



Appendix A - Special Clinton District Map (96A)







(3) For #zoning lots# containing #residences# in R8 or C6-2 Districts within a #large-scale general development# that is located in or partially within a C6 District, the #floor area# of a #zoning lot# may not exceed the base #floor area ratio# of 4.88, except that such #floor area# may be increased on a #compensated zoning lot# by 1.25 square feet for each square foot of #low income floor area# provided, or by 0.833 square feet for each square foot of #moderate income floor area# provided, up to a maximum #floor area ratio# of 6.5, provided that for each square foot of #floor area compensation# for #moderate income floor area#, there is one square foot of #floor area compensation# for #low income floor area#.

However, to receive such #floor area# increase, the amount of #low income floor area# plus two-thirds of the amount of #moderate income floor area# need not exceed 20 percent of the total #floor area# on all #zoning lots# in R8 or C6-2 districts within the #large-scale general development#, exclusive of ground-floor non-#residential floor area#, #floor area# within a #school#, and #floor area# within a non-#residential building# that is vacant above the ground floor.

74-745 Location of a Accessory parking spaces and loading berths

For a #large-scale general development# the City Planning Commission may permit:

Modification of location requirements

When a #large-scale general development# includes two or more #zoning lots#, the City Planning Commission may permit required or permitted #accessory# off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces or loading berths to be located anywhere within a #large-scale general development# without regard for #zoning lot lines#, provided that the Commission shall find:

- such off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking (a)(1) spaces and loading berths will be conveniently located in relation to the #use# to which such spaces or berths are #accessory#;
- such location of off-street parking spaces, bicycle $\frac{(b)}{(2)}$ parking spaces and loading berths will result in a better site plan; and
- $\frac{(e)}{(3)}$ such location of off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths will not unduly increase the number of spaces in any single #block#, draw excessive traffic through local #streets#, or otherwise adversely affect traffic conditions in the surrounding area.

Whenever required off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths are permitted to be located without regard for #zoning lot lines# in accordance with the provisions of this Section, the number of spaces required for each #building# shall be kept available for such #building# throughout its life.

Waiver or reduction of loading berth requirements

When a #zoning lot# in a #large scale general development#, that is located within a waterfront area pursuant to Section 62-132(b), in Community District 1 in Brooklyn, contains one or more #retail or service uses# listed in Use Group 6A, 6C, 7B, 8B, 9A, 10A, 12B, 14A or 16A, and where no single such establishment exceeds 8,500 square feet in #floor area#, the <u>City Planning Commission may waive the requirement for</u> loading berths, or reduce the number of required loading berths, provided that:

- <u>(1)</u> curbside deliveries will not create or contribute to serious traffic congestion or unduly inhibit vehicular or pedestrian movement and will not interfere with the efficient functioning of nearby
- <u>(2)</u> an efficient goods receiving system will be implemented within the #commercial# establishment to expedite the movement of goods from the curb to areas within the establishment;
- (3) such modification allows for a better relationship of the #street walls# of the #building# containing such establishment with the sidewalks and surrounding
- such modification will not impair or adversely affect <u>(4)</u> the development of the surrounding area.

The City Planning Commission may prescribe additional conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the surrounding area.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The City Council enacted the "Earned Sick Time Act," found in Chapter 8 of Title 20 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York (as added by Local Law 46 for the year 2013, and amended by Local Laws 6 and 7 for the year 2014), to ensure that employees can take time off work to address their health needs or the health needs of family members. The City Council determined that providing sick time would have a positive effect on public health, foster employee retention and productivity and result in a more prosperous, safer and more healthy city.

These proposed rules clarify provisions in the Earned Sick Time Act, establish requirements to implement the Act and meet its goals, and provide guidance to covered employers and protected employees. Specifically, these rules

