



At a meeting of the Board of Revision and Correction of Assessments, held at the Comptroller's Office, in the New Court-house, on Saturday, April 21, 1877, at 2:40 o'clock P. M.

7. One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street—Paving with granite-blocks, from Second to Seventh avenue.
8. Fifty-ninth street—Paving with Belgian pavement, between First avenue and Avenue A.
9. Sixtieth street—Paving with Belgian pavement, from Tenth to Eleventh avenue.
10. Fifty-eighth street—Paving with Belgian pavement, from Tenth to Eleventh avenue.
11. Bogart street—Paving with Belgian pavement, from West street to Thirteenth or Exterior avenue.
12. One Hundred and Twenty-seventh street—Paving with granite-blocks, from Third to Sixth avenue.
13. Fifty-sixth street—Paving with Belgian pavement, from Second to Third avenue.
14. Lexington avenue and Seventy-eighth street—Laying crosswalks at intersection of.
15. Madison avenue, at each of intersections of Eighty-sixth, Eighty-seventh, Eighty-eighth, and Eighty-ninth streets—Laying crosswalks across.

The foregoing assessment lists being in proper form, and no objections having been filed relating thereto, on motion of the Counsel to the Corporation, they were severally confirmed, all the members of the Board present voting in the affirmative.
