- (a) The City Planning Commission may permit arenas, auditoriums or stadiums, or trade expositions, as listed in Use Group VIII, with a capacity in excess of 2,500 seats for arenas, auditoriums or stadiums, or with a rated capacity in excess of 2,500 persons for trade expositions, provided that the following findings are made:
 - (1) that the principal vehicular access for such #use# is not located on a local #street# but is located on an arterial highway, a major #street# or a secondary #street# within one-quarter mile of an arterial highway or major #street#;
 - (2) that such #use# is so located as to draw a minimum of vehicular traffic to and through local #streets# in nearby residential areas;
 - (3) that such #use# is not located within 200 feet of a #Residence District#;
 - (4) that adequate reservoir space at the vehicular entrance, and sufficient vehicular entrances and exits, are provided to prevent traffic congestion;
 - (5) that vehicular entrances and exits for such #use# are provided separately and are located not less than 100 feet apart; and
 - (6) that due consideration has been given to the proximity of bus and rapid transit facilities to serve such #use#.
- (b) In Community District 7 in the Borough of the Bronx, the Commission may permit an indoor arena with a maximum seating capacity of ~~6,000~~ 17,000 within 200 feet of a #Residence District# and, in conjunction with such arena, permit modifications of ~~the provisions of Sections 32-64 (Surface Area and Illumination Provisions), 32-65 (Height of signs in all other Commercial Districts), and 36-62 (Required Accessory Off-street Loading Berths), to #sign# regulations and parking or loading regulations,~~ provided that:
 - (1) the provisions of paragraphs (a)(1), (a)(2), (a)(4), (a)(5) and (a)(6) of this Section are met;
 - (2) open space surrounding such arena will be located and arranged to provide adequate pedestrian gathering areas to minimize disruption to the surrounding areas;
 - (3) the arena includes noise attenuation features and measures which serve to reduce arena-related noise in the surrounding area, including at nearby #residences#;
 - (4) where ~~Sections 32-64 and 32-65~~ the #sign# regulations are modified, a #signage# plan has been submitted showing the location, size, height and illumination of all #signs# on the #zoning lot#, and the Commission finds that all such #signs#, and any illumination from or directed upon such #signs#, are located and arranged so as to minimize any negative effects from the arena #use# on nearby #residences#; and
 - (5) where ~~Section 36-62 is the parking or loading regulations~~ are modified, a loading plan has been submitted that addresses the operational needs of all servicers of the arena and shows the number, location and arrangement of all loading berths on the #zoning lot#, and the Commission finds that such loading plan is adequate to address the loading demand generated by the arena #use# and has received assurances that the arena operator will implement such plan in accordance with its terms.

The Commission may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding area, including limitations on #signs#, requirements for soundproofing

of arenas or auditoriums, shielding of floodlights, screening of open #uses# or surfacing all access roads or driveways. The Commission may also prescribe requirements for pedestrian-accessible open areas surrounding the arena, auditorium or stadium, including #accessory# directional or building identification #signs# located therein.

On Wednesday, August 13, 2025, a public hearing is being held by the City Planning Commission (CPC), accessible in-person and remotely, in conjunction with the above ULURP hearing to receive comments related to a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) concerning an application by the following co-Applicants: the New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC), 8th Regiment Partners, LLC, and the New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS). The Mayor's Office of Environmental

Coordination (MOEC) is acting as the CEQR Lead Agency for the environmental review. The Applicants are seeking a series of land use actions including a disposition of City-owned land (Block 3247, Lots 2 and 10) pursuant to New York City Charter Section 197-c; zoning map amendment to rezone the project block from C4-4 to M1-4A/R7-2 (MX) to allow manufacturing uses; zoning text amendment to Zoning Resolution (ZR) Section 123-90 to establish the proposed MX district; zoning text amendment to ZR Section 74-182(b) to increase permitted indoor arena capacity from 6,000 to 17,000 persons and remove specific reference to zoning sections for the modifications of signage and parking and loading provisions permitted in conjunction with such arena; special permit pursuant to ZR Section 74-182(b) to allow an indoor arena with a capacity of up to 17,000 persons and permit modification of signage requirements; special permit pursuant to ZR Section 74-195 to allow a public parking garage with a capacity of greater than 150 parking spaces; public financing by the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) to facilitate the proposed permanently affordable housing units on the National Guard Site in the Kingsbridge Heights neighborhood of Bronx Community District 7 (the "Proposed Actions"). The Proposed Actions would facilitate the Proposed Project which includes up to approximately 1,230,300 gsf of new development at the Project Site, including up to 735,800 gsf on the Armory Site and the National Guard Site would be redeveloped with a new 16-story, approximately 494,500-gsf residential building including approximately 500 permanently affordable dwelling units and approximately 14,400 gsf of local retail. The Armory would be adaptively reused and reprogrammed with approximately 735,800 gsf of new uses, including approximately 84,400 gsf of community facility and cultural uses, approximately 87,800 gsf of light manufacturing space, approximately 73,000 gsf of commercial office space, a 17,000-person live event venue, and approximately 65,500 gsf of other entertainment uses. Approximately 248 public parking spaces and new loading docks would be provided in the Armory's cellar level.

