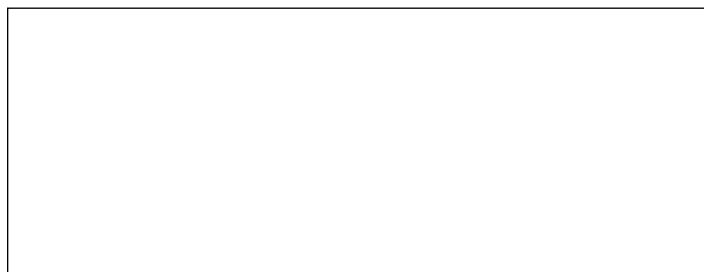

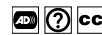

The Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) seeks to procure a program aimed at serving high-risk, justice involved young people with exhibited challenges succeeding in other programs or diversion efforts. Over the last four (4) years the city has undertaken a number of initiatives to safely reduce the jail population. Many of these efforts have been successful at reducing the number of low-risk, low-charge severity individuals held in detention while awaiting the disposition of their case. Today 91% of the jail population is facing felony charges, 49% facing violent felony charges, and 69% are at medium or high risk of failing to appear.

Two major initiatives underway – the implementation of Raise the Age legislation on October 1st, 20182, and the plan to close Rikers Island – can only be successful with a continued reduction in the jail population. Research shows that some of these individuals can be safely supervised in the community with the right kind of programming. The City has a vested interest in strategies that target this subset of detainees that have historically lacked alternatives to detention due to the nature of their charges or frequency of system involvement. MOCJ is looking to build a program to serve youth 16 and older that is comprised of the following foundational elements: Relentless outreach – Once a youth is identified as a fit, outreach goes above and beyond to engage the participant.

The program seeks out the participant, rather than relying on the participant to take the necessary steps to intake into the program independently. Designed for high-need and high-risk – This program will be specifically catered to serve young people that have historically disengaged from programs and have court involvement. Program Failure built in – Understanding that a pillar of long term success for youth involved in this program requires dismantling old habits, there is a need for a model that is flexible enough to continue working with young people that are learning to adapt to structure.

The program ought to ensure that only under exceptional circumstances will youth be terminated from the program. The program will provide education, life skills, and employment components –the program will provide untraditional mental health, education, and skill-building opportunities. The program will include group employment in which young people are paid for their work, held accountable by their peers, learn skills and norms of work environments, and gain experience.

Description:

This Request for Qualifications and Expression of Interest ("RFQEI") is being issued by the New York City School Construction Authority ("SCA") to solicit industry feedback and to evaluate vendor interest and qualifications in connection with certain Scopes of Services.

The SCA is responsible for the project delivery of new and major renovations of public school facilities throughout the five (5) boroughs of New York City. The SCA oversees all capital planning, contracting, design, and construction management of all projects in the five-year Capital Plan. One or more Consultants will be identified, via a formal Request for Proposal process, to perform Services in one or more of the following areas:

- (1) Transitioning the SCA from the MasterFormat Construction Specifications Institute (CSI) 16 Divisions to the current industry 50 Divisions, and training SCA users thereon;
- (2) Conduct a Project Labor Agreement ("PLA") Feasibility study for Design Build efforts related to both Capacity (new school) and Capital Improvement Program ("CIP" renovation/rehabilitation) projects.
- (3) Master Planning Services; and
- (4) Design Build Requirements Consulting (also known as "Criteria Consultant" or "Owner's Rep") Services.

Scopes of Services

- (1) "CSI 50 Implementation": The SCA develops and maintains design standards for public school designs that in-house and consultant architects reference to develop construction documents. The SCA performance specifications, which are based on the Construction Specifications Institute (CSI) 16 divisions MasterFormat breakdown, are used for all SCA project types. A Project Labor Agreement (PLA) is a pre-hire collective bargaining agreement with one or more labor organizations that establishes the terms and conditions of employment and project delivery for specific construction projects. The SCA has a current PLA with the Building & Construction Trades Council of Greater New York (BCTC) covering specified rehabilitation and renovation work. In order to implement a PLA that would govern the SCA's Design Build projects, the SCA must, pursuant to Labor Law Section 222, Section 2.a.2 (New York Labor Law Section 222), determine that the PLA would further the SCA's "interest in obtaining the best work at the lowest possible price, preventing favoritism, fraud and corruption, and other considerations such as the impact of delay, the possibility of cost savings advantages, and any local history of labor unrest". The selected Consultant will be tasked with undertaking, or supporting an SCA-led, "Feasibility Study" specific to a Design Build Project Labor Agreement.
- (3) "Master Planning Services": In response to this RFQEI we are also asking interested firms to demonstrate their ability to perform Master Planning Services with the goal of updating the SCA's Design Standards for its large portfolio of school buildings. Interested firms should respond with prior examples of their master planning experience relating to standards. Associated disciplines/areas of expertise required for this Master Plan service effort shall include, but not be limited to Architectural, Structural, Civil, Geotechnical, Electrical, Lighting, Heating Ventilation and Air-Conditioning, Fire Protection, Plumbing and Drainage, Interior Design, Sustainability, Landscaping, Cost Estimating, Acoustical, Elevator, Signage and Wayfinding, Waste Management, Kitchen, Traffic Engineering, ADA Accessibility, Forensic Architect, Educators, Graphic Design, Security Consultant, Historical Preservation and Energy Modeling Services. It is expected that the components of the study will include Engagement, Data Gathering and Educational & Building Standards. The required services include but are not limited to:
 - a. Submission of reports in InDesign, PDF, PowerPoint and other electronic format for all documents as required by the SCA.
 - b. Detailed review and assessment of all existing NYCSCA Design Standards.
 - c. Engagement In-person and virtual engagement with stakeholders at the SCA, New York City Department of Education, New York City School Construction Authority, Communities (targeted outreach), SCA Design Consultants, and other parties via workshops (visioning) to ensure that collection of comprehensive data to support the update and creation of additional Design Standards. Listening sessions, workshops and surveys shall be included as means of collecting data for this Master Plan.
 - d. In-person and virtual community engagement to identify highest needs, a vision for teaching and learning in the form of educational specification standards and building and architectural design standards.

