MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

Meeting held at the office of the Bureau of Buildings for the Borough of Manhattan, 220 Fourth avenue, January 28, 1902.

Meeting called to order at 10 o'clock a. m.

Present—Messrs. F. C. Moore, Cornelius O'Reilly, E. F. Croker, W. J. Wryer, W. A. Conover, and A. F. D'Oench (Presiding Officer) in the chair.

Minutes of meeting of January 21 were read and on motion, duly seconded, approved.

The Chairman—Mr. O'Reilly and the Chairman appeared before the Sinking Fund Commissioners regarding an office for this Board. No office was decided upon at the meeting, but the Mayor and Comptroller were appointed a committee of two to look into the matter.

Mr. Fryer and the Chair went over the matter of forms and furniture, and made out the necessary requisitions therefor.

Application has also been made, as required by the Civil Service rules, for the transfer to this Board of Mrs. Minna M. D. Clark, stenographer, from the Bureau of Buildings for the Borough of Manhattan, to take effect February 1.

On motion, duly seconded, the actions of the sub-committees were approved.

The Chairman—I have notified the Superintendents of Buildings in the various boroughs that the Board is organized and ready to hear such appeals as may be brought before it.

On motion, duly seconded, it was resolved that hereafter the Board meet at 9.30 a. m. instead of 10 a. m.

On motion, duly seconded, it was resolved that it be noted on the record that pending the preparation of blanks, appeals have been heard, as to-day's minutes will show, filed on the blanks heretofore in use.

On motion, duly seconded, it was resolved that the Chairman be authorized to sign and transmit the decisions of the Board on all appeals, and other matters necessary for the transaction of the business of the Board, over his signature as Chairman.

Alteration 2780, of 1901, appeal No. 1, of 1902—Nos. 62 and 64 Greene street, Manhattan, Robert T. Lyon, architect and appellant: "To construct and erect elevator shaft in accordance with the formula of the Norman Construction Company."

Mr. Norman appeared and explained the appeal to the Board. Motion being lost, the appeal was denied.

Mr. Moore was then excused.

New building 1684, of 1901, appeal No. 2, of 1902, South side of Twenty-seventh street, 225 feet east of Eleventh avenue, C. H. Caldwell, architect and appellant—"To omit an interior staircase in a six-story non-fireproof factory building and substitute for the same an outside iron stairway." On motion, laid over to the next meeting.

New building 1553, of 1901, appeals No. 3 and No. 4, of 1902, No. 43 West Forty-fourth street and Nos. 44 to 50 West Forty-fifth street, Seaboard Realty Co., per Ludlow & Valentine, architects and appellants. Mr. Ludlow of the firm appeared before the Board in explanation of the two appeals.

Appeal No. 3—"To build a roof house according to plans filed." Appeal No. 3, relating to the pent house, was granted on condition that all walls surrounding the pent house be carried up to their proper heights; that the floor be made of cement or other fireproof materials, that the window frames, sashes and doors, trims and bases of the pent house be constructed of iron, or wood covered with metal, and that wire glass be used wherever glass is necessary; also that proper skylights be provided; and that the highest point of the roof does not exceed 150 feet from the curb level.

Appeal No. 4—"To omit stairway called for in amendment No. 4, December 31, 1901." Appeal No. 4, relating to omission of staircase, was granted on condition that the proposed substituted staircase on the outside of the building, as shown on drawings submitted, be constructed of iron, the framing filled in with hard burned clay blocks, plastered on the inside and covered on the outside with metal.

New building 1713, of 1901, appeal No. 5, of 1902—Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth streets, 100 feet west of Eleventh avenue, C. F. Rose, architect and appellant: "To build a partial fireproof building for factory and storage, the greatest area of the building being but one story and having brick arches and cement floors; the four-story portion to be built of mill construction with beams four feet apart and three-inch floors. I ask that additional stairs and fire escapes be omitted."

Appeal No. 5 was granted as to construction specified and the omission of one staircase; also as to area to be covered. Appeal as to fire escapes was denied.

On motion, the Board then adjourned.

From the Mayor, and from the Comptroller, dated January 16, directing the Board to transmit, on or before March 1, 1902, an estimate of expenditures, and to make a classification of employees as therein directed.

On motion, a communication was sent to the Corporation Counsel, informing him that the Board had assessed upon the Union Railway Company the sum of \$16,308.66, in the matter of paving Third avenue from One Hundred and Seventy-seventh street to One Hundred and Eighty-ninth street, Borough of The Bronx.

A communication was ordered sent to J. Edward Swanstrom, President, Borough of Brooklyn, requesting him to have new maps made in the matter of assessment for paving Second avenue from Thirty-ninth to Fifty-eighth street.

On motion, the hours during which the office of the Board of Assessors shall remain open for the transaction of business were fixed as follows: From 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., except on Saturday; on Saturday, from 9 a. m. to 12 noon.

On motion, the assessment for paving Third avenue from One Hundred and Seventy-seventh to One Hundred and Eighty-ninth street, Borough of The Bronx, was confirmed and ordered transmitted to the Board of Revision for confirmation, the Union Railway Company having been assessed in accordance with an opinion of the Corporation Counsel, dated December 27, 1901.

In the matter of the assessment for regulating and grading Prospect avenue from Westchester avenue to Crotona Park, South, Borough of The Bronx, the same having been reduced \$3,000, as directed by the Board of Revision, objections were renewed by T. S. Bassford and E. S. Kaufman, attorneys, and Anna Borgstede, owner.
