EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 28.

Amendment of Executive Order No. 6

(March 12, 1990)

**CONSOLIDATION OF RESPONSIBILITY FOR SUPERVISION AND  
COORDINATION OF COMMUNITY-RELATED SERVICE AGENCIES**

By the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. A number of City agencies provide community-related services to residents of the City. Responsibility for supervising and coordinating those agencies is currently divided among the deputy mayors. To improve the delivery of community-related services and to facilitate the supervision and coordination of the agencies which provide them, such agencies should be subject to the jurisdiction of a single deputy mayor. Pursuant to this Executive Order, such responsibility is given to the Deputy Mayor for Intergovernmental Affairs.


§2. Paragraph (f) of section 6 of prior Executive Order No. 6, dated March 12, 1990, is amended to read as follows:

f. Supervise and coordinate the operations of the Offices of Minority Affairs, Asian Affairs, Hispanic Affairs, and Veterans' Affairs; the Office for the Gay and Lesbian Community; the Office for People With Disabilities; the Mayor's Voluntary Action Center; the 1990 Census Project; the Community Assistance Unit; the Commission on the Status of Women; the City Volunteer Corps; the Mayor's Scheduling Office; the Community Development Agency; the City Commission on Human Rights; the Department of Youth Services; and the Department for the Aging.

§3. Section 1 of prior Executive Order No. 17, dated September 7, 1990, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1: Office for People With Disabilities. The New York City Mayor's Office for the handicapped is hereby renamed the Mayor's Office for People With Disabilities. The Office shall report to and be directly accountable to the Deputy Mayor for Intergovernmental Affairs. The Office shall be headed by a Director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Mayor.

§4. Effective Date. This Order shall take effect immediately.

OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL COORDINATION

WHEREAS, section 192(e) of the Charter of the City of New York and recently promulgated rules of the City Planning Commission provide for the establishment of an Office of Environmental Coordination (OEC) to "provide assistance to all city agencies in fulfilling their environmental review responsibilities"; and

WHEREAS, the rules of the City Planning Commission assign to the OEC several important functions in order to assist lead agencies in the exercise of their environmental review responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the rules of the City Planning Commission providing for a more efficient system of environmental review in the City of New York take effect on October 1, 1991;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. Establishment of Office of Environmental Coordination. There is hereby established within the Office of the Mayor an Office of Environmental Coordination (OEC), to be headed by a director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of

the Mayor. The director shall report to and be directly accountable to the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Development.

§2. Scope of Duties. The OEC shall:

a. Provide assistance to city agencies in fulfilling their environmental review responsibilities.


b. Perform any environmental review function assigned to it by a lead agency, except as provided in rules of the City Planning Commission governing environmental review.

c. Assist City agencies in coordinating environmental review when an action involves both City and state agencies, and when an action or part thereof has been or will be reviewed by a federal agency.

d. Perform any other function required by rules of the City Planning Commission governing environmental review.

§3. Cooperation and Assistance. The heads of all City departments and agencies, including the Director of City Planning and the Commissioner of Environmental Protection pursuant to section 192(e) of the Charter, shall cooperate with and assist the OEC.

§4. This Order shall take effect immediately.