- Provide a methodology for new employers to calculate the number of their employees;
- Address situations where employees are employed by more than one employer, who, as "joint employers," are jointly and individually liable for
- ensuring compliance with the Earned Sick Time Act; Confirm that the Earned Sick Time Act applies to employees irrespective of immigration status;
- Explain what may constitute a "reasonable" minimum amount of leave that an employer may
- require for the use of sick time; Establish requirements for employer policies that require employees to provide "reasonable notice" before using sick time;
- Clarify that an employer may require an employee to provide written documentation of the need for sick time from a licensed health care provider if the employee is absent for more than three consecutive "work days" and define "work day" in this context;
- Address accrual of sick time for domestic workers; Address the rate of pay of paid sick leave for certain
- Provide that employees must be paid for sick time no later than the payday for the next regular payroll period after the sick time was used by the employee, unless the employer has asked for written documentation or verification of the need for sick time, in which case the employer is not required to pay sick time until the employee
- provides it; Address what happens to accrued sick time after an employer sells, transfers or otherwise assigns its business to another employer and the employee continues to work for that business;
- Establish requirements relating to the distribution or posting of an employer's sick leave policies; Clarify the requirements in the Earned Sick Time
- Act relating to Department access to employer records and define "appropriate notice" of the need for such access by the Department;
- Describe the circumstances in which the Department will issue a Notice of Violation to an employer; Establish a cure period for certain violations of the Earned Sick Time Act relating to the failure to
- respond to a complaint or provide records; and Describe the circumstances in which the Department may conduct an investigation of an employer's employment practices on its own initiative.

The authority for the Department of Consumer Affairs to promulgate these rules is found in section 2203 of the New York City Charter and Chapter 8 of Title 20 of the Administrative Code.

Proposed Rule

Section 1. A new chapter 7 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is added to read as follows:

$\frac{\text{CHAPTER 7 EARNED SICK TIME}}{\text{SUBCHAPTER A}}$

§ 7-1 Definitions.
As used in this subchapter, the terms "calendar year," "domestic worker," "employee," "employer," "health care provider," "paid sick time," and "sick time" shall have the same meanings as set forth in section 20-912 of the Administrative Code.

§ 7-2 New Employers. Business size for a business that has operated for less than one year as of April 1, 2014 shall be determined by counting the number of employees performing work for an employer for compensation per week, provided that if the number of employees fluctuates per week, business size may be determined for the current calendar year based on the average number of employees per week who worked for compensation for each week during the first 80 days of operation in that calendar year.

§ 7-3 Joint Employers.

(a)

Two or more businesses may be treated as a "joint employer" of an employee for purposes of complying

with chapter 8 of title 20 of the Administrative Code ("the Earned Sick Time Act"). Joint employers may be separate and distinct entities with separate

owners, managers and facilities.

(b) Every business deemed to be a joint employer must count each employee jointly employed in determining the number of employees performing work for compensation for the employer under the Earned Sick Time Act. For example, an employer who jointly employs three workers from a temporary help agency and also has three permanent employees has six employees for purposes of the Earned Sick Time Act and must

provide paid sick time.
Every joint employer is responsible, individually and jointly, for compliance with all provisions of the (c) Earned Sick Time Act.

An employee is entitled to the protections of the Earned Sick Time Act regardless of immigration

An individual is "employed for hire within the city of New York" for purposes of section 20-912(f) of the Administrative Code if the individual performs <u>(b)</u> work, including work performed by telecommuting, while the individual is physically located in New York City, regardless of where the employer is <u>located.</u>

Example: An individual who performs work while physically located outside of New York City, even if the employer is based in New York City, is not "employed for hire within the city of New York" for purposes of section 20-912(f) for hours worked outside New York City.

§ 7-5 Minimum increments for the use of sick time. Unless otherwise provided by state or federal law or regulations:

an employer may not require an employee to use another form of paid or unpaid leave (such as annual leave) in conjunction with sick time; and

an employee may decide how much earned sick time to use, provided however, that an employer <u>(b)</u> may set a minimum increment for the use of sick time, not to exceed four hours per day, provided such minimum increment is reasonable under the circumstances.

Employee notification of use of sick time.

An employer may require an employee to provide reasonable notice of the need to use sick time. <u>(b)</u> An employer that requires notice of the need to use sick time where the need is not foreseeable shall provide a written policy that contains procedures for the employee to provide notice as soon as practicable. Examples of such procedures may include, but are not limited to, instructing the employee to: (1) call a designated phone number at which an employee can leave a message; (2) follow a uniform call-in procedure; or (3) use another reasonable and accessible means of communication

identified by the employer. In determining when notice is practicable in a given (c) situation, an employer must consider the individual

facts and circumstances of the situation.

An employer that requires notice of the need to use sick time where the need is foreseeable shall have a (<u>d</u>) written policy for the employee to provide reasonable notice. Such policy shall not require more than seven days notice prior to the date such sick time is to begin. The employer may require that such notice be in writing.

