## DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At meetings of the Board of Docks, held 11th inst. (present, all the Commissioners), the following action was had:

#### Organization, Appointments, etc.

August 11.—The rate of wages to be paid stone cutters in the employ of the Department, from and after 21st inst., fixed at 17½ cents per foot of beds and joints, instead of 25 cents, as heretofore.

#### Rules and Orders.

August 11.—Engineer-in-Chief directed to issue strict orders to subordinate officers, and Superintendents of Docks informed that a list of all material of no value for the uses of the Department, and to be disposed of, must be reported to the Board, and when practical all such material must be sent to the Gansevoort street or Seventeenth street yard.

#### Applications for Leases.

August 11.—From Joseph T. Comross to have fence erected on pier adjoining south side of South Ferry and leased to him. Denied.

#### Applications for Permits.

August 11.—From Department of Public Works, to deposit rock filling on water-front on East river, between Sixtieth and Sixty-first streets. Granted, under supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, said filling not to extend more than sixty feet from the easterly line of Avenue A, and not nearer than forty feet from the southerly side of the pier foot of Sixtieth street.

August 11.—From Rev. Alvah Wiswall, for berth at lower end of south side of pier foot of Twenty-third street, East river, three times each week, until 18th September, for barge "River Belle." Granted.

#### Repairs Ordered.

August 11.—Engineer-in-Chief directed to replace pile broken on end of Pier 57, East river.

August 11.—Engineer-in-Chief directed to construct an opening (about ten feet wide), with doors, in shed on new Pier 43, North river, to enable steamers of the Transatlantic Co. to discharge cargo thereat.

August 11.—Engineer-in-Chief directed to remove such portions of the inner end of Pier 50, North river, as may be necessary to allow dredging and pile driving for the foundation of bulkhead-wall to be constructed thereat, and also to prepare plans and specifications for the rebuilding and extending of said pier so that it shall be seventy-five feet wide, and shall extend to the exterior pier line, the pier to be widened seven and a half feet on each side.

August 11.—Engineer-in-Chief directed to examine and report what is necessary to be done, and the cost of erecting a dumping board on pier at One Hundred and Tenth street, East river.

#### Contracts.

August 11.—Contract for making repairs to pier foot of Thirty-seventh street, East river, awarded to James Howard, under proposals publicly opened 10th inst. Sureties—J. N. Waterbury and Mark Horgan.

#### Miscellaneous.

August 11.—Action of the President, in purchasing from Francis Spies & Co. 700 barrels of English Portland cement at \$3.78 per barrel, approved.

August 11.—William E. Rhinelander, executor of the estate of William C. Rhinelander, requested to advise this Department the lowest terms upon which he will sell to the city Piers 27 and 28, the upper half of Pier 33, and the lower half of Pier 34, North river, the contemplated improvements of the Department requiring that the city shall obtain possession of said property.

August 11.—Police Department informed that the only portions of the water front that can be designated and set apart for the deposit of ashes during the coming winter are such portions on the North river where filling is required in the rear of the bulkhead wall being constructed by this Department.

August 11.—Owners and charterers of steamboat "Plymouth Rock" informed of the rules of this Department in reference to dumping ashes into the slips, and requested to comply with the same.

August 11.—Counsel to the Corporation advised of the facts relating to the lease granted to the North Shore Staten Island Ferry Company of premises foot of Whitehall street, East river, and action of the Board in reference thereto, and requested to render his opinion—

First—As to whether, under existing statutes, the Board of Docks is empowered to make a lease of the premises in question, or of any premises not built under the new plans, without offering the same at public auction; and

Second—If the Department is not so empowered, what is its duty in the premises under existing circumstances.

August 11.—Eighteen communications and two reports were received and read and one communication was taken from the table, of which eight were placed on file, no further action thereon being required; seven were referred to the Executive Committee, five to the Auditing Committee, and one was laid on the table for consideration and report.

Resolved, That section 121 of the Sanitary Code be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 121. That no person shall keep, retain, or allow or employ to be kept or retained, at any place within or adjacent to the built-up portions of the City of New York, any horse, ass, or colt, having the disease known as glanders or farcy, but shall at once report the fact to the Board of Health of said city, and under the direction of the Sanitary Superintendent shall remove such animal in the manner designated by such Sanitary Superintendent. No animal having glanders or farcy, or any contagious disease, or that shall die thereof, shall be removed, disposed of, or exposed in any street or public place in said city, without a written permit from said Board of Health, and then only in accordance with the terms of such permit.

Resolved, That the following be and is hereby adopted as an additional ordinance of the Sanitary Code, viz:

Sec. 185. That every veterinary surgeon who is called to examine or professionally attend any animal within the City of New York, having the glanders or farcy, or any contagious disease, shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, report in writing to the Board of Health of such city the following facts, viz: 1st, a statement of the location of such diseased animal; 2d, the name and address of the owner thereof; 3d, the type and character of the disease.
