

#### ASSESSMENT COMMISSION.

No. 27 CHAMBERS STREET,
FRIDAY, February 26, 1886—2 o'clock p. m. 

The Commission created by chapter 550 of the Laws of 1880, to revise, acate, or modify ssments for local improvements in the City of New York, met pursuant to adjournment.
Present—Commissioners Daniel Lord, Jr. (Chairman), Allan Campbell, Joseph Garry, and John Marshall

The Clerk presented copies of the CITY RECORD and "Daily Register" of February 25 and 26, 1886, showing the publication of notices of the meeting.

The minutes of the meetings held on February 12, 16, 19 and 23, 1886, were read and approved.