An employer that has not provided to the employee

<u>(e)</u> a copy of its written policy for providing notice of the need to use sick time shall not deny sick time to the employee based on non-compliance with such a

§ 7-7 Documentation from licensed health care

provider.
(a) When an employee's use of sick time results in an absence of more than three consecutive work days, an employer may require reasonable written documentation that the use of sick time was for a purpose authorized under section 20-914(a) of the Administrative Code. Written documentation signed by a licensed health care provider indicating the need for the amount of sick time taken shall be considered reasonable documentation. "Work days" means the days or parts of days the employee would have worked had the employee not used sick time.

If an employer requires an employee to provide written documentation from a licensed health care provider when the employee's use of sick time <u>(b)</u> resulted in an absence of more than three consecutive work days, the employee is responsible for the cost of such documentation not covered by

insurance or any other benefit plan.

If an employee provides written documentation from a licensed health care provider in accordance with subdivision (a) of this section, an employer may not require an employee to obtain (c) documentation from a second licensed health care provider indicating the need for sick time in the amount used by the employee.

§ 7-8 Domestic workers.

Domestic workers who have worked for the same employer for at least one year and who work more than 80 hours in a calendar year will accrue two days of paid sick time per year, as provided in this

The two days of paid sick time must be calculated in the manner that paid days of rest for domestic workers are calculated pursuant to New York State <u>(b)</u>

Labor Law section 161(1). A domestic worker described in subdivision (a) of this section will be entitled to two days of paid sick (c) time on the next date that such domestic worker is entitled to a day or days of rest under New York State Labor Law section 161(1) that immediately follows April 1, 2014, and annually thereafter. Sick time accrued by a domestic worker will carry

(<u>d</u>) over to the next calendar year.

§ 7-9 Rate of pay.
(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this section, when using paid sick time, an employee shall be compensated at the same hourly rate that the employee would have earned at the time the paid

sick time is taken.

If the employee uses sick time during hours that <u>(b)</u> would have been designated as overtime, the employer is not required to pay the overtime rate of

<u>(c)</u> An employee is not entitled to compensation for lost tips or gratuities, provided, however, that an employer must pay an employee whose salary is based in whole or in part on tips or gratuities at least the full minimum wage.

For employees who are paid on a commission (whether base wage plus commission or commission only) or piecework basis (whether base wage plus (d) piecework or piecework only), the hourly rate of pay shall be the base wage or applicable minimum wage, whichever is greater.

If an employee performs more than one job for the same employer or the employee's rate of pay fluctuates for a single job, the rate of pay shall be <u>(e)</u> the rate of pay that the employee would have been paid during the time the employee used the sick

 § 7-10 Payment of sick time.
 (a) Sick time must be paid no later than the payday for the next regular payroll period beginning after the sick time was used by the employee.

If the employer has asked for written

<u>(b)</u> documentation or verification of use of sick time pursuant to section 20-914(c) or 20-914(d) of the Administrative Code, the employer is not required to pay sick time until the employee has provided such documentation or verification.

 8 7-11 Employer's sale of business.
 (a) If an employer sells its business or the business is otherwise acquired by another business, an employee will retain and may use all accrued sick time if the employee continues to perform work within the City of New York for the successor

employer.

If the successor employer has fewer than five employees, and the former employer had more than <u>(b)</u> five employees, the employee is entitled to use and be compensated for unused sick time accrued while working for the former employer, until such sick time is exhausted.

§ 7-12 Employer's distribution or posting of policies.

Every employer shall distribute or post the employer's written policies on sick time, including, but not limited to those required by the Earned Sick Time Act and this subchapter. An employer may comply with subdivision (a) of

<u>(b)</u>

this section by:

(1) distributing the policies to each employee personally, by regular mail or by email;

(2) distributing through company newspapers or newsletters, inclusion with paychecks, inclusion in employee

company intranet; posting the policies in a conspicuous place <u>(3)</u> where notices to employees are

handbooks or manuals, or posting on the

customarily posted; or using any means of distribution or posting <u>(4)</u> that the employer uses in order to comply with section 195(5) of the New York State Labor Law.

Employers shall retain records documenting such employer's compliance with the requirements of the Earned Sick Time Act, including records of any policies required pursuant to this subchapter, for a

period of three years unless otherwise required pursuant to any other law, rule or regulation. Requirements relating to an employer's obligation <u>(d)</u> to provide employees with a Notice of Rights under the Earned Sick Time Act are set forth in section 20-919 of the Administrative Code.

§ 7-13 Employer records.