Notice of Adoption of Rules

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Procurement Policy Board (PPB) by Sections 311 and 314 of the New York City Charter and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of said Charter, the PPB has adopted amendments to Chapter 3 of Title 9 of the Rules of the City of New York.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rules

These Procurement Policy Board (PPB) Rule amendments update the provisions of the PPB Rules relating to "M/WBE Noncompetitive Small Purchases." The amendments set forth in PPB Rule § 3-08 provide greater clarity regarding the M/WBE Small Purchase procurement method. While competition is not required for contracts awarded pursuant to this method, agencies often do utilize various forms of source selection in connection with M/WBE small purchase contracts to

promote competition and in the best interests of the City. Renaming this method by removing the word "noncompetitive" from the title will reduce confusion amongst vendors and potential vendors regarding whether to expect potential competition in connection with contracts awarded through this method.

This rule amendment (1) changes the name of the procurement method in order to reduce confusion amongst potential vendors and current vendors regarding whether to expect potential competition, and (2) changes the text of the rule to be consistent with the name change and other clean up.

Section 1 amends PPB Rule § 3-08(c)(1)(iv) to rename the "M/WBE Noncompetitive Small Purchases" to "M/WBE Small Purchases" to provide greater clarity regarding this procurement method. Additionally, changing "except" to "provided" in the first sentence of § 3-08(c)(1)(iv) clarifies that when making M/WBE small purchases pursuant to such provision agencies are required to attempt to obtain at least three price quotes from M/WBE vendors or document their inability to do regardless of whether a procurement includes competition.

On June 4, 2024, the PPB voted to initiate the rulemaking process under the Citywide Administrative Procedure Act for this proposed rule amendment. A proposed version of this amendment was published in the *City Record* on June 24, 2024. A public hearing was held on July 30, 2024.

The PPB did not receive either written comments or oral testimony at the public hearing. In the absence of comments and in consideration of the PPB's discussions during the June public meeting, the PPB adopted the amendment on August 14, 2024.

The PPB's authority to promulgate these rules is found in sections 311, 314, and 1043 of the New York City Charter.

The new material added in the text of the rule is underlined and the deleted material is in [brackets]. "Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

SECTION 1. SUBPARAGRAPH (iv) of PARAGRAPH (1) OF SUBDIVISION (c) OF SECTION 3-08 OF TITLE 9 OF THE RULES OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

(iv) *M/WBE [Noncompetitive] Small Purchases.* No competition is required for the procurement of goods, services, and construction from M/WBE vendors, [except] provided that in making purchases pursuant to this subparagraph, the Contracting Officer must attempt to obtain at least three price quotes from M/WBE vendors or document their inability to do so. The Contracting Officer must ensure that the [noncompetitive] price [selected] is reasonable and that purchases are distributed appropriately among responsible M/WBE vendors. Agencies shall not use this subparagraph to make any purchase for goods, services or construction, the value of which is less than or equal to the applicable micropurchase limits set in subparagraph (c) (1)(ii) above, or to make any purchase the value of which exceeds the maximum amount authorized pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (i) of section 311 of the Charter. Additionally, agencies shall not make purchases pursuant to this subparagraph for human services.

The green infrastructure practices in this project are all located in parking lots or other open spaces on NYCHA properties. Excavation is required to install subsurface chambers and reconstruct catch basins and outlet control structures that are reconnected to existing sewer pipes. Once installation and reconstruction are complete, the area will be backfilled, resurfaced, and restored to its pre-existing condition; features at or above ground level will be replaced in kind. For each green infrastructure practice, the sewer's capacity is fixed.
