Aetna Indemnity Company, surety, notified August 19, that unless the deliveries of supplies are completed at once the contractor will be declared in default and the material purchased at his expense, as provided for in the contract.

12th. Reporting that the bond furnished by the Uvalde Asphalt Paving Company, for the maintenance of the pavement laid under Treasurer's Order No. 20083 in front of Pier, new 14, North river, expired August 12, 1904, and that the bond furnished by said company for the maintenance of the pavement laid under Treasurer's Order No. 20009 between Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth streets, North river, expired July 19, 1904, and that the pavement at both locations is now in a satisfactory condition. Bonds released August 19, 1904.

13th. Reporting completion of the extension to the outer end of the West Seventy-ninth Street Pier. New York Contracting and Trucking Company, lessee of the inner end of the pier, requested August 23 to advise this Department whether they would consent to the widening of the inshore end of the pier to the width of the outshore end and accept a lease of the entire southerly half of the extended pier in lieu of the existing lease of the old pier.

From the Auditor—

Reporting that McTeague & Egan, pursuant to the authority granted them April 19, 1901, have placed filling in the rear of the bulkhead between One Hundred and Twenty-ninth and One Hundred and Thirty-first streets, North river, and have paid sums aggregating \$2,500, in accordance with the agreement filed by them, but that the actual amount of filling required is about 15,000 cubic yards less than the original estimate, and that therefore the partial payments have not aggregated the sum of \$4,800, the amount originally agreed upon, and recommending that the agreement be amended by fixing the rate at 10 cents per cubic yard for the 33,153 cubic yards now estimated to be required to complete the street area between One Hundred and Twenty-ninth and One Hundred and Thirty-first streets, North river. Referred to Corporation Counsel August 20, for an opinion as to the authority of the Department to change the rate provided for in the original agreement.

The following orders were issued to the Engineer-in-Chief, in accordance with his recommendations, except where otherwise noted:

August 19. To dredge to a depth of 15 feet at mean low-water under Contract No. 786, in front of bulkhead for a distance of 100 feet immediately south of the West Thirty-fourth Street Pier, North river.

August 19. To dredge to a depth of 20 feet at mean low-water under Contract No. 786, on the northerly side of the Pier foot of Canal street, North river.

August 19. To dredge under Contract No. 786, in the half slips adjoining the Pier foot of West Fifty-fifth street, North river.

August 19. To dredge under Contract No. 786, under and in front of the dumping boards maintained by the Department of Street Cleaning, on the Pier foot of West Forty-seventh street, North river, as requested by said Department.

August 23. To make general repairs to the piers and bulkheads owned by the City north of West Forty-fourth street on the North river, from time to time, as may be required, at a cost not to exceed \$950 in the aggregate.

To repair from time to time as may be required, the Pier at the foot of West Fifty-second street, North river, at a cost not to exceed \$975 in the aggregate.

No. 2596. Repairs to dock near the foot of Jersey street, New Brighton, Borough of Richmond, by John J. Wood.

No. 2594. Erection of shelter over carousel at Dreamland Park, Coney Island, Borough of Brooklyn, by the Dreamland Company.

No. 2575. Repairs to Pier, new 34, East river, by the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company.

No. 2618. Placing of boat-house near the southerly line of Fifty-fifth street, East river, by the Allen Point Boat Club.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.