<u>(c)</u>

If the department issues a subpoena or document demand, an employer shall provide the department with access to records documenting its compliance with the requirements of the Earned Sick Time Act and the provisions of this subchapter, upon appropriate notice, at the department's office. Alternately, in the absence of a subpoena or

<u>(b)</u> document demand, an employer shall provide the department with access to records upon appropriate notice and at a mutually agreeable time of day at the employer's place of business. "Appropriate notice" shall mean 30 days' written

(c) notice, unless the employer agrees to a lesser amount of time or the department has reason to believe that:

the employer will destroy or falsify (1)records;

the employer is closing, selling or <u>(2)</u> transferring its business, disposing of assets or is about to declare bankruptcy; <u>(3)</u> the employer is the subject of a

government investigation or enforcement action or proceeding related to wages and hours, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation or discrimination; or

<u>(4)</u> more immediate access to records is necessary to prevent retaliation against

<u>(d)</u> The department will make two attempts by letter, email or telephone to arrange a mutually agreeable time of day for the employer to provide access to its records in accordance with subdivision (b) of this section. If these attempts are not successful, the department may set a time to access records at the employer's place of business during regular business hours, upon two days' notice.

§ 7-14 Enforcement.

<u>(c)</u>

The department may issue a notice of violation after conducting an investigation pursuant to section 20-924(c) of the Administrative Code.

<u>(b)</u> Additionally, the department may issue a notice of violation to an employer who fails to respond to a complaint or provide information requested by the Department in connection with a complaint, as required by section 20-924(c) of the Administrative Code, or who fails to provide records or access to records as required by section 20-920 of the Administrative Code, provided that:

the department makes two written attempts to obtain the response to the complaint, requested information or records, or access to records; and

<u>(2)</u> the department notifies the employer that failure to respond to the complaint, or provide requested information, records or access to records will result in a notice of violation.

The employer may cure a notice of violation issued

in accordance with subdivision (b) of this section without penalty by:

- (1) producing the requested information or records on or before the first scheduled hearing date; or
- (2) resolving to the satisfaction of the department on or before the first scheduled hearing date the employee complaint that is the basis for the request for a response to the complaint.
- (d) The department may conduct an investigation on its own initiative where the department has reason to believe that the facts and circumstances of an employer's practices related to the Earned Sick Time Act warrant investigation, including where:
 - the employer has a history of noncompliance with the Earned Sick Time Act, including failure to comply with settlements or orders of the department, or the department has reason to believe that the employer engages in a pattern of violations of the Earned Sick Time Act;
 - the department has reason to believe that the employer fails to pay minimum wage, prevailing wage, engages in discriminatory practices or retaliation, misclassifies employees as independent contractors or denies undocumented employees sick time required under the Earned Sick Time Act; or
 - (3) the investigation is part of a coordinated enforcement effort with other state, local or federal agencies to protect employee rights.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? The Department must meet the requirements of §1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of City Charter §1043.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The authority for these rules is found in $\S556$ and 558 of the New York City Charter and $\S81.51$ of the New York City Health Code (the Health Code).

Introduction

The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the Health Department) regulates food service establishments, which include a broad range of businesses and not-for-profit operations that provide food in individual portion sizes for consumption by members of the public. The Department is proposing to amend Chapter 23 to establish a schedule of fixed penalties for violations sustained against food service establishments and to update some definitions used in the Chapter.

Establishment of fixed penalties for food service establishment violations.

In accordance with S 558(e) of the Charter, the Board of Health established an administrative tribunal within the Health Department to enforce the provisions of the New York City Health Code (Health Code). By Executive Order No. 148 (June 8, 2011), the Mayor transferred this tribunal to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings ("OATH"). Since July 3, 2011 it has operated the Health Tribunal, which is where all violations issued to food service establishments, other than mobile food vending units, are adjudicated.

OATH's rules for the Health Tribunal, found in Title 48 RCNY Chapter 6, (specifically 48 RCNY § 6-02) require it to impose fines and pecuniary penalties in accordance with Article 3 of the Health Code. Unless otherwise specified, Health Code §3.11 requires that there be a penalty of at least \$200 and no more than \$2000 whenever a violation of the Health Code, or other law enforced by the Health Department, is found to have occurred. Currently, the hearing examiners who adjudicate notices of violation at the Health Tribunal decide within these parameters what the penalty will be when they sustain a violation. At other City agencies' administrative tribunals, including the Environmental Control Board at OATH where notices of violation issued to mobile food vendors are adjudicated, penalties are fixed by law and not left to the discretion of hearing examiners. The Health Department believes that similarly having fixed penalties at the Health Tribunal will promote consistency and fairness in decision making and provide predictability for those whose notices of violation are decided there.

