The Committee on Finance of the Board of Aldermen, to whom was referred the assessment rolls of the estates, real and personal, of The City of New York for the year 1909, together with a communication from the Comptroller of The City of New York, dated June 7, 1909, transmitting the Budget in detail for the year 1909, accompanied by his certificates of: First, the aggregate amount of the Budget for the year 1909, second, additional appropriation to the Department of Health for the year 1909, under and pursuant to the provisions of section 236 of the Greater New York Charter as amended; third, amount of County charges and expenses for the respective counties included in the Budget for the year 1909; fourth, amount of County charges and expenses for the respective manties paid during the year 1908, from the proceeds of Special Revence Bonds; fifth estimated revenues of the General Faud for the reduction of taxation during the current year, respectfully submits the following

REPORT

The aggregate amount of the Budget for the year 1909 is one hundred and fifty-six million five hundred and furty-five thousand one hundred and forty-eight dollars and fourtoen cents (\$150.545,14814), which includes county charges and expenses for the finer counties of New York, Kings, Oncers and Richmond, aggregating five million one hundred and soventy-five thousand seven hundred and ninety-six dollars and twenty-three cents (\$5,175,790.21), leaving one hundred and fifty-one million three hundred and sixty-one rillion three hundred and sixty-one dollars and ninety-one cents (\$151,300,351.91), in which should be added an additional appropriation to the Department of Breath for the year 1909, under and pursuant to the provisions of metion 230 of the Greater New York Charter as amended, of seven thousand six hundred dollars (\$7,000), making a total amount of one hundred and fifty-one million three hundred and seventy six thousand nine hundred and fifty-one dollars and musty one cents (\$151,300,951.91), which affects the general tax rates of The City of New York. The aggregate amount of the Budget for the year 1909 is one hundred and fifty-

In addition to the amount of five million one hundred and secenty five thousand seven hundred and ninety-six dollars and twenty-three cents (\$5,175,796,23) included in the Budget for county charges and expenses, the following amounts disbursed during the seat 1948 from the proceeds of Special Revenue Bonds for judgments and claims for county charges or liabilities, are to be raised by tax in the year 1949, in the respective counties as provided by subdivisions 3 and 7 of section 188 of the revised Greater New York Charter, viz.

Section 902 of the Charter, referred in in the Comparaller's communication, directs that the amounts reputred for the payment of all county charges and expenses shall be levied and reflected from the trapble property within each of said counties respectively, to the end that each of said counties whall altimately bear and pay all expenses necessary to be incurred for county as distinguished from City purposes. Compliance with the program of law will, of course, forever prevent a uniform tax rate from prevailing in The City of New York.

Your committee recommends that in fixing the actual tax rates in the tax levy ordinance the decimal fractions of such rates be not carried beyond five figures, i. e., bundred thousandths of one per cost, as any smaller fraction would have no practical effect on individual assessments, while increasing continuity and unnecessarily the difficulties of extending the tax rolls and preparing tax bills. The total loss by omission of such remote decimals will be only \$2.24.30 in the whole tax levy of \$122,745,210.17.

As there is nothing to be gained by separate extensions on the tax rolls of the City and County rates, your Committee recommends that the aggregate thereof, or, in other words, the total tax rates in each Borough, as the case may be, he fixed in the ordinance levying the taxes for the year 1909. Such an ordinance has been prepared and is submitted herewith for approval and adoption by the Board of Aldermen.

All institutions receiving public manages and all their books of record and accounts shall at all reasonable times be open to the visitation, inspection and examination of duly authorized representatives of the Department of Finance and at all proper times the Department of Public Charities shall have access to the record of immates.

4. Upon its appearing to the satisfaction of the Comptroller that it would be to the public interest to withhold payments to any charitable institution for which an apportionment has been made, he shall in his discretion suspend payments and give written notice to such institution of his intention to apply to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for authority to cease making further payments, and upon the determination of said Board that such payments for services rendered thereafter shall thereupon end.

5. Except where appropriations are made in bulk and not upon the per capita basis, no payment shall be made for invates of private charitable institutions unless the same shall have been accepted by the Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities as proper charges upon the City. Except in emergency cases in hospitals, the Commissioner of Charities shall not accept as proper charges against the City immates capable of paying for their own support or for whose care adequate provision can be made in public hospitals. The City shall not be liable for any payment to charitable institutions in excess of the apportionment which may have been made to such institutions, notwithstanding only per capita rates of payment that may have been fixed for the immates thereof.

6. All institutions receiving money from the City Treasity, in their printed annual reports.

7. No money shall be paid to any private charitable institution which pays any salary to or gives any consideration, financial or of any kind for services to, or that has an
