You state that the question arose on the recommendation of one of the local boards of the

In reply, I desire to say that I can find no provision of the Greater New York Charter which requires the original petition submitted to a local board of improvements for its action to be transmitted to the Board of Public Improvements.

Section 304 of the Greater New York Charter requires the Secretary of the President of each borough to keep a record of all resolutions, proceedings and determinations of each local board and to file the same in the office of the President of the Borough.

Section 400 requires the President of a horough in which a petition for a local improvement within the jurisdiction of a local board of said borough has been received, to appoint a line for the meeting of such local board, at which such petition will be submitted by him, and to cause a notice to be published in the CITV RECORD that said petition has been presented to him and it on file in his office for inspection, and of the time when and the place where there will be a meeting of the Local Board, at which such petition will be submitted by him to said Board.

Section 402 requires the local board, in case it shall adopt a resolution recommending that proceedings he inhusted for a local improvements. Nowhere its it provided that the original petition shall be transmitted to the Board of Public Improvements, and I am therefore of the opinion that the original petition should remain on file with the Local Board of Emprovements.
