# Free guided nature hikes throughout the spring and summer will feature informative discussions by DEP wildlife and forestry specialists

- The Mt. Tobias Traverse. Go over the Beaverkill and through the woods of Mt. Tobias on DEP and State land with Forester Duncan Schmitt. This steep and strenuous hike on old wood roads, and sometimes on no roads, departs at 9:00 AM from the Beetree Hill Unit at the end of Baker Road in Woodstock and concludes at the Beaverkill Unit on Route 212.
