

Spring and Flood Safety





Spring is coming up and so is flood season! Floods are the most common natural disaster in the United States. Floods occur when water overflows onto land due to large amounts of rain or snow, coastal storms, or water system failures. Overflowing water can cause outages, disrupt transportation, damage buildings, and create landslides with little to no warning. Because of this, it is essential to be aware of how to remain safe during flood season.

There are many ways people can start preparing themselves and their homes for when spring arrives. First, know your risks. FEMA's Flood Map Service Center is a continually updated public source for flood hazard information produced in support of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (Flood Insurance | FEMA.gov) that can provide you with a better understanding of your flood risk. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) (Emergency Alert System | FEMA.gov) and National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio (NOAA Weather Radio - Office of Dissemination - Virtual Lab) also provide flood alerts. As noted in the **NYC CERT Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)**, probationary members must participate in four activities per year to be considered active and receive renewed credentials. planned events. In addition to this, CERT members must also attend monthly division meetings, participate in preparedness activities and receive the approval of their volunteer leadership to receive a new credential. While the SOPs says

All Volunteer leadership should be encouraging active members to serve in a mentor role in order to support both their growth as leaders and provide new opportunities for newer members to become more engaged.






