EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 8 March 14, 1974

REGULATIONS GOVERNING CASH RAYMENTS FOR UNUSED ACCRUED ANNUAL LEAVE AND UNUSED ACCRUED COMPENSATORY TIME ON DEATH OF CERTAIN UNIFORMED FORCES EMPLOYES WHILE IN THE CITY'S EMPLOY.

Whereas, Contracts for the period January 1, 1971 to June 30, 1973 between The City of New York and the respective exclusive bargaining representatives of employees in the classes of positions listed below, including details that are part of the respective bargaining units, provided, effective January 1, 1971 that certain cash payments for unused accrued annual leave and unused accrued compensatory time shall be made if such an employee dies while employed by the City: while employed by the City:

Fireman Fire Marshal (Uniformed) Deputy Chief Medical Officer

**Battalion Chief** Captain Lieutenant Supervising Fire Marshal (Uniformed)

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of The City of New York, it is hereby ordered that the following Regulations Governing Cash Payments for Unused Accrued Annual Leave, and Unused Accrued Compensatory Time on Death of such an Employee while in the City's employ be and the same are hereby established:

Section 1. Effective January I, 1971, in the case of an incumbent of position in a Fire Officer class of positions listed above, the beneficiary designated under the Retirement System or, if no beneficiary is so designated, the estate of the deceased, and in the case of an incumbent of a position of Fireman or Fire Marshal (Uniformed) the estate of the deceased shall receive payment in cash for the following as a death benefit:

a. All unused accrued leave up to a maximum of 54 days credit.

b. All unused accrued compensatory time earned subsequent to March 15, 1968 which is verifiable by official Department records up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.

(200) hours.

\$2. Payments in accordance with Section 1 shall be based on the annual regular salary rate of the employee at the time of death. The hourly rate of pay for compensatory time shall be determined by the fractional part of such salary rate as follows:

Predicated on a basic work week of 40 hours:

This Order shall take effect immediately.
