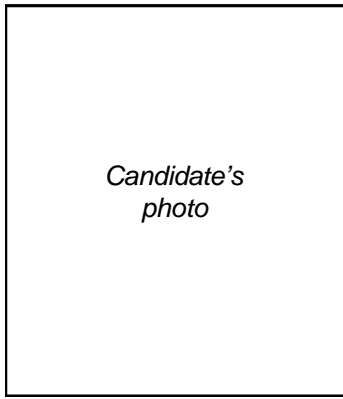

The New York City Voter Guide is a comprehensive source of information for New York City voters and candidates alike. It has been hailed by good government groups, editorial boards, and City residents as a significant step toward better-informed voting. Each edition of the Guide features candidate profiles with photographs, biographical information, and statements supplied by the candidates, as well as basic voting information and a map identifying the boundaries of the Council districts covered by that edition. All candidates appearing on the ballot for the five municipal offices—mayor, public advocate, comptroller, borough president, and City Council member—have the opportunity to appear in the Voter Guide published for each regularly scheduled citywide election.

The 2003 Voter Guide offers tremendous public exposure to candidates because it is mailed to registered voters in approximately three million households before both the primary and general election. It is also distributed at various public locations throughout the city.

Introduce yourself to the voters by submitting a candidate profile. Use the new Voter Guide Wizard software to easily create and submit a candidate profile that meets all the specifications for publication in the Guide. Don't forget to provide two color photos, sign and notarize the printout generated by the Wizard, and label the disk containing the Voter Guide Wizard file! And remember the deadline is June 12, 2003.