The Project Site includes the "Armory Site" at 1 West Kingsbridge Road (Block 3247, Lot 10), and the "National Guard Site" at 10 West 195th Street (Block 3247, Lot 2). The Project Site occupies the portion of Block 3247 that is bounded by West 195th Street, Reservoir Avenue, West Kingsbridge Road, and Jerome Avenue.

The proposed project would also require other coordination and discretionary approvals from City agencies such as the NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC); since the Armory is a designated New York City Landmark, the proposed changes to the exterior of the Armory and the landmark site require a Binding Report from LPC pursuant to the New York City Charter and the New York City Landmarks Law. In addition, the Proposed Project will be receiving State funding which requires review by New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation pursuant to Section 14.09 of New York State Historic Preservation Act. The project may also seek Federal historic preservation tax credits for the proposed adaptive reuse of the Armory, which is a non-discretionary action that would require consultation with the National Park Service and in coordination with the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). The proposed alterations to the Armory would be undertaken in accordance with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. In addition, because Federally appropriated Community Project Funding administered by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is anticipated, consultation with SHPO and Federally recognized Tribal Nations would be undertaken, as warranted, in accordance with Section 106 of National Historic Preservation Act. It is anticipated that the City and State would provide an investment of up to \$200 million to facilitate the proposed adaptive reuse of the Armory; \$50 million of funds from public sources may also become available for the project which are not subject to ULURP. The Build Year is 2032.

Written comments on the DEIS are requested and will be received and considered by the Lead Agency through 11:59 P.M. on Monday, August 25, 2025.





What are we proposing? The Conflicts of Interest Board is proposing to amend its rule concerning the reporting of donations and gifts to the City, including travel-related expenses.

When and where is the hearing? The Conflicts of Interest Board will hold a public hearing on the proposed rule. The public hearing will take place at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 16, 2025. The hearing will be at Spector Hall, 22 Reade Street, New York, New York 10007.

What authorizes the Conflicts of Interest Board to make this rule? Sections 1043 and 2603 of the City Charter authorize the Conflicts of Interest Board to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was included in the Conflicts of Interest Board's regulatory agenda for Fiscal Year 2026.

Where can I find the Conflicts of Interest Board rules? The Conflicts of Interest Board Rules are in title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? The Conflicts of Interest Board must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City

Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

The Conflicts of Interest Board proposes to amend its rules to add a public reporting requirement when City agencies accept payment by a third party for travel-related expenses, such as airfare, ground transportation, hotel accommodations, meals, and conference fees. The Board also proposes conforming edits to implement this new requirement and additional technical edits.

Reporting of Travel-Related Expenses

Board Rules Section 1-01(h) permits, in certain circumstances, the acceptance of travel-related expenses paid by a third party for official City business. The Board proposes to add the requirement that City agencies report any such expenses of \$1,000 or more along with the name and title of the public servant who traveled, the event necessitating travel, and the date(s) and location of the event. Because City agencies must already collect this information to obtain agency-head approval under Section 1-01(h), this new reporting requirement would impose only a minimal administrative burden.

The Board proposes to add this new reporting requirement for several reasons. When the Board last amended Board Rules Section 1-01(h) in 2020, Reinvent Albany testified about the potential for corruption or abuse in permitting the acceptance by public servants of travel-related expenses non-governmental entities. The Board recognizes that the acceptance by public servants of gifts of substantial value warrants increased transparency. In addition, other large cities such as San Francisco and Chicago mandate public disclosure for travel-related expenses paid for by third parties. The information reported may inform future Board rulemaking.

Conforming and Technical Edits

The Board proposes to create a new section, proposed Board Rules Section 1-19, to consolidate the existing reporting requirements for donations to the City (Board Rules Section 1-14(c)(1)) and the new reporting requirement for gifts to the City of travel-related expenses into a single reporting rule. In so doing, the Board aims to make these requirements as consistent and simple as possible.

To that end, the Board proposes to set the reporting threshold in the new Board Rules Section 1-19 for both donations to the City and gifts of travel-related expenses at \$1,000. This change lowers the current reporting threshold of \$5,000 in Board Rules Section 1-14(c)(1) so that it is consistent with the reporting threshold in the Annual Disclosure Law (Administrative Code Section 12-110(d)(1)(h)(2)). The proposed amendments also include legal cross-references to guide public servants.

