 69,942 square feet of old walks were resurfaced and repaired by contract.

New and varied designs have been planned and executed at the Flower Garden and in front of the Irving statue; the old perennial garden on Breeze Hiil has been carefully attended to, and is now in full bloom.

The Rose Garden and Water Lily Ponds have been replanted and received careful attention and the display was one of the finest we have had for years.

"Vandal Bridge" over Rocky Pass has been reconstructed in rough stone in the most thorough and substantial manner, so as to be a permanent feature of the park.

Concerts.

Concerts were started as usual June 2, and will be continued every Saturday and Sunday after noon until further notice. Electric Fountain.

Owing to the lack of water the Department of Water Supply could not permit the usua displays.

Picnics. Large numbers of picnics have been held at the picnic grounds, and the croquet and lawn tennis grounds (which have received special attention) are being used by an ever-increasing number of people.

Prospect Park Court. The circle has been regularly taken care of, grass seed sown, weeds dug up, grass cut and watered and young trees trimmed and taken care of.

changed for its new use.

Mechanical Works. The men at the shops have been kept busy repairing tools, implements, wagons, carts, trucks, etc.; making settees, picnic tables, stakes, saw horses, etc.; repairing and putting fountains, shelters and plumbing in order; building seats and stands for the Anniversay and Decoration Day parades at the different locations; work is being continued on the Miniature Yacht house at the peninsular, and the new stone bridge at Sullivan heights has been finished and a cement walk laid on it. A large cement trough has been built in the deer paddock for the deer to walk and bathe in. The rooms used by the Brooklyn Public Library in the Litchfield mansion have been changed for its new use.

Parade Grounds.

The parade grounds have been regularly mown and kept in order; special attention was given them preparatory to the polo games, which were started Monday, June 25; the usual number of games of base-ball and cricket are being played daily.

East Side Lands (Institute Garden).

During this quarter 5,860 yards of soil have been received and used in the continuation of work of forming the terrace and mounds.

Tompkins Park.

In addition to the general work of cleaning and keeping the park in order, the lawns have been kept mown and borders trimmed, flower beds weeded and taken care of, trees and shrubs trimmed and sprayed to destroy caterpillars and other insects, and poor places in lawn prepared and sown with grass seed.

Fort Greene Park.

The regular work of cleaning and keeping the park in order has been carried on, in addition to which 400 pounds of grass seed has been sown and 3,000 sod laid, on the borders and poor places in the lawns; lawns and borders kept mown and trimmed and trees sprayed to destroy caterpillars and other insects. Saturday, June 16, the Martyrs' Tomb was opened to inter the remains of prison-ship martyrs which were found in the Brooklyn Navy Yard.

Bensonhurst, Bedford, Highland, Municipal, Carroll, City, Winthrop, Bushwick, Long Island City, Flushing, Kings, Cooper, Zindel, Stuyvesant, Underhill, Woodbine, Cooper Gore, Lincoln Terrace, Cuyler, City Hall and Saratoga and Irving Square

Have all been properly maintained, walks, gutters, shelters, fountains, etc., kept clean and in order, lawns mown, and trees, shrubs, hedges and borders trimmed, grass seed sown where necessary, new flower beds planted and cared for, and trees sprayed and brushed to destroy caterpillars and other insects.

Red Hook Park.

The work of construction in this park is being carried on, trees and shrubs have been planted, mounds and lawns sown down with grass seed, and sewer and water-main connected with the park

Only the usual work of guarding the park from fires and depredations of visitors has been carried on, no men or money being available for any new work.

Sunset Park.

The continuation of the rustic stonework at was recommenced the early part of this park June (the men being busy at Prospect Park until then), and is being carried forward as rapidly as the small force of men will allow.

Dyker and Canarsie Beach and New Lots Playground

Have all been kept clean and in good condition.

Fort Hamilton Park.

Nothing has been done as yet toward the construction of this Park.

Roads and Boulevards.

All the roads and boulevards have been properly maintained and sprinkled as weather

New Work. Part of the westerly cycle path of the Ocean parkway was rebuilt, beginning at Fort Hamilton avenue, running south to Avenue C, a distance of 3,500 linear feet by 18 feet in width. The improvement consists of a foundation of one and one-half inch limestone, four inches to The improvement consists of a foundation of one and one-nair inch imbestone, four inches to five inches in thickness, bound and topped off with a layer one inch in thickness of limestone screenings; area of improvement, 7,000 square yards. The main roadway of Ocean parkway was resurfaced from the line of the railroad crossing the Park Circle (Coney Island avenue) to Church avenue, a distance of 3,000 feet by 65 feet in width. The improvement comprises the placing of a layer of Marcellus shale four inches thick upon the old surface (previously cleaned and picked up by steam roller), topped off with a one-inch layer of trap-rock screenings and rolled until hardened. The area resurfaced measures 21,660 square yards.

The Speedway (Ocean Parkway).

The Speedway (Ocean Parkway).

The work of constructing the Speedway upon the main road of the Ocean parkway from Bay parkway (Twenty-second avenue) to Kings Highway consists of the following:

Picking up the old surface with rollers to a depth of 2 to 3 inches and rolling with five-ton roller; spreading a layer of clean, sharp sand, 2 inches thick, and raking out stones; upon this surface a layer of selected yellow loam 2½ to 3 inches thick was placed and raked over, stones taken out and leveled; the area of improvement measures 56,000 square yards; this work was all done by park labor within 27 working days.

For the purpose of draining the Speedway 16 large catch-basins, with granite heads and 4 cesspools 12 feet in diameter by 16 feet deep, were built.

A total of 5,380 linear feet of 12-inch, 15-inch and 18-inch drain pipe was laid to carry off the surface water.

Eastern Parkway.

The portion of Eastern parkway between Washington and Bedford avenues was resurfaced with Hudson river road gravel; area of improvement, 7,660 square yards.

The section from Washington avenue west to the portion resurfaced last year was recovered with Marcellus shale in same manner as the work upon Ocean parkway, a distance of 800 linear feet; area, 2,650 square yards; between New York and Utica avenues 5,100 feet in length was coated with a thin layer of Marcellus shale and trap-rock screenings mixed and rolled with steam rollers; area of improvement, 16.830 square yards. steam rollers; area of improvement, 16,830 square yards.
