

#### BOARD OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

The Board of Public Improvements of The City of New York met at the office of the Board, No. 21 Park tow, on Wednesday, June 6, 1900, at 2 o'clock P. M., pursuant to notice.

The roll was called, and the following members were present and answered to their names:

The Cov. croller (Dupaty Comptroller Levey), the Commissioner of Water Supply, the Commissioner of Public Buildings, Lighting and pplies, the Commissioner of Bridges, the President of the Borough of Mankattan, the President of the Borough of The Bronx, the President of the Borough of Brooklyn, the President of the Borough of Commissioner of the Borough of Richmond.

The President, Hou. Maurice F. Holshan, presided.

The minutes of the meetings of May 23 and May 29, 1900, were approved as printed.

GRADE CROSSING, GRANTE STREET, BETWEEN BUSINGER AND EVERGREEN AVENUES, BROOKLYN:

The following communication from the Commissioner of Highways was read :

DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS, June 1, 1900,

Dear Sin—On May 2, 1920, I wrote to the Corporation Connect to follows:

"An ordinance his been passed by the Municipal Assembly, and was approved by his Honor the Mayor on December 4, 1800, for regulating, grading and paving with grants blocks Granite street, from Bushwick arenus to Evergreen avenue, Barough of Brooklyn, the improvement to be prid for by assessment.

"The Engineer of this Department, judging from the fact that the street was in use, had supposed that it would be possible to carry out the improvement between the points named. He now finds, however, when the plan of the improvement is prepared, that the tracks of the Manhatian Brach branch of the Long Island Raifmad cut off one end of the street, and that it will be impossible to reach Evergreen avenue. Teams now turn of parallel with the tracks and pass along the foot of the raifmad scalandment to Evergreen avenue. The tracks themselves vary from three to four fern above the legal grade of the street, and it is anticipated that the raifmed company will object to the establishment of a grade crossing on the street, on the ground that it would be in violation of the anti-grade crossing law.

"Granite street has never been opened by regular proceedings. It was thought, however, that inasmoch as it had been built up for some years, and as the greater part of the street had been used for five years, there would be no obstacle in the way of the improvement. Finding, however, that the roadway is obstructed by the tracks, and that along fifty first of the end of the street narress Evergreen avenue has not been used as a reachway for five years, it is decemed advisable to ask your seivles as in whether or not, useder existing conditions, the improvement can be made without levallidating the assessment therefor."

Ou May to the Corporation Counsel advised me that as the Manhatian Beach branch of the Long Island Raifread owns a fee of a portion of the land contained within the lines of Gran

I transmitted a ropy of the Corporation Counsel's upinion to the Deputy Commissioner of Highways, Burough in Hunsklyn, who reports to me under date of May 31 that in connection with the proposed improvement of Grantic street, between Boshwick arenue and Evergreen avenue, it will be necessary to establish a mitroid crowing at grade, and that the consent of the Board of State Railroad Commissioners will have to be obtained before the street can be opened across the Manhattan Beach Railroad. He also states that the matter of the necessity of legally opening Grantic street has been referred to the President of the Borough of Brooklyn, with the request that he submit it to the Local Board of the district for action.

With reference to the necessity of establishing a grade crossing, I would say that according to an opinion transfered by the Corporation Counsel, it devolves upon the Board of Public Improvements to give the railroad company fifteen days, sotice of an opportunity to be heard on the subject, and that aller such theiring a resolution should be passed by the Board of Public Improvements, including their determination in the matter, which resolution should be made to the Railroad Commissioners, in accordance with section or of the Railroad Law.

In that felter, a copy of which I enclose, I requested you to advise ree as to the outbority to make such acquisition under that section of the Charter; and it such actionity exists, I asked for your instructions as to the method of precedure to be taken by this Department and cognate branches of the manifest government to carry the acquisitions into effect, and as to what must be shown in respect to machinery, distributing mains and appuritemances of the several companies, on the maps which are required to be prepared aed field ender sections 486, 488 and 489 of the City Charter.

