
Women Who Advocate for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion



Women's History Month has come a long way since the first Women's History Day back in 1909. The celebration in 1909 was held one year after 15,000 garment district workers (all women) marched through lower Manhattan. They were protesting the poor factory conditions. The tragic and fatal fire that killed 145 factory workers, in 1911, was the catalyst for legislation to protect factory workers. In 1978, Women's History Day turned into a week of recognition, then into a month in 1987, but it wasn't until 1995 when March was declared Women's History Month annually by presidential proclamation.

The right to vote for all women had a similarly slow unfolding as did the recognition of Women's History Month. In 1869, Wyoming was the first US state to allow white women voting rights. They were also the first to have a female governor, Nellie Tayloe Ross, in 1924. However, it was the signing of the Voting Rights Act in 1965, which removed the blockages that prevented women of other ethnicities from voting.

Though Geraldyn "Jerri" Cobb was the first female to pass NASA astronaut training, her ability to take to the skies was stymied by her gender back in 1961. She testified on Capitol Hill in 1962, calling for a "...future without discrimination." It was 22 years later when Astronaut Sally Ride piloted and operated the robotic arm of Challenger in 1983, making her the first and youngest American gay astronaut in space.

Back on Earth, in 1901 and 1911, scientist Marie Curie was not only the first woman to win the Nobel Prize, but she was also the first scientist to win two Nobel Prizes, each in physics and chemistry, respectively. In 1951, researcher Rosalind Franklin discovered the existence of a helix molecule formation, which later led to the discovery of the double helix polymer—DNA. Mount Everest, the highest mountain peak on Earth, was summited by Junko Tabei in 1975. Aretha Franklin, singer, songwriter, pianist, dubbed the Queen of Soul, became the first woman inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1987. Malala Yousafzai became the youngest winner of the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize for her fight against the Pakistani Taliban's opposition to female education. And Kamala Harris became the first female, Black, and



THINGS TO KNOW

How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the NYC CERT External Request Form.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this <u>Event</u> Request form



NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT Event Calendar with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.


