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## BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

[From Proceedings of Board of Aldermen of February 2, 1897.]

MESSAGES FROM HIS HONOR THE MAYOR.

The Vice-President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

CITY OF NEW YORK—OFFICE OF THE MAYOR, February 1, 1897. Hon. JOHN JEROLMAN, President Board of Aldermen:

DEAR SIR—I hand you herewith, in compliance with the requirements of section 164 of the New York City Consolidation Act, a report of an examination of the accounts and vouchers of the Chamberlain's office, for the year ending November 30, 1896, by the Commissioners of Accounts, with their certificate annexed thereto. Very respectfully, W. L. STRONG, Mayor.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 164 of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, as amended by section 1, chapter 78 of the Laws of 1885, the Commissioners of Accounts do hereby certify and report to the Mayor and Common Council that they have examined the accounts and vouchers of the City Chamberlain's office for the year ending November 30, 1896 (with the exception of four vouchers, viz.: "A" 21025 of 1895, "A" 3395 of 1896, lost in the mail, "C" 905 of 1896, "P. R." 6847 of 1895, missing from the office of the Comptroller), and find therefrom as follows, viz.:

The balance in the Treasury to the credit of the City Treasury Accounts at the close of business on the 30th day of November, 1895, was \$3,735,137 18

The amounts paid out of the Treasury to the credit of the City Treasury Accounts during the year ending November 30, 1896, were (as per statement "A" hereto annexed) as follows, viz.:

Special and Trust Accounts 56,272,498 33

Appropriation, General Fund and Taxes Accounts 40,532,476 51

The amounts paid out of the Treasury to the debit of the City Treasury Accounts during the like period were as follows, viz.:

Special and Trust Accounts 39,403,643 00

Appropriation, General Fund and Taxes Accounts 45,253,787 23

The balance that remained in the Treasury to the credit of the City Treasury Accounts at the close of business on the 30th day of November, 1896, as shown in the statement marked "A" hereto annexed, was 15,882,681 79

All of said payments were made by the Chamberlain from the Treasury upon warrants drawn in due form by the Comptroller and signed by the Mayor or his Chief Clerk, in accordance with the requirements of chapter 64, Laws of 1887, as amended by chapter 85, Laws of 1888. Such warrants were so drawn in payment of bills examined, audited and allowed by the Auditor of Accounts, and filed in the Finance Department.

The amount of bonds issued by the City during the year ending November 30, 1896, was \$48,406,984 37

The purposes for which, and the authority under which such bonds were issued, are set forth in the statement hereto annexed marked "B."

The balance of money in the "Sinking Fund of the City of New York for the Redemption of the City Debt" at the close of business on the 30th day of November, 1895, was \$1,875,010 82

The amount of money paid to the Chamberlain during the said year ending November 30, 1896, to the credit of the said Sinking Fund, was 11,490,299 46

The amount of moneys paid from the said Sinking Fund during the said year was 11,243,224 88

The balance of moneys remaining in the said Sinking Fund on the 30th day of November, 1896, was 2,122,085 40

The balance of moneys in the "Sinking Fund of the City of New York for the Payment of Interest on the City Debt" at the close of business on the 30th day of November, 1895, was 719,180 00

The amount of money paid to the Chamberlain during the said year ending November 30, 1896, to the credit of the last mentioned Sinking Fund was 5,308,255 81

The amount of money paid from the last mentioned Sinking Fund during said year was 5,398,300 49

The balance of money remaining in the last mentioned Sinking Fund on the 30th day of November, 1896, was 629,135 32

The balance of money in the "Sinking Fund of the City of New York for the Redemption of the City Debt, No. 2," at the close of business on the 30th day of November, 1895, was 1,577,823 87

The amount of money paid to the Chamberlain during the said year ending November 30, 1896, to the credit of the last mentioned Sinking Fund was 1,815,295 88

The amount of moneys paid out of the last mentioned Sinking Fund during the said year was 2,293,802 65

The balance of moneys remaining in said last mentioned Sinking Fund on the 30th day of November, 1896, was 1,099,317 10

The said payments from the said Sinking Funds were made by the Chamberlain upon warrants drawn by and bearing the signatures of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

**BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT**

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement met at the Mayor's office on Friday, February 5, 1897, at 11 o'clock A. M., pursuant to notice.

The roll was called and all the members were present, and answered to their names:

The minutes of the meeting of January 29, 1897, were read and approved.

The Board then took up the matter of the petition that a part of the cost and expense for the opening of Aqueduct avenue, from Lind avenue to Kingsbridge road, be borne by the City.