Eventually the Department will be proposing rules fixing penalties for all violations that are adjudicated at the Health Tribunal. Chapter 23 is being amended first to add a new Appendix C fixing penalties for any violation that can be cited against a food service establishment on inspection because the majority of notices of violation heard at the Health Tribunal are issued to food service establishments. Some violations listed in Appendix C, however, are cited more broadly than just against food service establishments.

Examples include failing to prevent or maintaining a nuisance in violation of Health Code §§3.07 or 3.09, or obstructing an inspection in violation of Health Code §3.15(a). The penalties prescribed for these violations will apply to all notices of violation of these provisions adjudicated at the Health Tribunal, regardless of whether the respondent is a food service establishment.

$Amended\ definitions\ and\ references\ to\ the\ former$ $Administrative\ Tribunal$

Article 7 of the Health Code, which contained the procedural rules of the Administrative Tribunal when it was located within the Department, was repealed after its transfer to OATH. The definitions of "Administrative Tribunal" and "notice of violation" in §23-01 of Chapter 23, and the references to the Department's Administrative Tribunal in §23-07, are being amended to reflect this repeal and the fact that Health Tribunal is now at OATH. The definition of "notice of violation" is being amended to be consistent with the definition in OATH's rules at 48 RCNY §6-01, which currently reads:

Notice of Violation or "NOV" means the document issued by the petitioner to a respondent which specifies the charges forming the basis of an adjudicatory proceeding before the Tribunal.

The proposal is as follows.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this Department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Deleted material is in [brackets]; new text is <u>underlined</u>.

Section 1. Section 23-01 of Chapter 23 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to repeal the definition of "Administrative Tribunal," to amend the definition of "Notice of violation" and to add a definition of "Health Tribunal" as follows:

[Administrative Tribunal shall mean the Administrative Tribunal of the Department established in Article 7 of the Health Code.]

Health Tribunal means the Health Tribunal at OATH, the adjudicatory body established by \$558 of the New York City Charter, formerly known as the Department's Administrative Tribunal, whose operation was transferred to OATH by Executive Order No. 148, effective July 3, 2011.

Notice of violation [shall have the same meaning as in Article 7 of the Health Code] means the document issued by the Department to a respondent that specifies the charges forming the basis of an adjudicatory proceeding at the Health Tribunal and seeks a monetary penalty.

§2. Section 23-05 of Chapter 23 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is retitled and amended to add a new subdivision (c), effective four months from the date of publication of the final rule in the City Record, as follows: §23-05 [Issuance of notices] Notices of violation[s.] and penalties for sustained violations.

(c) A Health Tribunal hearing examiner must impose the penalty set forth in Appendix C of this Chapter for any sustained violation.

§3. Subdivision (c) and paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4) and (7) of subdivision (d) of Section 23-07 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended solely to substitute the term "Health Tribunal" for "Administrative Tribunal" or "Department's Administrative Tribunal" as follows:

$\S 23-07$. Posting letter grades.

(c) If an establishment required by §81.51 of the Health Code to post a letter grade receives a score of 14 or more points on the reinspection, and is not closed by the Department, the Department shall provide the establishment with a "grade pending" card and a grade card displaying the letter grade that corresponds with its inspection score at the reinspection. The establishment shall immediately post either the grade card or the "grade pending" card. If the establishment elects to post the "grade pending" card, it may only do so until it has had an opportunity to be heard at the [Department's Administrative Tribunal] Health Tribunal pursuant to subdivision (d) of this section and §81.51 of the Health Code.

(d) Effect of adjudication at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> on grading of establishments required by §81.51 of the Health Code to post letter grades:

- (1) If the establishment appears personally at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> and as a result of such proceeding the score received on a reinspection does not change the grade, the establishment shall immediately upon receipt of the notice of decision remove any posted "grade pending" card and post the grade card provided by the Department at such inspection.
- (2) Subject o the provisions of paragraph (3) of this subdivision, if the establishment does not appear at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> on or before the scheduled hearing date,[in accordance with Article 7 of the Health Code,] the establishment shall, on the date of the hearing, post the letter grade card provided by the Department at the reinspection.
- (3) If the establishment appears at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> on the scheduled date but is unable to proceed, or if the establishment makes a timely request for an adjournment and such adjournment is granted, the establishment may continue to post the "grade pending" card and defer posting the letter grade card until the adjourned hearing date. In no event shall an establishment fail to post the grade card after the adjourned hearing date if the establishment is not able to proceed on such date.
- (4) If the establishment appears at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> and as a result of such proceeding the score received for the reinspection changes in a way that results in a change of grade, the Department shall provide the establishment with a new letter grade card that shall be promptly posted by the establishment in place of any other letter grade card or "grade pending" card.

