## BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

### Resolut on Authorizing Heads of Departments to Grant Leaves of Absence to Certain Classes of Employees.

Whereas, The New York State Firemen's Association and the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association hold their annual conventions during the months of August and June, respectively; and

Whereas, Many of the employees of the City of New York and the Counties within said City are members of these associations; and

Whereas, Many of these employees perform services as volunteer firemen for the City of New York and the Boroughs now embraced in said City and many of them at the present time are performing active service as such volunteer firemen; therefore be it

Resolved, That the heads of all departments in the City of New York and the Counties therein be and they hereby are requested to grant leaves of absence to the employees of their respective departments with pay for the three days commencing on the 11th day of June, 1918, to enable them to attend the convention of the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held at Brooklyn, New York, and be it further

Resolved, That similar leaves of absence be granted such employees to enable them to attend the convention of the New York State Firemen's Association at Lockport, New York, on the five days commencing on August 19th, 1918.

Provided, however, that said employees attend said conventions either as members or delegates and produce suitable certificates from the secretaries of said associations testifying to such attendance, and be it further

Resolved, That this Board approves of such leaves of absence accordingly.

Additional exit, 3-story; open lots; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 22; above 1st floor, 6; above, 2d floor, 1; exits, an interior wood enclosed stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; imperfect fire escape on south with nonfireproof openings 42 by 28 inches; exits not remote; no egress from roof; windows on course of fire escape are equipped with wired glass only.

Recommendation: While occupancy above the 1st floor does not exceed 7, accept fire escape as second means of exit.

14. Premises affected, East Northport, Larkfield ave.; appellant, Chas. B. Patridge, 1—Provide two means of exit as per Section 79-a. 2—Arrange 2d floor doors to open outwardly. 3—Arrange street entrance door to open outwardly. 4—Handrail on interior stairway. 5—Two additional waterclosets for females. 6—One water closet for males. 7—Two wash basins with running water for males. 8—One wash basin with running water for females. 9—One wash basin with running water for males, 2-story building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; building measures 56 by 45 feet, and on the south a two-story building of same size adjoins; adjoining building used as garage. In the rear of said building at the west is a one-story building used to store grain and feed; 1st floor used as grocery except small portion in rear used as office and shipping room; 2d floor occupied by Sterling Mfg. Co., employing three males and 36 females. Instrument cases made of duck are being manufactured for the U. S. Army and Navy. When erected, building was used for grocery on 1st floor and meeting room on 2d floor. The stairway measures 4 feet 3 inches, is located at southeast corner and leads to street, enclosed on south side with terra cotta brick and north side with wooden partitions; fire escape on southwest corner, with balcony 3 feet wide by 11 1/2 feet long, railed 32 inches, with hanging ladder to ground; building adjoins another two-story building on south, but the only access to roof is through a scuttle opening in 2d floor ceiling; no running water nor sewer in East Northport.

Recommendation: Present fire escape accepted if steps provided from floor to sill, one window on course to be changed to nonfireproof door 2 by 6 feet; present well used to be covered; opening in rail to be made near one-story wooden structure adjoining on the west; a permanent stairway to be erected from fire escape balcony to ground, leading alongside of one-story structure, and coming near railroad siding; accept stairway enclosure if same be covered on workroom side with fire-resistant partitions; stairway not to be extended to roof and no skylight to be required. Orders 2, 3, 4 to be complied with.
