Daniel Lord, attorney, was notified that unless the terms of the resolution adopted April 20, 1893, respecting the bulkhead adjoining Pier, new 40, North river, were accepted on or before the 18th instant, the same will be rescinded.

The report of the Engineer-in-Chief on Secretary's Order No. 14240, as to dredging required at the Department of Street Cleaning dump foot of Rutgers street, East River, was tabled for one week.

The claim for the payment of uniforms, furnished certain employees on floating property, pursuant to the resolution adopted February 1, 1894, was referred to the Counsel to the Corporation.

The following permits were granted, the work to be done under the supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief, and to be kept within existing lines:

Pennsylvania Railroad Company—To repair the sheathing and piling at bulkhead, between Piers, old 1 and 2, North river.

Providence and Stonington Steamship Company, lessee—To replace a number of spring piles at Pier, new 36, North river.

The following permits were granted on the usual terms:

J. L. Keating & Co.—To unload one boat load of sand on the bulkhead between Seventeenth and Eighteenth streets, East river.

Brooklyn & New York Ferry Company—To make repairs to their ferry racks, foot of Roosevelt, Grand and Twenty-third streets, East river, during the ensuing three months.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.
