BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

Resolution Authorizing Heads of Departments to Grant Leaves of Absence to Certain Classes of Employees.

Whereas, The New York State Firemen's Association and the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association hold their annual conventions during the months of August and June, respectively; and

Whereas, Many of the employees of the City of New York and the Counties within said City are members of these associations; and

Whereas, Many of these employees perform services as volunteer firemen for the City of New York and the Boroughs now embraced in said City and many of them at the present time are performing active service as such volunteer firemen; therefore be it

Resolved, That the heads of all departments in the City of New York and the Counties therein be and they hereby are requested to grant leaves of absence to the employees of their respective departments with pay for the three days commencing on the 11th day of June, 1918, to enable them to attend the convention of the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held at Brooklyn, New York, and be it further

Resolved, That similar leaves of absence be granted such employees to enable them to attend the convention of the New York State Firemen's Association at Lockport, New York, on the five days commencing on August 19th, 1918.

Provided, however, that said employees attend said conventions either as members or delegates and produce suitable certificates from the secretaries of said associations testifying to such attendance, and be it further

Resolution Adopted.

Whereas, the Division of Factory Inspection has submitted to this Commission appeals from orders issued by the said Division of Inspection, which appeals have been made by the parties stated, against the premises given, and the granting of which would necessitate a variation of law; and

Whereas, the said Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made in each case, and upon the reports submitted gives the conditions existing and recommends as follows:

1. Premises affected, Batavia, Harvester ave.; appellant, Massey-Harris Harvester Co. 1—Prohibit occupancy. 2—Additional exit. 3—Storey nonfireproof building used for office and factory purposes; divided lofts; sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 53; above 1st floor, 23; above 2d floor, 3; exits, one unenclosed interior stairway from 1st to 3d floors, and an imperfect horizontal exit on 3d floor in form of a concrete bridge with nonfireproof windows, leading to main building; exits remote; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept bridge as second means of exit from 3d floor on condition that windows in bridge nearest office building be provided with wired glass and draughting room on 3d floor be removed to main building.

2. Premises affected, Batavia, Harvester ave., Main Building; appellant, Massey-Harris Harvester Co. 4—Maintain red lights. 5—Arrange exit door to open outwardly on Harvester ave. entrance. 6—Arrange doors to swing outwardly on stairs. 4-storey fireproof building; farm implements manufactured; sprinkler installed with two sources of water supply; greater portion of 3d and 4th floors used for storage and as stock rooms; no combustibles; four fireproof stairs with broad passageway leading thereto; doors and openings to same are sliding doors, gravity, fusible links, counterweighted and continuously open; to swing outwardly would block the stairs in many places; door to street entrance should open outwardly.

Recommendation: No. 4 to be complied with; No. 5 to be complied with; No. 6 to be waived on condition that sliding doors be left open at all times when any one is at work in the building.

3. Premises affected, Buffalo, 300 Emile st.; appellant, East Buffalo Brewing Co. 2—Additional exit. 4-storey nonfireproof building; divided lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; no combustibles; occupancy, 12, 4 of whom are factory employees; above 1st floor, 2; above 2d floor, 0. Exits, one stairway 1st to 4th floors; imperfect horizontal exit on all floors; two stairways from 2d floor; ladder leading from 3d floor to roof of one-storey building; exits remote.

Recommendation: Accept as compliance, while

conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, an iron ladder from 3d and 4th floors to roof of one-storey building, from which there is safe exit to ground.

4. Premises affected, Binghamton, 183-185 Water st.; appellant, Link Piano Co. Enclose stairway with fire resisting partitions. 6-storey nonfireproof building; open lofts; sprinkler installed; occupancy, 35; above 1st floor, 28; above 2d floor, 23; 2d floor, 5; 3d floor, 9; 4th floor, 3; 5th floor, 8; 6th floor, 3 men for three days each week; exits, one interior stairway from 1st to 6th floors, enclosed with wood partitions to 5th floor; an exterior screened stairway, 36 inches wide, erected in 1916 on recommendation of former Chief Factory Inspector, said stairway having fireproof doors on the course, but same do not extend to floor level; sprinkler system has two sources of water supply; exits remote; no egress from roof; 6th floor used as storage room and 3 men work three days per week casing tobacco.

Recommendation: In view of the small occupancy, waive the order for stairway enclosure. Accept unconditionally the exterior stairway with openings above floor level.

5. Premises affected, Batavia, Ellicott st.; appellant, Franklin Mills Co. 3—Prohibit occupancy. 4—Additional exit. 3-storey nonfireproof building; open lofts; Section 83-b sprinkler system; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 7; above 1st floor, 2; above 2d floor, 2 irregularly; exit, unenclosed interior stairway.

Recommendation: While conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, accept an 18-inch stationary iron ladder attached to rear of building and accessible from 3d floor window, extending to roof of boiler house, with safe runway from foot of ladder to edge of boiler house roof, and from said roof ladder on stairway to ground.

6. Premises affected, Buffalo, 56 Indiana st.; appellant, John W. Gibbs. 6—Additional exit. 4-storey nonfireproof building; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; open lofts; occupancy, 15; above 1st floor, 13; above 2d floor, 0; exits, one interior unenclosed stairway.

Recommendation: In view of the fact that tenant is to remove from building, and that 3d and 4th floors are now vacant, accept the present stairway and waive order on condition that the occupancy of the 2d floor does not exceed 13 and that no one be permitted to go to the 3d or 4th floors.