Messrs. F. L. Marshall, H. M. MacCracken, William D. Peck and others, spoke in favor of the petition.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Commissioner of Public Works offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That so much of the resolution relating to the opening of Aqueduct avenue, from Lind avenue to Kingsbridge road, adopted by this Board on May 22, 1896, as provides "that the entire cost and expense of said proceedings shall be assessed upon the property to be benefited thereby," be and is hereby amended so as to read, that two-thirds of the entire cost and expense of said proceedings shall be assessed upon the property deemed to be benefited thereby and one-third upon City.

The President of the Board of Aldermen thereupon offered as an amendment that sixty per cent. be assessed upon the property, and forty per cent. upon the City.

This was adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—The Mayor, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Board of Aldermen, and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—4.

Aldermen and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—4.

Negative—The Comptroller—1.

The President of the Department of Public Parks not voting.

The matter of the several petitions asking that a part of the cost and expense for the opening of Exterior street, from East Sixty-fourth to East Eighty-first street, be assessed upon the City, was then taken up.

Messrs. W. H. Harris, Daniel Lord, Jr., E. P. Wheeler, A. A. Alling and T. H. Baldwin spoke in favor of the petitions.

After much discussion, on motion of the Comptroller, the Secretary was directed to request the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment appointed for the opening of Exterior street, from East Sixty-fourth to East Eighty-first street, to send an official communication to this Board, stating the cost of this work and their views regarding it, which may form a basis for the action of this Board on the petitions presented for a reduction of the assessment upon property-owners. At the same time the Chairman of the Board was requested to appoint a committee of the Board, to make a careful personal investigation of all the surroundings and circumstances relating to the matter and report to the Board thereon.

The Chairman thereupon appointed as such committee the Comptroller, the President of the Department of Public Parks and the Commissioner of Public Works.

The following communication from the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, submitting resolutions to open East One Hundred and Ninety-second street and Exterior street, was presented and read:

CITY OF NEW YORK—COMMISSIONER OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS, TWENTY-THIRD AND TWENTY-FOURTH WARDS, No. 2622 THIRD AVENUE, CORNER ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIRST STREET, January 18, 1897. Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

GENTLEMEN—I submit herewith for your consideration resolution for opening each of the following streets:

East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, from Bailey avenue to the bulkhead-line of the Harlem river, in the Twenty-fourth Ward.

Exterior street, from East One Hundred and Ninety-second street to Broadway, in the Twenty-fourth Ward.

Petition and communication from property-owners returned herewith.

Respectfully, LOUIS F. HAFEN, Commissioner.

Petitions in favor of the adoption of the resolution, and a protest against the same, were also presented.

After some discussion, the Commissioner offered the following resolutions:

TO OPEN EAST ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY-SECOND STREET AND EXTERIOR STREET.

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement deems it for the public interest that the title to the lands and premises required for the opening and extending of East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, from Bailey avenue to the bulkhead line of the Harlem river, and Exterior street, from East One Hundred and Ninety-second street to Broadway, in the Twenty-fourth Ward, should be acquired by The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York, at a fixed or specified time.

Resolved, That it appears to this Board, from the surveys made, and information furnished to it by the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, that there are no buildings upon the lands, that shall or may be required for the purpose of opening and extending said East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, from Bailey avenue to the bulkhead line of the Harlem river, and Exterior street, from East One Hundred and Ninety-second street to Broadway.

Resolved, That this Board directs that, upon the date of the filing of the oaths of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, who may be appointed by the Supreme Court in proceedings for the acquisition of title to said street or avenue, the title to any piece or parcel of land lying within the lines of such East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, from Bailey avenue to the bulkhead line of the Harlem river, and Exterior street, from East One Hundred and Ninety-second street to Broadway, so required, shall be vested in the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York.

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement, deeming it for the public interest so to do, hereby requests the Counsel to the Corporation to take the necessary proceedings, in the name of The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York, to acquire title, whenever the same has not been heretofore acquired, for the use of the public, to the lands, tenements and hereditaments that shall or may be required for the purpose of opening and extending East One Hundred and Ninety-second street, from Bailey avenue to the bulkhead line of the Harlem river, and Exterior street, from East One Hundred and Ninety-second street to Broadway.

Resolved, That the entire cost and expense of said proceedings shall be assessed upon the property deemed to be benefited thereby.

Which were adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Department of Public Parks, the President of the Board of Aldermen and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—6.

In connection with the opening of these streets, on motion of the Comptroller, the Secretary was directed to ask the Counsel to the Corporation whether the two cities of New York and Yonkers would have power, without further legislation, to enter into any public agreement to share the expense of building a sewer, which comes down from Yonkers and goes through the Annexed District, and if there is no present power to make such an arrangement, that the Counsel to the Corporation be requested to draw a bill which will give authority to make an arrangement by which Yonkers should bear a portion of the expense of such sewer.

On motion, the Board then adjourned. V. B. LIVINGSTON, Secretary.
