A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Tuesday, February 1st, 1916, at 3.30 p. m.

The minutes of the meeting of January 18th were held as read and approved. Dr. O'Hanlon, the General Medical Su-

All the rooms for the house staff in pavilions I and K are now occupied; it is, however, necessary to continue housing 26 in the old building. Nineteen beds the Dock Department, under date of have been provided for nurses on the fifth floor, old building, all of which are the "Westfield," and to request the Presinot yet occupied. By reason of the large number of nurses suffering from various illnesses during the last month, and the difficulty experienced in getting special nurses, the ward service has suffered considerably. Conditions are now improving slightly.

In accordance with instructions from the City Chamberlain, and your authorization, the hospital touring car was turned in to the Municipal Garage on January 1st. Because of the inconvenience of this service, I have called for Mead & White, under date of January the use of a car only five times since that 31st, 1916. On motion, duly seconded date, and only on two occasions have I been able to obtain service, after having given them notice of two or more hours of the need, and on one of these two occasions the car was nearly thirty minutes late on its arrival. The excuse made by the Central Garage each time was that they have an insufficient number of drivers, and there are several orders ahead. The experience of this month demonstrates that the service, so far as we are concerned, is impossible, and I would urge that action be taken to have a car returned to the department, as our service is almost entirely emergency. We have plenty of garage room, and make use of whatever drivers are available for chanffeurs.

The daily average census at the various hospitals during the month of January was as follows: Bellevue, 1341; Gouverneur, 190; Harlem, 229; Fordham, 188;

Neponsit, 86. At Gouverneur Out Patient Department the work is being delayed by reason of the inability to get delivery of steel. Nothing has been done about repairing the boat "Westfield" because of the letter from Dock Commissioner Smith, a copy of which had been mailed to each member of the Board of Trustees. In a letter from Dr. Seymour, she states that Mr. Smith's statement does not in any way change the situation regarding the use of the boat.

The construction work at Harlem is progressing slowly. The Marshall Construction Company is laying the sewers at Neponsit. Complete work has been held up by the Neponsit Realty Company as we cross their property for about ten feet, and they decline permission to lay this pipe on this property until the City has taken action on their offer to turn over the Neponsit sewerage system to the City. Nothing has been done on the balconies at Neponsit, as the contractor has been unable to obtain a delivery of steel.







All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchased.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and removed. holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the late and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according

to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so inter-ested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as con-tracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated

herein are in all respects true. No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the pro-posals or instructions to bidders and shall not e in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be in-

closed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate. For particulars as to the quantity and quality

of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifica-tions, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department. No bid shall be accepted from or contract

awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who

is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately.

The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their hids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specigcations, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
