



Significant Events

January 13: Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro and Mayor Bill de Blasio announce 2015 was second lowest number of fire deaths in Department history.

February 4: FDNY celebrates Zadroga Act Renewal and Recognizes WTC Health Program Team. The WTC Health Program Provides medical monitoring and treatment for first responders, cleanup workers, and volunteers who helped in the aftermath of September 11^{th.}

March 14: FDNY launches @FDNYAlerts on Twitter to provide real time updates on active FDNY operations.

March 17: FDNY celebrates 20^{th} anniversary of the merger between the Department and the NYC Health and Hospitals Corporation's Emergency Medical Service .

April 4: FDNY marks 60th anniversary of the Third Avenue collapse in the Bronx which took the lives of six Firefighters in 1956. This fire was the greatest loss of Firefighters at a single incident in the Bronx in the Department's history.

April 14: FDNY releases Official 2017 Calendar of Heroes, for the first time featuring a calendar of all female FDNY members.

May 4: Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro presides over the graduation of 310 Probationary Firefighters. This graduating class was the second graduating probationary Firefighter class of 2016 and included four legacy graduates as well as three female Firefighters, bringing the total number of female Firefighters in the FDNY to 52, an all-time high. This graduating class also represents the growing diversity of the Department with 40 % of graduates identifying as people of color.

May 14: FDNY holds second annual Citywide Open House Event.

Significant Events

June 10: FDNY holds Vietnam War Commemoration at Fire Academy honoring more than 200 active and retired FDNY members who served in the United States Armed Forces during the Vietnam War era.

June 30: FDNY High School for Fire and Life Safety renamed to honor Captain Vernon A. Richard who was killed in the line of duty on September 11th, 2001.

July 27: FDNY breaks ground on new firehouse for Rescue Company 2.

September 7: The FDNY added the names of 17 FDNY members who died of illnesses related to their work in the rescue and recovery effort at the World Trade Center to the FDNY World Trade Center Memorial Wall.

September 11: FDNY holds memorial service at St. Patrick's Cathedral for the 15th anniversary of September 11th for the 343 members killed on September 11th and the 127 members who have died since then due to illnesses related to their rescue and recovery efforts at the World Trade Center.

September 29: Mayor Bill de Blasio and Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro posthumously promote Battalion Chief Michael J. Fahy to Deputy Chief. Chief Fahy of Battalion 19, a 17-year-veteran of the FDNY, died from injuries sustained at an explosion in the Kingsbridge section in the Bronx.

October 7: FDNY members are dispatched through New York Task Force One to the South to help during and after Hurricane Matthew.

October 12: Mayor Bill de Blasio and FDNY commemorate 109th annual FDNY Memorial day at the Firefighters Monument. Deputy Chief Michael J. Fahy; Battalion 19, EMS Lieutenant Joann Restko; EMS Station 7, EMS Captain Timothy Roberts; EMS Communications, EMT Ronald Schaal; EMS Bureau of Training, and Firefighter Jeffrey Wallen; Engine 4 were remembered at the ceremony.

October 17: FDNY honors 50th anniversary of 23rd Street Fire in Manhattan. The 23rd Street Fire was the deadliest day in the history of the FDNY prior to September 11, 2001. Twelve Firefighters made the Supreme Sacrifice.

October 28: Mayor Bill de Blasio and Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro visited Engine Company 53 and Ladder Company 43 in Harlem to recognize and thank FDNY Firefighters from multiple companies for their life-saving roof rope rescue at a six-alarm fire on East 93rd Street in Manhattan on October 27.

November 2: 295 Probationary Firefighters graduate at Christian Cultural Center in Brooklyn. 41 percent are people of color, five women in the class, bringing the total number of female Firefighters to 58 – the highest total in FDNY history.

November 21: Mayor Bill de Blasio and Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro announce new FDNY EEO Policy that reaffirms and strengthens FDNY's commitment to the principles of equal opportunity, diversity, and inclusion.

December 9: FDNY announces publication of 15 year study on the health effects of the World Trade Center attacks.

December 12: Fire Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro announces completion of \$47 million project to install separate women's bathrooms and lockers in Firehouses.
