MAYOR'S COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICE TRAINING.

CITY EMPLOYEES—COURSES OF STUDY FOR ADVANCEMENT IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

With the advice of the Mayor's Committee on Public Service training, the College of the City of New York offers numerous courses of instruction designed to improve the efficiency of persons in the city service and to prepare them for advancement to

The courses of study were formulated by the Civil Service Commission for the purpose of indicating standard courses for the grades to which they refer. Persons pursuing the work successfully may receive credit in the promotion examinations and, in some cases, in experience ratings. The Commission will take up each case and credit the courses pursued in a manner equitable to all applicants.

Courses will be offered in English and arithmetic for persons in the lower clerical and stenographic services. More advanced English and arithmetic will be given for W. 125th st., Driver; Streicher, Herbert E., 1886 McGraw ave., Jeweler; Kinnelly,

those in the higher grades, and also courses in typewriting, stenography, stenotypy. For engineers there will be most complete courses from elementary algebra and geometry through the various branches of higher mathematics, fundamental courses in physics, chemistry, English and drafting; structural work in materials of construction, elasticity and resistance of materials, stresses, steel design and construction; hydraulics, water supply and sewage engineering; masonry and reinforced concrete design and construction; elementary and advanced surveying, streets and pavements; timber study and geology for engineers, and allied courses in science.

A diploma of Junior Engineer (Civil) will be given to persons completing a group of those engineering subjects as a standard preparation for the position of Junior Engineer.

Courses will be offered for accountants in the theory, practice and problems of accountancy, cost accounting, municipal accounting, judicial accounting, public utilities accounting, advanced problems, etc. Upon the completion of a group of these subjects the certificate of Junior Accountant will be awarded. For a longer course of study the diploma of graduate in accountancy is given. This course of study fully prepares the student to meet the C. P. A. requirements and it is an educational preparation for the highest accounting positions in the Civil Service.

The teachers engaged are men of high standing in the accounting and engineering fields and also teachers and municipal experts of established reputation. Some of the courses are free, some require the payment of a nominal registration fee, while the most advanced courses are given upon payment of a small tuition fee, sufficient to meet running expenses. THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale.
