SUNDAY: COMMISSIONER TISCH, BOROUGH PRESIDENT RICHARDS CELEBRATE RETURN OF CURBSIDE COMPOSTING TO ALL OF QUEENS

Universal service in the World's Borough – which starts Monday – first step in long-awaited citywide rollout

WHAT: New York City Department of Sanitation Commissioner Jessica Tisch, Queens Borough President Donovan Richards, and community leaders will gather the day before curbside composting returns to ALL of Queens to remind residents of the World's Borough about this simple, easy to use, universal program. Last fall, <u>Queens residents diverted 12.7 MILLION POUNDS</u> of leaf and yard waste and food scraps from landfills, and the model used in Queens – universal collection on your recycling day with no sign-up required – is now in the process of scaling up citywide.

Commissioner Tisch and Borough President Richards will also share information about upcoming compost give-back events, at which New Yorkers can receive the high-quality compost made from collected material.
