## MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission of New York, Held Wednesday, November 3, 1915, at 10.30 o'clock A. M.

Present—Dr. Henry Moskowitz, President, and Commissioners Darwin R. James, Jr., and Alexander Keogh. The President presided.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by including in the Exempt Class the following: "Board of Child Welfare, Secretary to the Board."

William H. Matthews, Esq., President of the Board of Child Welfare, appeared in favor of the proposed amendment. There was no opposition and the Chair declared the hearing closed.

The Commission then went into regular session and the minutes of the meeting held October 20 were approved.

THIS CONTRACT, made and executed in duplicate, this day of 1911, by and between THE CITY OF NEW YORK (hereinafter called the City), party of the first part, by the Mayor of said City, acting for and in the name of said City, under and in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City (hereinafter called the Board) and the MANHATTAN AND QUEENS TRACTION CORPORATION (hereinafter called the Corporation), party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, By a contract dated October 29, 1912, the South Shore Traction Company (hereinafter called the Company) was granted the right to construct, maintain and operate a street surface railway from the Manhattan approach to the Queensboro Bridge, upon, along and over said Bridge and its approaches to the Borough of Queens, and upon and along Thomson Avenue, Hoffman Boulevard and other streets and avenues in the Borough of Queens, to the boundary line between the City of New York and the County of Nassau; and

SECTION 1. The parties hereto hereby consent, subject to the provisions and conditions hereinafter set forth, to certain modifications and amendments in and to said contract of October 29, 1912, as amended, said modifications and amendments to be as follows:

1. All of said Section 3, Seventh, of said contract of October 29, 1912, is hereby stricken out and the following substituted therefor:

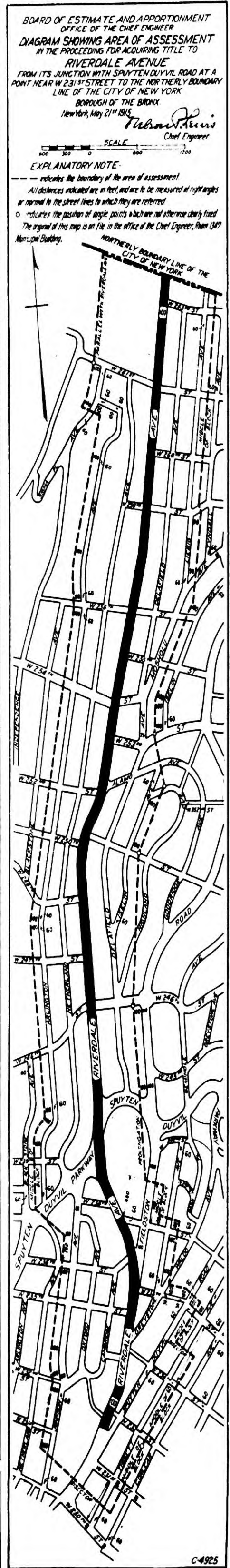