(7) The disposition of any notice of violation at the [Administrative Tribunal] <u>Health Tribunal</u> shall not affect any provision of this Chapter or other applicable law other than the issuance of

a grade.

§4. Chapter 23, found in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, is amended to add a new Appendix C.

Charter §389(b) provides that "heads of mayoral agencies shall have the power to adopt rules to carry out the powers and duties delegated to the agency head or the agency by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." Charter §1043(a) authorizes each agency to "adopt rules necessary to carry out the powers and duties delegated to it by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." These rules are also authorized by Local Law 93 for the year 2013, enacted November 9, 2013, which added §17-1504 to the Administrative Code of the City of New York, authorizing the Department to provide voluntary consultative inspections to food service establishments and establish fees.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

Statutory Authority

Amendment of Chapter 21 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is authorized by sections 389(b) and 1043(a) of the Charter. Charter §389(b) provides that "heads of mayoral agencies shall have the power to adopt rules to carry out the powers and duties delegated to the agency head or the agency by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." Charter §1043(a) authorizes each agency to "adopt rules necessary to carry out the powers and duties delegated to it by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." These rules are also authorized by Local Law 93 for the year 2013, enacted November 9, 2013, which added §17-1504 to the Administrative Code of the City of New York, authorizing the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the Department) to provide voluntary consultative inspections to restaurants and establish fees for these inspections.

The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the Department) is proposing to amend Chapter 21 (Health Academy Courses and Fees) of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, as follows:

- Repeal §21-03, Swimming pool technology course
- Add a new §21-07, Food service establishment consultative inspections and fees; and
- Amend the title of the chapter and §21-01, Scope and applicability.

$\underline{Repeal~\S 21\text{-}03\text{-}Swimming~pool~technology~course~and~fee}$

This section currently describes a Health Academy course that is no longer being offered, and should be repealed. Before it was amended by the Board of Health by resolution adopted September 21, 2011, New York City Health Code (Health Code) §165.15(b)(1) required swimming pool operators to take a Department swimming pool technology course at the Department's Health Academy. As amended, the Health Code currently requires that pool operators hold a "certificate indicating successful completion of an adequate course of instruction regarding the safe and effective operation and maintenance of pool treatment equipment . . . ," but does not require that such courses be offered by the Department.

Add a new \$2-07 - Food service establishment consultative inspections and fees

The Department is proposing to offer voluntary consultative inspections, with no risk of receiving notices of violation subject to monetary penalties, to food service establishments in the restaurant inspection program established by Health Code $\S 81.51$ and Chapter 23 of these rules. The consultative inspections would provide additional food safety training and education and would be available at the request of a food service establishment permittee, or applicant for a new permit, subject to Department resources. The consultative inspection would be conducted by a Department staff member with extensive knowledge of New York City's food safety regulations and include an on-site assessment of the establishment's food handling and preparation practices as well as its facilities, sanitation and food storage. For operating establishments, the Department would also review recent inspection histories.

Administrative Code \$17-1504, enacted by Local Law 93 for the year 2013, authorizes the Department to offer these consultative inspections and establish a fee for them. The Department proposes to charge a \$400 fee for existing restaurants and a \$100 fee for restaurants that register for a consultative inspection before receiving their permit. These fees, which would partially offset the costs of providing this service, have been approved by the City's Office of Management and Budget.

These consultative inspections would be entirely voluntary. To maximize the benefits of the consultation, the Department may require that the owner, operator or manager accompany Department staff during the on-site inspection. Findings would not be graded, and would only be scored if requested by the operator for informational purposes. Findings would not be used to determine the date of the next inspection or the length of the inspection cycle; and would not influence subsequent inspection findings. No notice of violation or grade card would be issued. The results are intended to inform the establishment's operator of practices and conditions that violate applicable food safety laws and regulations and provide recommendations for improving operations affecting food safety. If the Department observes a condition that constitutes an imminent or public health hazard during the on-site consultative inspection the permittee would be required to correct the condition immediately, and the Department may close the establishment on a temporary, emergency basis to protect the public health, until the condition is corrected.