In consolidating these reporting requirements, the Board also proposes to eliminate the requirement, currently contained in Board Rules Section 1-14(c)(2), that an agency report the names of not-for-profit organizations that were beneficiaries of fundraising by agency employees, a report of limited utility to meet the transparency aims of the rule.

The proposed amendments to Board Rules Section 1-01(h) would clarify the meaning of "travel-related expenses" by adding a list of examples and a reference to Comptroller's Directive No. 6 as defining government-class travel. Finally, the proposed amendments would require that agency-head approval of their employees' travel pursuant to Board Rules Section 1-01(h) must be in writing. This requirement, although identified in the Statement of Basis and Purpose, was inadvertently omitted in 2020 from the Board's adopted rule.

The proposed amendments do not replace or eliminate the current requirement of Administrative Code § 12-110(d)(1)(h)(2) that annual financial disclosure filers report the receipt of travel-related expenses from a third party of \$1,000 or more.

Text of Proposed Rule

Section 1. Paragraphs (1) and (3) of subdivision (h) of section 1-01 of Title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

- (1) For the purposes of Charter § 2604(b)(3) and Charter § 2604(b)(5), a public servant may accept travel-related expenses from a third party as a gift to the City provided that the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the trip is for a City purpose and therefore could properly be paid for with City funds;

- (ii) [the] travel-related expenses, including but not limited to airfare, ground transportation, hotel accommodations, and meals, are consistent with government-class travel as set forth in Comptroller's Directive No. 6 [arrangements are appropriate to that purpose];
- (iii) the trip is no longer than reasonably necessary to accomplish the governmental business which is its City purpose;
- (iv) the public servant received agency head approval in writing and in advance upon presenting such agency head with a detailed itinerary [which] that reflects the trip's City purpose;
- (v) [all solicitation for and reporting of travel-related expenses are made in accordance with Board Rules § 1-14] a public servant soliciting travel-related expenses from a person or firm has no particular matter involving that person or firm pending before the public servant.

Reminder: Annual financial disclosure filers must report any travel-related expenses of \$1,000 or more that they receive from a third party, as required by Administrative Code § 12-110(d)(1)(h)(2).

- (3) A public servant may use [his or her] their own funds and accrued leave for personal travel before or after a trip taken for a City purpose provided that:
 - (i) any increased or additional costs resulting from the personal travel are borne solely by the public servant; and
 - (ii) such personal travel receives agency head approval in writing and in advance.

Section 2. Section 1-14 of Title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§ 1-14 Official Fundraising.

- (a) For purposes of Charter § 2604(b)(2) and Charter § 2604(b)(3), a public servant may use [his or her] their position as a public servant to solicit a donation or gift to the City provided that all of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) The solicitation seeks a donation for one of the following:
 - (i) the City agency or office served by the public servant;
 - (ii) another City agency or office designated by the public servant's agency head, with the [written] approval of the head of the other agency or office;
 - (iii) a not-for-profit organization subject to Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Administrative Code over which the public servant's agency head exercises control as part of [his or her] their City position;
 - (iv) a not-for-profit organization designated by the public servant's agency head pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, provided that the public servant is not associated, within the meaning of Charter Section 2601(5), with the organization or an employee of the organization.
 - (2) The solicitation is directed either to the general public or to [an individual] a person or firm that does not have a particular matter pending before the public servant.
 - (3) The solicitation is accompanied by a disclaimer that a contribution will not affect any business dealings with the City or provide special access to City officials.
- (b) An agency head may designate [in writing] one or more not-for-profit organizations for solicitations made by agency or office employees pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, provided that both of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) the not-for-profit organization has a clear and direct nexus to the City and its residents and with the mission or duties of the City agency or office; and
 - (2) the agency head is not associated, within the meaning of Charter Section 2601(5), with the organization or an employee of the organization.
- (c) [Pursuant to Charter § 2604(b)(2), each agency head must report to the Board annually by February 28:
 - (1) the name of any individual or firm that made one or more donations totaling \$5,000 or more to the agency

during the previous calendar year, the total amount of these donations, and whether the donation was cash or an in-kind donation; and

- (2) the name of any not-for-profit organization designated by the agency head pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section for which agency employees solicited donations during the previous calendar year.
- (d) An agency head may submit to the Board a written request that disclosure, pursuant to subdivision (c)(1) of this section, of one or more of its donors and/or the amount of donation not be made public. The written request must be submitted no later than January 31 for the previous calendar year and must explain why the release of such information to the public may cause harm, threats, harassment, or reprisals to the donor or to individuals or property affiliated with the donor. Whether or not an agency head has submitted a request pursuant to this subdivision, the Board may on its own initiative grant privacy as to any information submitted by an agency head, upon a finding by the Board that the release of such information would pose a risk to the safety or security of any person.
- (e) For purposes of this section, an elected official, including a District Attorney, is the agency head of the staff members in [his or her] their office. The Speaker of the New York City Council is the agency head of the central staff of the Council, and a Council Member is the agency head for the staff of [his or her] their office.

