When the town of Flathush built their sewer system in 1801 they also built this wooden trunk sewer at the foot of Flathush avenue to carry the sewage into Mill Creek. By the action of the tides, worms, etc., a partion of this wooden outlet sewer has given away and should be repaired. It is proposed to repair the bottom of the wooden trunk sewer, fill in under the portion that does not rest on the meadow, and cover the entire sewer to a depth of three feet above the top, so as to protect the wood from the action of the tides, etc.

In my opinion this work is very urgent, for at a point about 500 feet from the brick sewer the wooden trunk sewer is so badly broken that the entire sewage is discharged at this point on the meadow and the outer 700 feet is dry and carries no sewage.

In the Honorable the Board of Estimate and Apportionment:

Generally in the present year I invest with the appropriation for Repairs for the Department of Public Charities in the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx would run far short of the actual necessities of the Department. Therefore, in order to meet the demands of the situation, I practiced the most stringent economy throughout the Department in the hope that I might somewhere save access enough to meet an energency that appeared to be inevitable. I found the solution of the problem in the salars appropriation. At the end of the year 1898 I shall have an unexpended balance of \$40,000 in my salary acrount. I would respectfully ask you to transfer the sum of \$40,000 from the Solary Appropriation for the Department of Public Charities for the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx for the year 1898, to the appropriation for Alterations and Repairs for the same year. I am in most argent need of this money for repairs. Hellevue Hospital is lesking so leadly that unless the roof is repaired at once there can be neither constor our safety to the patients. The roads in Bellevue Hospital grounds have been neglected for an unany years that they are now verifiable much-holes, and not only a disgrace to the city, but a menace to the health of all the people living in the fieldevue grounds. The plumbing in the doctors' quarters in Bellevue is so had that it must be remedical at once or aliandoned. The strambout "Fidelity" must be repaired or laid up. The cow stable that the forecer administration built on Randall's Island at an expense of several thousand dollars to the Department has no purper drainings and no connection with the sever, and cannot be used until them defects are recorded, I have already placed in the Intants' Hospital on Randall's Island account of the Intants, but the

In order to make more resumfor the Drug Department I want to move the stables and carriage-house from their present quarters into the old Morgue, which is an excellent haliding, but needs a new immediation and alteration to life for use as a stable and carriage-house. This will leave me simple mean for the Drug Department by giving over the old stable to this use, and will leave the old carriage-house for alteration into a splendle clothes-room, in need of which licitevies now stands.