In view of the fact that the contract made in 1894 by the foremer City of Brocklyn with the Flationsh Water Works Company expires on December 31, 1900, and it must be determined whether that contract about he extended or a new contract made, or whether the City should acquire the property of the company, I would be pleased to have your views on these questions at your earliest convenience.

Dank Six—By the provisions of the act under which the Town of Flatbush became annexed to
the City of Brooklyn, and under paragraph 4 of the contract between the Flatbush Water Works
Company and the Lity of Brooklyn, dated June 2, 1556, the right is specifically conferred on the
City to acquire the franchises and property of the company by reademnatum proceedings at any
time. The rootract referred to expires on December 31, 1920, and the present City administranon must, without further delay, decide whether a new tootract is to be made with the company
or whether the company's franchises and property are to be acquired, as provided by law and in
the present matrices. Preference for acquisition of the company's property has been manifested
from many quarters. The first step towards the acquisition of the property will be the authorization of a total issue to provide the moneys to pay for the same, as any proceeding to acquire it by
condemnation, even in its initiatory steps, would tend to create a liability which the City must
meet.

I do not attempt to this communication to present a definite estimate of the property to the City, as I take the view that it might operate adversely to the City's interests to present a definite estimate in advance of proceedings by condemnation and appraisement of the property by Commissioners

of Appraisal, or in advance of any possible negotiations to acquire the property by agreement, without condemnation proceedings, if authority for its acquisition in that manner should be granted.

There can be no objection, however, to the authorization by your Board of the bond issue to a certain amount, as a preliminary to the acquisition of the property by either one of the other of the two methods, such bond issue to be made only as occasion requires.

I therefore respectfully sak that your Board authorize the issue of bonds of the Corporate Stock of The City of New York to the amount of \$750,000, the proceeds thereof to be applied, as may become necessary, to the acquisition of the property and rights of the Flathush Water Works Company.

In connection with the foregoing I enclose, herewish, copies of my letters of November 1, 1899, and March 6th, ultimo, to the Corporation Counsel, asking his advice and instructions on the questions of authority for and method of procedure to acquire the property of the Flathush Waser Works Company and other private water companies, to which letters I am still awaiting reply.

Data Sin—On May 17, the Secretary of the Board transmitted to this Department for investigation and report a resolution adopted by the Manicipal Assembly, recommending that River street, south of Grand street, Borough of Brooklyn, be repayed with grante block pavement, that the curlistones he reset and crosswalks laid.

I have investigated this matter and find that it would cost \$1,700 for a granite block pavement on concrete foundation on that part of River street, including the necessary curbing and granite bridging.

On the part of River street south of First street the American Sugar Refining Company have erected a two-story frame building, and it seems that the question of the right of said company to maintain its building on the street should be determined before authorizing the repaying of the street.

On June 30, 1899, I addressed to the Corporation Counsel the following communication on the subject, and have not yet received a reply thereto:

"A complaint has been made to his Flonor the Mayor that the American Sugar Refining Company have creeked a building on, and have taken possession of, without legal right, that part Water threet, south of South First street, in the Borough of Brooklyn.

"An investigation shows that that part of Water street, now known as River street, between South First street and Kent avenue, has been appropriated by the erection of a two-story frame-building helonging to the American Sugar Refining Company. There is no data to show when the building was erected or that passession of the street was taken by them in a legal or formal way.

"The records of this Department in the Berough of Brooklyn show that this street appears on the Williamsburg Village Map as a 'two-rod coad.' Other maps refer to it as a 'two-rod road' in me. The name of Water street, between South First and North Third streets was changed to River street on November 29, 1859. The opening of the street between Grand street and North Third street was confirmed in 1250. On the opening map the part immediately south of Grand street is shown as a 'two-rod road.' There is a memorandum in pencil on the Assessor's map which reads: 'New map; street taken,' but we have not been able to ascertain just what is meant by these words.

"There is no evidence in this Department, however, that the American Sagar Refining Company has any legal right to so appropriate or occupy the street, and it seems to me that in the event of their failure to show by what right such a building was placed on the atreet the same about the ordered removed.
