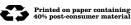



Proposed authorizing resolution submitted by the Mayor pursuant to Section 363 of the Charter for the granting of franchises for installation of telecommunications equipment and facilities on, over and under the inalienable property of the City in connection with the provision of mobile telecommunications services.

By Council Member Comrie (by request of the Mayor)

WHEREAS, by Executive Order 25, dated August 23, 1995, the Mayor has designated the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications as the responsible agency for the granting of telecommunications franchises;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 363 of the Charter ("the Charter") of the City of New York ("the City"), the Commissioner of the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications has made the initial determination of the need for franchises for installation of telecommunications equipment and facilities on, over and under the inalienable property of the City in connection with the provision of mobile telecommunications services, and has prepared a proposed authorizing resolution for the granting of such franchises: and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has submitted to the Council a proposed authorizing resolution for the granting of such franchises pursuant to Section 363 of the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is appropriate to authorize the granting of such franchises as described hereinafter;

The Council hereby resolves that:

- A. The Council authorizes the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications to grant non-exclusive franchises for the installation of telecommunications equipment and facilities on, over and under the inalienable property of the City to be used in providing mobile telecommunications services in the City of New York.
- B. For purposes of this resolution, "inalienable property of the City" shall mean the property designated as inalienable in Section 383 of the Charter.

- C. For purposes of this resolution, "mobile telecommunications services" shall mean any "mobile service", as defined in Section 153 of Title 47 of the United States Code, and other voice and/or data communications or information services employing electromagnetic waves propagated through space to serve portable sending and/or receiving equipment.
- D. The public services to be provided under such franchises shall be mobile telecommunications services.
- E. The authorization to grant franchises pursuant to this resolution shall expire on the fifth anniversary of the date on which this resolution is adopted by the Council (the "Expiration Date"). No franchises shall be approved pursuant to this resolution by the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications, the Franchise and Concession Review Committee, or the Mayor pursuant to this resolution after the Expiration Date.
- F. Prior to the grant of any such franchise, a Request For Proposals ("RFP") or other solicitation shall be issued by the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications. Prior to issuing any such RFP or other solicitation, all necessary environmental and land use review shall be conducted in accordance with City Environmental Quality Review ("CEQR") and Section 197-c of the Charter. The criteria to be used by the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications to evaluate responses to such RFPs or other solicitations shall include, but not be limited to, the following to the extent permitted by law:
- (1) the adequacy of the proposed compensation (which may include monetary and/or in-kind compensation, as provided in the applicable RFP or other solicitation) to be paid to the City for the use of City property;
- (2) the ability of the respondent(s) to maintain the property of the City in good condition throughout the term of the franchise:
- (3) the consistency of the response(s) to the City's management of local rights-of-way activities, plans and goals.

In no event, however, shall the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications include any criteria in any such RFP or other solicitation which the City would be preempted, pursuant to federal law, from thus including; and in no event shall the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications apply any criteria to be included in any such RFP or other solicitation in a manner which the City would be preempted, pursuant to federal law, from thus applying.

- G. Any franchise granted pursuant to this authorizing resolution shall be by written agreement which shall include, but not be limited to, the following terms and conditions to the extent permitted by law (provided, however, that no term or condition, whether or not listed hereafter, shall be included in a written franchise agreement if the City is preempted, by federal law, from including such a term or condition in such agreement, and provided that no term or condition, whether or not listed hereafter, shall be included in a written franchise agreement in a form or manner which the City is preempted by federal law from using with respect to such agreement):
- (1) the term of the franchise, including options to renew if any, shall not exceed fifteen (15) years;
- (2) the compensation to be paid to the City shall be adequate and may include monetary or in-kind compensation
- (3) the franchise may be terminated or cancelled in the event of the franchisee's failure to comply with the material terms and conditions of the agreement;
- (4) a security fund shall be established to ensure the performance of the franchisee's obligations under the agreement;
- (5) the City shall have the right to inspect the facilities of the franchisee located on the inalienable property of the City and to order the relocation of such facilities as appropriate at the direction of the applicable agency;
- (6) there shall be adequate insurance and indemnification requirements to protect the interests of the public and the City;
- (7) there shall be provisions to ensure access by the City to books and records of the franchisee as necessary or appropriate to review and/or enforce compliance with the franchise agreement;
- (8) there shall be provisions to ensure quality workmanship and construction methods in the use of the inalienable property;
- (9) there shall be provisions containing the agreements required pursuant to paragraph 6 of subdivision (h) of Section 363 of the Charter relating to collective bargaining and other matters;
- (10) there shall be provisions requiring the franchisee to comply with City laws, regulations and policies related to, but not limited to, employment, purchasing and investigations:
- (11) there shall be provisions to restrict the assignment or other transfer of the franchise without the prior written consent of the City and provisions to restrict changes in control of the franchisee without the prior written consent of the City;
- (12) there shall be remedies to protect the City's interest in the event of the franchisee's failure to comply with the

terms and conditions of the agreement;

- (13) all franchisees shall be subject to review under the City's Vendor Information Exchange System ("VENDEX");
- (14) franchisees shall be required to hold any applicable licenses and permits required by the New York State Public Service Commission and the Federal Communications Commission:
- there shall be provisions preserving the right of the City to perform public works or public improvements in and around those areas subject to the franchise;
- (16) there shall be provisions requiring the franchisee to protect the property of the City, and the delivery of public services that utilize the property of the City, from damage or interruption of operation resulting from the construction, operation, maintenance, repair or removal of facilities, equipment or other improvements related to the franchise;
- there shall be provisions designed to minimize the extent to which the public use of the streets of the City are disrupted in connection with the construction of improvements relating to the franchise.
- The Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications shall file with the Council the following documents:
- within fifteen (15) days of issuance, a copy of each RFP or other solicitation issued pursuant to this resolution;
- within fifteen (15) days of approval by the Mayor, a copy of the agreement for each franchise granted pursuant to this resolution; and
- on or before July 1 of each year, a report detailing the revenues received by the City during the preceding calendar year from each franchise granted pursuant to this resolution.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE PENN CENTER SUBDISTRICT

8151

General Provisions

In order to establish the Penn Center Subdistrict as a destination and enhance its retail, entertainment and commercial character and expand accessibility to its transportation network, special regulations are set forth governing the location and type of #signs#, urban design and streetscape relationships, and the improvement of pedestrian circulation to and from public transit facilities.