7. Premises affected, Brooklyn, 399 Pine st.; rear; appellant, William Vag Wyck. 1—Screen waterclosets for females. 1—Provide dressing room for females, with window to outer air. Small rear building, 20 by 30 feet, three stories high, where razor cases are manufactured, mostly hand work; 2 men employed on the 1st floor, about 12 females on 2d and 3d floors; no males above 1st floor; water closet screened when door is opened, by position of door; 2d and 3d floor closets screened by oilcloth curtain placed 15 inches from door, which covers full size of opening; no way of providing stationary screen for females' closet, as same would block passage-way to stairs; closet not deep enough to permit inside screen; owner lives in building on front of lot, and in case of emergency females are permitted use of owner's home.

Recommendation: Accept the closets for females without screen, oilcloth curtains to be removed as they interfere with passage to and from closet. While present conditions prevail, waive order for dressing room.

8. Premises affected, Elmira, 744-748 Baldwin st.; appellant, F. M. Hyston, Inc. 4—Additional exit. 2- and 3-storey semi-fireproof building; open lofts; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 18; above 1st floor, 3; above 2d floor, none regularly; sprinkler system installed over machines on 2d and 3d floors; exits, one unenclosed interior stairway in three-storey section, one unenclosed interior stairway in two-storey section (extending from 1st to 2d floors); wooden ladder with iron rungs at east end of three-storey section from 3d floor to roof of engine room; exits remote; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept present exits while occupancy remains unchanged, on condition that ladder be provided from roof of engine room to grade.

9. Premises affected, Elmira, 300 Washington ave.; appellant, Jos. J. Cahill. 1—Provide inside flush watercloset. Vault closet now provided is about 50 or 60 feet from building; same is located close to railroad track and is used by all classes; no screen and no lock on door.

Recommendation: Accept inside chemical closet of approved type or vault close close to building, with covered passageway thereto. Either installation to conform to Rules 140-147 of Industrial Code.

10. Premises affected, Groton, South st.; appellant, Jersev Milk & Cream Co. 13—Two exits as per Section 79-a. 2-storey nonfireproof building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; occupancy, 7; above 1st floor, 1; exits, one interior stairway enclosed with wood, metal covered; doors metal covered; no direct exit to grade; at north end of 2d floor to roof of boiler house; wood stair from west end of boiler house roof to grade; doors to stairway enclosure open out but are not self-closing; plans filed June 5, 1917; building in course of construction at that time; exits remote; no safe egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept present exits provided enclosure of wood, metal covered, be extended from foot of stair on 1st floor so as to provide a door in exterior west wall within said enclosure, said door to lead to outer air; present door at foot of stair to be used in extension of partition on workroom side.

11. Premises affected, Gloversville, 146 Spring st.; rear; appellant, Melvin E. 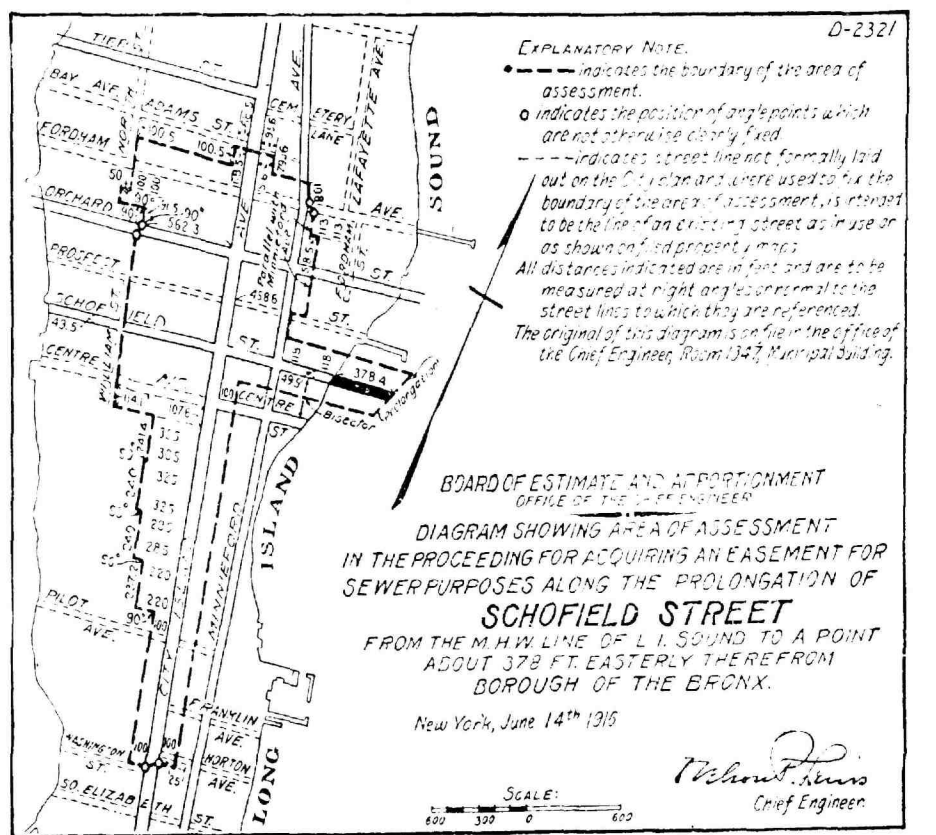

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be, or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
