New York Task Force 1 Deployed



New York City Emergency Management (NYCEM) announced yesterday that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has activated and deployed the Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) New York Task Force 1 (NY-TF1) team to provide critical assistance to Vermont's flood response and recovery efforts. The US&R NY-TF1 team, comprised of 46 members from the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) and the New York City Police Department (NYPD), is managed by NYC Emergency Management. Two members were also sent to support the FEMA Incident Support Team, one from NYPD and one from FDNY.

"We stand with Vermont during this challenging time, offering our unwavering support and expertise in the face of severe floods," said New York City Mayor Eric Adams. "This deployment reflects New York City's commitment to supporting our neighbors in times of crisis, and I am confident our team will bring a wealth of experience in disaster recovery and emergency response to the Green Mountain State as they cope with this disaster.

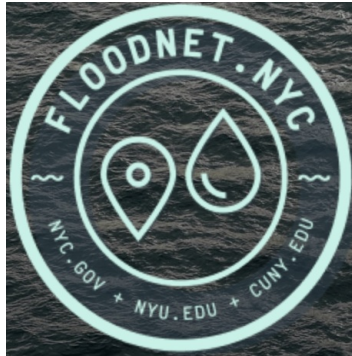

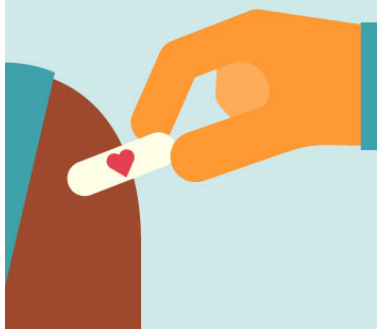

**Health Department Encourages New Yorkers to
Get mpox Vaccinated**

The mpox vaccine is effective at preventing mpox. Get the full two-dose series for the best protection.

The two-dose JYNNEOS vaccine is very effective at protecting against mpox, according to new data from the CDC.

- ✔ Getting vaccinated for mpox can reduce your chance of getting mpox, and it may reduce symptoms if you do get it.
- ✔ Everyone should receive two doses of the mpox vaccine, at least four weeks apart. If you never received your second dose, make sure to get it, no matter how much time has passed. Vaccines are being administered subcutaneously.
- ✔ Anyone of any sexual orientation or gender identity who is at risk for mpox can get vaccinated.



Vaccination is no cost and available regardless of immigration status.
