REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDING MARCH 31, 1907.

Hon. GEORGE B. McCLELLAN, Mayor of The City of New York:

Sir—Herewith is transmitted report of the designs for improvement, work accomplished, and finances of the Department of Parks, Borough of The Bronx, for the three months ending March 31, 1907.

Owing to the unusually severe weather during the past three months, outside work on the contracts has been progressing very slowly; hence the following report must necessarily show but little advancement in the contract work, as reported in the fourth question of the year 1006. We were obliged however to complete some of fourth quarter of the year 1906. We were obliged, however, to complete some of the outside Park improvements which had been begun during the warm days of December, and which could not be left unfinished, as particularized under the head of Van Cortlandt Park. It was necessary, for these improvements, to keep a force of Park employees on outside work, in spite of the inclement weather.

Bronx Park.

Roads, Paths, etc.—The roads and paths throughout the park were kept clear of snow, the basins and gutters cleaned and the lake was cleared of snow, allowing for thirty-six days of skating, the average daily attendance being about two thousand.

In the workshop, road sprinklers, wagons, trucks, etc., were repaired; signs were made, painted and lettered; steam road and lawn mowers were overhauled, repaired and put in proper shape, and all necessary emergency work was attended to.

Botanical Garden, Bronx Park.

Green Houses, Boiler House and Steam Trench—Specifications have been prepared, and the contract advertised, for the erection of green houses, a boiler house and steam trench, in the Botanical Garden, and the work will be begun as soon as the

Baird Court Improvement (John V. Schaefer, Jr., & Co., Contractors)—
The work on this contract has been progressing rather slowly, owing to the severity of the weather, but operations have again been begun on it, and the work will be pushed rapidly through to completion.

Deer House (Guidone & Galardi, Contractors)—This contract has been completed, and final payment will be rendered in a few days.

Boat House (Guidone & Galardi, Contractors)—This building has been completed, and final payment for same was rendered on March 18.

Concourse and Approaches (John V. Schaefer, Jr., & Co., Contractors)—The work on this contract has been progressing rather slowly, owing to the severity of the weather, but operations have been again begun on it, and the work will be finished shortly.

Public Comfort Station—This contract, which was begun by Thomas I. Rushley.

Public Comfort Station—This contract, which was begun by Thomas J. Buckley, and stopped on account of irregularity in opening the bids, has been re-let to Wl Whisten's Son, and the work has been opened again. The walls are almost up to the roof, and the work will be completed shortly.

Elephant House—Plans and specifications have been prepared for the erection of an elephant house in the Zoological Park. The contract has been advertised, and the bids opened but not awarded as yet.

the bids opened, but not awarded as yet. Widening Boston Road—The work of widening Boston road has been prosecuted from time to time, with the small force of laborers available, when the weather would permit. Stone for this work has been ordered, and it should be completed within about two months.

Mosholu Parkway.

Completion of Improvement (John B. Malatesta, Contractor)—The raking and seeding are now being done on this parkway, and the entire contract will probably be completed by the middle of April.

Van Cortlandt Park.

Comfort Station (Thomas Buckley Construction Company, Contractors)—Work on this contract was held up during the winter months, owing to the inclemency of the weather, but operations have been resumed, and the work will be pushed through as rapidly as possible.

Widening Road—The completion of widening the road along the golf links in this park was begun in the latter part of March, and is progressing now, with a small force of laborers. Additional funds have been applied for, for the completion of the work

Rockwood Drive—During the warm days in early December, work was begun by park labor, on the excavation of trenches for gutters on the sides of this drive, with the idea of completing them at once. But the severe weather stopped operations. It was necessary, however, in order to prevent the water from destroying the sides of

the roads, to put on a force of Rammers and Pavers, to line the gutters with stone, and put them in such condition that they would protect the sides of the road from

being washed away.

General Maintenance—The roads and paths in this park were cleaned of snow; gutters and basins were kept clean; the golf house kept cleaned and heated, and the interior was repaired and varnished, shower baths and plumbing being overhauled and

The lake was cleaned of snow, and the ice planed, allowing for thirty days of skating, the average daily attendance being about five thousand.

Eighteen hundred yards of fill was hauled and placed in a hollow in the railroad cut on Mosholu parkway, in this park.

Bronx and Pelham Parkway.

Basins and drains were kept open on this parkway, washouts repaired, and the parkway kept cleaned of snow.

Pelham Bay Park,

Athletes' Lodge (Peter Kieran, Contractor)—This contract has been completed, and final payment will be rendered in the early part of April.

Eastchester Road—Stone was removed from fields and laid on the west side of this road, south of Pelham Bridge, widening the road 20 feet, for a length of about 400 feet

Pelham Road—About one thousand yards of stone were removed from fields, hauled and dropped into the swamp land on the east side of this road, north of the entrance to Hunter Island, widening the road at this point about 40 feet.

General Maintenance—The roads and paths were cleared of snow in this park, basins and drains were kept open, and bath houses and comfort stations were repaired and cleaned.

St. Mary's Park.

Asphalting Existing Walks (Asphalt Construction Company, Contractors)—This work was suspended during the winter, but has been begun again, and the contract should be completed by the end of April.

Old Passage Road—Owing to the severity of the weather, we have been able to put in only a few days' work on this all winter. But the work has been started again, and should be completed in about two months, if the weather permits.