Amend the Chapter title and §21-01 Scope and applicability

Since the new \$21-07 will not involve a course offered at the Health Academy, but only describes a consultative inspection and fees to be charged by the Department, the Chapter title and \$21-01 are also being amended.

CHAPTER 21 HEALTH ACADEMY COURSES AND <u>DEPARTMENT</u> FEES

- §21-01 Scope and applicability.
- \$21-02 Food protection courses and fees.
 [\$21-03 Swimming pool technology course and fee.]
- §21-04 Animal care and handling techniques course and fee.
- \$21-05 Tattooist infection control course and fee.
- \$21-06 Course completion certificate; replacement fee. \$21-07 Food service establishment consultative
- <u>Food service establishment consultative</u> <u>inspections and fees.</u>

§2. Section 21-01 (Scope and applicability) of Chapter 21 (Health Academy Courses and Fees) of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§21-01 Scope and applicability.

This Chapter describes the courses offered [and fees authorized to be charged] by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the "Department") Health Academy <u>and</u> fees authorized to be charged by the Department.

§3. Section 21-03 (Swimming pool technology course and fee) of Chapter 21 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, related to a course and fee on swimming pool technology

offered by the Department, is REPEALED.

§4. Chapter 21 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new § 21-07 entitled "Food service establishment consultative inspections and fees" to read as follows:

$\S 21\text{-}07$ Food service establishment consultative inspections and fees.

(a) Consultative inspections.

- (1) Voluntary consultation. In accordance with New York City Administrative Code §17-1504, the Department will provide a consultative inspection to a person operating or applying for a permit to operate a food service establishment, as defined in New York City Health Code §81.03, on how to operate the establishment in compliance with the Health Code and other applicable law.
 - (2) Priority and scheduling of consultative inspections.
- (i) The Department will give priority to conducting consultative inspections at establishments that have a history of two or more inspections with a score of 28 or more points per inspection during the preceding 12 months, and at establishments whose operators request a consultative inspection when they are applying for their first permit, if they have not already been inspected and cited for operating without a permit.

(ii) For permitted establishments, consultative inspections will be scheduled so that they do not occur during the establishment's inspection cycle.

(iii) All consultative inspections are contingent on the availability of Department resources,
(b) Fees. The fee for a permittee requesting a consultative inspection at an existing establishment is four hundred dollars (\$400). The fee for an applicant for a new permit requesting a consultative inspection prior to the establishment's first inspection by the Department is one hundred dollars (\$100).

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule Tobacco is a leading cause of preventable premature death in the United States and the City of New York. Smoking-related illnesses cost New Yorkers billions of dollars annually in health care costs and lost productivity. There is strong evidence that people who begin smoking at an early age are more likely to develop a severe addiction to nicotine than those who start at a later age. Several studies also show that the availability of low-priced cigarettes and tobacco products increases demand for cigarettes and tobacco products and contributes to continued use, particularly among youth. Local Law 94 of 2013 ("Tobacco 21") and Local Law 97 of 2013 ("Sensible Tobacco Enforcement") aim to reduce tobacco use and protect public health by raising the legal minimum sales age for cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic cigarettes, and prohibiting the redemption of price reduction instruments in the purchase of cigarettes and tobacco

On November 19, 2013, the Mayor signed into law Tobacco 21 and Sensible Tobacco Enforcement, amending sections 17-176, 17-702, 17-704, and 17-706, and adding sections 17-176.1 (Prohibition on the Sale of Discounted Cigarettes and Tobacco Products), 17-703.1 (Sign Required), 17-703.2 (Requirements for Retail Dealers Concerning Cigarette Tax), and 17-709.1 (Rules) to Chapter 7 of Title 17 of the Administrative Code. These amendments and additions to Chapter 7 modify the definitions of cigarette and tobacco product, and impose new licensing, sales, and signage requirements on cigarette and tobacco product retailers

Local Law 94 raises the minimum sales age for cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic cigarettes from eighteen to twenty-one, and requires retailers to post signage that informs consumers and establishments of this sales restriction. Local Law 97 prohibits the redemption of price reduction instruments (such as coupons) for cigarette or tobacco products and the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products below the listed price. In addition, Local Law 97 establishes a price floor (lowest price possible) for cigarettes and little cigars, imposes a packaging requirement on cigars priced at \$3 or less, and requires cigarette retailers to post a

York State and New York City tax stamps.

