EXTRACTS FROM THE OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC CHARITIES, FOR THE WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 30, 1897. Bellevue Hospital, Mill's Training School—Proposal of James Foley for plumbing work at Mill's Training School, for the sum of \$394.50, was accepted and filed.

COMMISSIONER OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS, 23D AND 24TH WARDS.

November 6, 1897. To the Supervisor of the City Record: SIR—In compliance with section 51 of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, the office of Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards makes the following report of its transactions for the week ending November 4, 1897:

APPROVED PAPERS.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to James Cosgrove to place and keep a stand for the sale of newspapers and periodicals under the elevated railroad stairs on the southeast corner of Third avenue and Forty-second street, provided said stand shall be erected in conformity with the provisions of subdivision 3, section 86 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, as amended by the Laws of 1896, and subject to the conditions of an ordinance to regulate the placing of stands under the stairs of the elevated railroad, which was adopted by the Board of Aldermen September 3, 1896, and repassed on October 6, 1896.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to the Abbey Social Club to parade, with drum and fife corps and a truck, through the following streets: Twenty-fourth street and Eighth avenue to Fourteenth street, to Third avenue, back to Sixth avenue, to Forty-second street, to Broadway, to Twenty-third street, to Eighth avenue, to Fifty-ninth street, back to Twenty-fourth street and Eighth avenue, the work to be done at their own expense, under the direction of the Chief of Police; such permission to continue only during November 9, 10 and 11, 1897.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, October 26, 1897. Approved by the Mayor, November 3, 1897.

Resolved, That, in consequence of the urgency of providing new court-rooms and offices for the City Court, in order to carry out the provisions of chapter 632, Laws of 1897, which require the remodeling of the City Hall for the incoming municipal government, the Commissioner of Public Works is hereby authorized to procure all necessary work, furniture and supplies, to prepare new and suitable quarters for the City Court, and to incur all expense in the removal of that court, as well as in the removals and refurnishing of new quarters for other public offices, pursuant to the requirements of chapter 632 of the Laws of 1897, without advertising and public letting, as required by section 64 of the New York City Consolidated Act of 1882, but nothing herein contained to affect the present location and rooms of the First Judicial District Court.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, October 26, 1897. Approved by the Mayor, November 3, 1897.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to the Chesterfield Cigarette Company to parade through the street with an advertising wagon, the work to be done at their own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue for three months.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, October 26, 1897. Approved by the Mayor, November 3, 1897.

The usual summary for the quarter is annexed to the report. We have confirmed more proceedings during this quarter than ever before in the history of the Bureau. We have had appointed and organized during this quarter 78 new commissions, more than were appointed in any one year prior to 1896, and more than were pending in the Bureau at the commencement of your administration.

Of the proceedings confirmed during this quarter the awards aggregate nearly a million and a half dollars. Through cession and condemnation there has been acquired for street purposes more than 69,400 lineal feet of street, or more than 12 miles. There are now pending in the Bureau 230 proceedings in which Commissioners have been appointed. There were held nearly 1,600 meetings of commissions during the quarter, a large increase over any other quarter's work in the history of the Bureau.

Office of Attorney for Collection of Arrears of Personal Taxes. Report of the Bureau of the Attorney for the Collection of Arrears of Personal Taxes for the Quarter ending June 30, 1897, Pursuant to Section 216, Laws of 1882:

There have been begun since the 1st day of April, 1897, 100 special proceedings for the purpose of enforcing the payment of Personal Taxes in Arrears.

Of this number 43 have been dismissed, 2 have terminated in orders of commitment and still unpaid, and in 5 proceedings claims have been filed, 12 still pending, 31 paid, 2 wrong services, proceeding discontinued in 2 cases, 2 resulted in suit.

Since the abolishment of fine and proceeding by chapter 677, Laws of 1897, 25 claims have been filed with executors, administrators, receivers or assignees, of which two were paid. Twelve claims for arrears of personal taxes were paid on written notice to the delinquent taxpayers.

During this quarter this Bureau has collected the sum of \$14,575.97 for taxes and interest, and in addition thereto costs have been collected and paid to the City Chamberlain, in the sum of \$48.84, making a total aggregate collection for the present quarter of \$14,624.81.

The minutes of the meeting held August 25 were read and approved.

The engineer in charge of the work was present and stated that satisfactory progress was not being made in the work.

Mr. Buchanan, one of the contractors, was present and claimed that they had been unfortunate in regard to some of the work, and that they would finish the work in about one week.

The application was laid over, and the contractors were advised by the Mayor to prosecute the work with more vigor and finish the same without delay.

A communication was received from the Commissioner of Public Works, in relation to the payment for coal furnished to armories and chargeable to the appropriation "Supplies for Armories" for 1897, and offered the following :

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works be authorized to draw vouchers and requisitions on the Comptroller for coal supplied to armories for the current year, against the appropriation made to said Department for furnishing coal for public buildings and offices for the year 1897.