Section 3. Title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new section 1-19, to read as follows:

§ 1-19 Reporting of Gifts to the City.

- (a) For the purposes of Charter § 2604(b)(2), each agency head must report to the Board annually by February 28 the following information for the previous calendar year:
 - (1) the name of any person or firm that made one or more gifts to the agency totaling \$1,000 or more, the total dollar value of any such gifts, and whether any such gifts were cash, in-kind, or payment of travel-related expenses stated in § 1-01(h)(ii).
 - (2) For any reported payment of travel-related expenses pursuant to subdivision (1), the agency head must also report: the name and title of the public servant(s) who traveled; the event(s) necessitating travel; and the date(s) and location(s) of the event(s).
- (b) An agency head may request in writing that the Board withhold from public disclosure the name of a donor and/or the value of their donation. This request must be submitted no later than January 31 for the previous calendar year and must explain why disclosure may result in harm, threats, harassment, or reprisals to the donor or to affiliated persons or property. Whether or not an agency head has submitted such a request, the Board may on its own initiative withhold such information if it finds that disclosure would pose a risk to the safety or security of any person.

Said amounts have been duly appropriated for the Budget Codes in appropriations for capital projects to which the Budget Codes relate.

The Resolutions request that the Comptroller determine the nature and terms of the obligations thereby authorized and that the Comptroller arrange for the issuance of such obligations.

The period of probable usefulness for each Budget Code is set forth in the description of such Budget Code in the financial management system reports of the City and is incorporated in the Resolutions by reference. The estimated maximum cost of each Budget Code is its proportionate share of the estimated maximum cost of the capital project of which such Budget Code is a part. The estimated maximum costs of each such project and the plan for financing the total costs of all of the Budget Codes comprising such project, are contained in the most recent Capital Budget in which the funds for such capital project were appropriated. Such total costs will be financed by the issuance of obligations of the City to the extent such costs are not financed by funds of the New York City Transitional Finance Authority (the "TFA")

or the New York City Municipal Water Finance Authority ("NYW") or as otherwise indicated in such Capital Budget.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 840

Declaration Of Local State Of Emergency

July 31, 2025

WHEREAS, the public safety is imperiled by flash flooding and heavy rain, occurring on Thursday, July 31, 2025 and continuing into Friday, August 1, that is anticipated to flood roads, disrupt mass transit, restrict the operation of emergency vehicles, and impede the delivery of goods and services; and

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service has issued a Flood Watch for New York City and contiguous counties through Friday morning, August 1;

WHEREAS, City Agencies have been preparing for extreme storms and flash flooding and are taking all necessary measures to protect the City and the public; and

WHEREAS, heavy rain and flash flooding risks damage to residential and commercial buildings and public infrastructure throughout the City, which could create unsafe conditions and further imperil public safety; and

WHEREAS, New Yorkers are encouraged to take all possible precautions to prepare for this potentially severe weather event;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Mayor of New York City pursuant to law, including Executive Law § 24, I hereby proclaim a state of local emergency in New York City and order:

1. The Emergency Management, Fire, Police, Sanitation, Environmental Protection, and Transportation Commissioners shall take all appropriate and necessary steps to preserve public safety and to render all required and available assistance to protect the security, well-being and health of the residents of the City.
2. The public is urged to avoid all unnecessary driving effective July 31, 2025, 3 p.m. to Friday, August 1, 8 a.m. and to use public transportation wherever possible. Members of the public who must drive to an emergency shall use extreme caution.
3. This order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until August 1 at 8 a.m. unless extended or sooner revoked.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 841

August 1, 2025

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the *Nunez* use-of-force class action stated that steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2022, the federal court in *Nunez* approved the *Nunez* Action Plan, which “represents a way to move forward with concrete measures now to address the ongoing crisis at Rikers Island”; and

WHEREAS, although there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, extraordinarily high rates of attrition due to staff retirements and other departures continue to seriously affect the Department of Correction’s (DOC’s) staffing levels and create a serious risk to DOC’s ability to carry out the safety and security measures required for the maintenance of sanitary conditions; and access to basic services, including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC’s staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140 of 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 579 of 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 623 of 2024; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended by subsequent orders, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 838, dated July 27, 2025, is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