These rules facilitate compliance with Chapter 7 by explaining the retail dealer requirements in Local Law 97 and Local Law 94. Anyone required to comply with the requirements for cigarette and tobacco product sales should read these rules together with Chapter 7 of the read these rules together with Chapter 7 of the Administrative Code.

The proposed rules:

- Set forth the listed price requirements for cigarettes and other tobacco products;
- Provide the minimum sales age for cigarettes, tobacco products, electronic cigarettes, herbal cigarettes, pipes, and rolling papers; and
- Specify the format and content of the tax stamp and age restriction signs that all cigarette and tobacco product retailers are required to post under the new

CHAPTER 13

CIGARETTE AND TOBACCO PRODUCT SALES

Scope and applicability. Prohibition on the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products for less than the listed price. Price floor for cigarettes and little cigars. Out-of-package sales prohibited Sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, or electronic cigarettes to minors and young adults prohibited. §13-06. Signage.

§13-01. Scope and applicability.

This chapter applies to sales of cigarettes and tobacco products in the City of New York pursuant to section 17-176.1 and Chapter 7 of Title 17 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York ("Administrative Code").

§13-02. Prohibition on the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products for less than the listed price.

(a) Pursuant to subdivision (a) of §17-176.1 of the Administrative Code, the listed price is the price listed for cigarettes or tobacco products on their packages or on any related shelving, posting, advertising or display at the place where the cigarettes or tobacco products are sold or offered for sale, including all applicable taxes.

(b) "All applicable taxes" includes excise taxes and sales

(c) For cigarettes and tobacco products subject to §20-708 of the Administrative Code, the listed price must specify the price exclusive of sales tax and the amount of sales tax to be

(d) Paragraph four of subdivision (b) and paragraph four of subdivision (c) of §17-176.1 of the Administrative Code prohibit the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products to a consumer for less than the listed price, but does not prohibit a person from:

i) changing the listed price; or (ii) informing customers that the listed price has changed.

§13-03. Price floor for cigarettes and little cigars. Pursuant to subdivision (d) of \$17-176.1 of the Administrative Code, the price floor for a package of cigarettes and little cigars is \$10.50 including sales tax and \$9.65 excluding sales tax.

§13-04. Out-of-package sales prohibited.
Pursuant to subdivision (b) of §17-704 of the Administrative Code, retail dealers are prohibited from selling a cigar for \$3.00 or less including sales tax, or \$2.76 or less excluding

sales tax, unless it is sold in a package of at least four cigars.

§13-05. Sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, or electronic cigarettes to minors and young adults prohibited.

(a) Pursuant to subdivision (a) of §17-706 of the Administrative Code, any individual purchasing cigarettes, tobacco products, or electronic cigarettes must be at least <u>twenty-one years of age.</u>

(b) Pursuant to subdivision (b) of §§17-706 and 17-714 of the Administrative Code, any individual purchasing non-tobacco shisha, herbal cigarettes, pipes, or rolling papers must be at least eighteen years of age.

§13-06. Signage.

Age restriction sign. Pursuant to subdivision (c) of §17-706 of the Administrative Code, any person operating a place of business where cigarettes, tobacco products, electronic cigarettes, herbal cigarettes, non-tobacco shisha, pipes, or rolling papers are sold or offered for sale must post in a conspicuous place a sign, printed on a white card in bold red letters that are at least one-half inch in height and capitalized as indicated below, which states:

PROHIBITED for SALE to persons UNDER 21: Cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, powdered tobacco, other tobacco products, or electronic cigarettes,

<u>and</u> "PROHIBITED for SALE to persons UNDER 18: Non-tobacco shisha, herbal cigarettes, pipes, rolling papers, or smoking paraphernalia"

(b) Cigarette tax stamp sign. Pursuant to §17-703.1 of the Administrative Code, a retail dealer must post, in a conspicuous place at the point of sale of cigarettes or at the place where cigarettes are displayed or offered for sale, a sign that complies with the requirements of this subdivision. The sign must be printed on a white card in bold red letters that are at least one-half inch in height and capitalized as indicated below. The sign must include images of the current New York City and New York State tax stamp and a pack of cigarettes with a New York City and New York State tax stamp on the bottom of the pack, and must state:

"ALL CIGARETTES MUST HAVE A NEW YORK CITY AND NEW YORK STATE TAX STAMP"

The sign must also include the contact number for the Sheriff's hotline for reporting potential violations, available on the New York City Department of Consumer Affairs website.

Should the tax credit be extended, this additional fee will be discontinued and removed from the invoice.
