NYCxReuse is organized by the NYC Department of Sanitation's donateNYC program.

donateNYC is a program of the New York City Department of Sanitation that helps New Yorkers give and get second-hand items. Our biannual NYCxReuse programming highlights the many ways in which the City is shaped by materials reuse and promotes the donateNYC network of nonprofit Partners.

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow

and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
