**Bureau of Public Buildings and Offices.**

Carpenter work was done at Borough Hall, L. I. City; Bureau of Highways Sewers and Street Cleaning, College Point Topographical Bureau, County Clerk's Office, Jamaica, and County Court House, L. I. City.

Steamfitting work was done at County Court House, L. I. City; Borough Hall, L. I. City; Eighth Street Bath, Newtown Town Hall, Jamaica Town Hall, Far Rockaway and Flushing Town Hall.

Plumbing work was done at Borough Hall, L. I. City; Street Cleaning Department, Magistrates' Court, 5th St., L. I. City; Eighth St. Bath, L. I. City; Queens County Court House, Newtown Town Hall, Flushing, Jamaica; Comfort Station, Jamaica; County Clerk's Building, Jamaica, and Magistrates' Court, Far Rockaway.

Electrical work was done at Borough Hall, Post Office, Long Island City; Queens County Court House, Bureau of Weights and Measures, Interior Bath, Town Hall, Newtown, Flushing, Jamaica, and County Clerk's Office.

*Tinsmithing*—Sheet metal work was done at Borough Hall, Queens County Court House, Town Hall, Jamaica, Corporation Yard, L. I. City, College Point; Town Hall, Flushing, and Administration Building, L. I. City.

Painting was done at Queens County Court House, Borough Hall, St. Mary's Lyceum Building, Magistrate Court, Interior Bath, Eighth Street; Town Hall, Newtown, Jamaica, Flushing and County Clerk's Building, Jamaica.

Office furniture, linoleum and rugs have been installed as required, and all office supplies furnished. The janitors of the various buildings have been regularly supplied with all necessary cleaning implements and material for cleaning the building.

**Topographical Bureau.**

The work of the Bureau falls naturally into two divisions: First, "To prepare a map of that part of the territory embraced within the Borough, of which a map or plan has not heretofore been finally established and adopted," and second, to make the surveys and maps required by Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment.

For the better prosecution of this work the force of this office is similarly divided into two divisions—one division charged with the preparation of the final map of the Borough, the other division charged with all work incidental to Street Opening Proceedings.

The division charged with the preparation of the final map of the Borough is divided into three corps:

**Monumenting Corps:** Charged with all the surveys and field work incidental to the preparation of the final map and the monumenting of the Borough.

**Computing Corps:** Charged with all the computations incidental to the preparation of the final map of the Borough.

**Draughting Corps:** Charged with all draughting work required to prepare the final maps.

The division charged with the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment is subdivided into two corps.

**Surveying Corps:** Charged with all the field work necessary to the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners.

**Office Corps:** Charged with all the computations and draughting necessary for the preparation of the maps required by the Commissioners.

In addition to the several corps mentioned above a small corps is engaged in gathering data and making reports concerning the legal status of the various streets in the Borough.

#### Bureau of Substructures and Franchises.

On January 1, 1914, the Division of Substructures became a Bureau, under the title of "Bureau of Substructures and Franchises."

A system of graphical indexing has been installed of all maps showing sub-surface information received from the various Public Service Corporations and City Departments. A bound atlas of the Borough has been prepared, and as each map is received its area is plotted graphically, and is given a consecutive number, with a letter indicating what information the map conveys. A system of colors is used, so that when two or more maps occupy the same territory they are easily distinguished by contrasting colors. In this way complete information as to the maps on file in any given section are at once located. These maps bear the number corresponding to the index, and are labelled and filed vertically in steel cases.

A Graphical Index Map has been prepared showing the extent and nature of franchises held by the various Public Service Corporations.

The method of representing the details of sub-surface installations on our Record Maps as to colors and symbols, etc., has been standardized with those of the other Divisions of Substructures of the City, thereby making the maps easily understood.

A system has been instituted whereby Public Service Corporations making application for permits are required to submit a plan showing the location of the proposed installation or repairs for which they apply for a permit. All applications are to be approved by this Bureau before the permit is issued thereby, establishing locations that are likely to be permanent and preventing wasteful utilization of subsurface space, which is rapidly becoming one of the City's most valuable assets. The regulating of locations will result in a material saving to corporations and the City, and will tend to reduce pavement mutilation to a minimum.

Printed forms have been made for the use of the Bureau of Sewers in obtaining sub-surface data encountered in their work. This information will be of great value, inasmuch as the sewers are laid to the greatest depth of all the substructures occupying the streets.

An Index Map of Long Island City has been compiled showing just what streets have been graded and paved. This information is of great importance to this Bureau, as the depths of all substructures are referred to the street surface, so that if location has been made on streets which were not graded at that time, it is an easy matter to consult this index, which is kept constantly up to date, and make whatever corrections are necessary on the Record Maps.

A set of the mounted Final Section Maps of the Borough have been obtained, and work of designing the Record Map layout of the entire Borough is now in progress. Each of the Final Section areas will contain 40 Record Maps 500 feet by 800 feet in size, and the Record Maps will be indexed according to the final section numbers.

A Graphical Final Section Map index has been prepared, showing the location of each final section that has been completed, and those that are proposed, thereby giving a very simple method of the location of any Record Map in the entire Borough.

Owing to the fact that many of the streets are not laid to grade or that the street lines are subject to change, it requires great precaution for one man in the field to obtain test-pit locations that will be of value after the streets have been graded, or the lines changed in later years; but the system now in use by this Bureau will safeguard against any possible loss of information due to subsequent changes.

The office force has been engaged in laying out new Record Maps, computing co-ordinates for use in plotting and revising maps, due to changes and additional installations.

Prints were prepared for use in obtaining company information and City department data in Long Island City. This information is compared with the work as located in the field, and is used to supply omissions due to lack of field data. In many cases this information is incomplete and inaccurate, but our persistent efforts in pointing out to the various Public Service Corporations the importance and necessity of this data, has been productive of better results.

General Maps have been received from some of the corporations showing their system of substructures. This information is necessary when applying for detail company data.

The ten Record Maps have been revised as to corrections and additional installations, and now show all sub-surface conditions, except some old water and gas mains of which no accurate records as to location exist.

All field notes have been indexed, and all installations located by street openings are plotted on the color progress map.

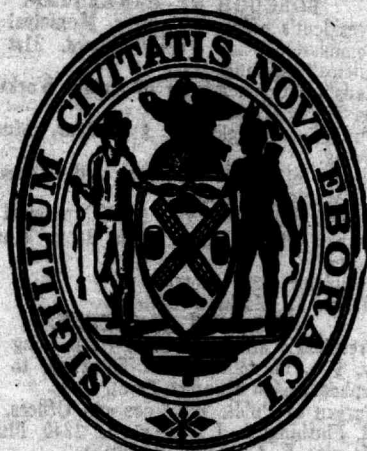
#### FIELD WORK.

All openings in the streets of Long Island City and some parts of the Second Ward have been visited and locations taken wherever possible. Owing to the small force in the field, this most important work is not carried out in the other parts of the Borough.

Survey lines embracing 16 Record Maps have been run out and established. These lines form a basis for all location.

Complete surface and sub-surface locations have been made and completed for six Record Maps. Each feature showing on the surface was located, and all water gates, sewer manholes, telephone and power boxes were opened up and measured in detail. In some instances it was difficult to trace out the location of some of the substructures, particularly the sewers, inasmuch as some of the manholes were paved over. These manholes were finally located by sounding and were then opened up and measured in detail. Telephone, power and water boxes needed cleaning in some instances, and the co-operation of the companies and the City departments has been excellent.