The regulations of Section 81-50 are applicable only in the Penn Center Subdistrict, the boundaries of which are shown on Map 1 (Special Midtown District and Subdistricts) in Appendix A of this Chapter, except as set forth for rail mass transit improvements pursuant to Section 81-541. These regulations supplement or modify the provisions of this Chapter applying generally to the #Special Midtown District#, of which this Subdistrict is a part.

* * * 81-541

Rail mass transit facility improvement

In addition to the provisions of Section 81-29 (Incentives by Special Permit for Provisions of Public Amenities), the City Planning Commission may grant #floor area# bonuses for subway station and/or rail mass transit facility improvements for non-#residential# or #mixed buildings#, in accordance with Section 74-634 (Subway station improvements in commercial zones of 10 FAR and above in Manhattan), and may modify or waive the provisions of Section 81-43 (Street Wall Continuity Along Designated Streets) in accordance with the provisions of Section 74-634, provided that such improvement is approved by the entities which own and/or operate the rail mass transit facility. Prior to granting a special permit, the City Planning Commission shall be provided with:

- a letter from each entity that operates the rail mass (a) transit facility confirming that the drawings of the subway and/or rail mass transit improvement are of sufficient scope and detail to describe the layout and character of the improvements and that the proposed implementation of the improvements is physically and operationally feasible, and
- <u>(b)</u> a legally enforceable instrument containing:
 - <u>(1)</u> drawings of the improvements, as approved by the transit operator;
 - <u>(2)</u> provisions that all easements required for the on-site improvements will be conveyed and recorded against the
 - <u>(3)</u> the obligations of the applicant to construct, maintain and provide capital maintenance for the improvements and
 - <u>(4)</u> a schedule for completion of the improvements and a requirement that a performance bond or other appropriate security be provided to insure the completion of the improvements.

For the purposes of this Section, improvements to any rail mass transit facility on a #zoning lot# located wholly or partially within the Subdistrict qualifies for bonus #floor area# in accordance with the provisions of Section 74-634, as modified herein. For #zoning lots# located partially within the Subdistrict, such bonus #floor area# may be located anywhere on such #zoning lot#. In addition, if a subway and/or rail mass transit improvement has been constructed in accordance with an approved special permit and has received a Notice of Substantial Completion in accordance with the provisions of Section 74-634, the bonus #floor area# may be retained at the full amount granted by the special permit and may be utilized elsewhere on the #zoning lot# subject to any applicable review and approval process for such #development# or #enlargement#.

These rules are proposed pursuant to sections 1043, and 2303(b)(11) of the Charter and section 19-503 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York. These proposed rules were not included in the TLC's regulatory agenda for Fiscal Year 2010 because the need for such rules was not anticipated at the time the regulatory agenda was published.

A public hearing on these proposed rules will be held by the TLC at its offices at 40 Rector Street, 5th Floor, New York, New York 10006 on June 17, 2010 at 10:00 A.M. <u>Section 1.</u> It is hereby proposed that section 6-01 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended to add, in alphabetical order, definitions for "Independent Base Station," "Independent Livery Driver," and "Livery Fund," to read as follows:

Independent Base Station. An independent base station is a base station that is designated as an independent livery base under section 18-c of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law.

Independent Livery Driver. An independent livery driver is the driver of a livery which is affiliated with an independent base station.

Livery Fund. The Livery Fund is the independent livery driver benefit fund established under Article 6-G of the New York State Executive Law.

Section 2. It is hereby proposed that section 6-04(c) of Title

35 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended to add a new paragraph (4), to read as follows:

(4)(A)

No license for a base station will be issued to any applicant if a base station license for such applicant was previously revoked for violating the provisions of Article 6-G of the New York State Executive Law.

(B) For purposes of this paragraph, a previously revoked base station license for any applicant shall include any base station license for any entity in which any of applicant's officers, shareholders controlling the power to vote 10 percent or more of the voting interests, directors, partners, or managing members were also officers, shareholders controlling the power to vote 10 percent or more of the voting interests, directors, partners, or managing members.

(C) The provisions of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph shall apply for a period of five years following revocation and until any monies owed to the Livery Fund by the independent base station whose license was revoked have been paid or the Livery Fund has agreed on a payment plan for such monies.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby proposed that section 6-04(h) of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended to add a new paragraph (6), to read to as follows:

(6) The Fund may request that the Chairperson enforce the requirements of this subdivision by filing with the Chairperson a complaint against a black car base or a luxury limousine base, together with sufficient documentation to show a violation of the requirements of this subdivision by such base.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is hereby proposed that the provisions of section 6-04(i) of the Rules of the City of New York be amended to read as follows:

(i) (1) Every base station [shall comply with all provisions of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law and rules and regulations promulgated thereunder with respect to the provision of coverage and benefits to eligible persons] that is an independent base station must, as a condition of obtaining a license, including a renewal license, provide proof to the Chairperson that it is a member of the Livery Fund. Such proof shall include, but not be limited to, a copy of any sworn affirmation provided by such independent base station to the Workers' Compensation Board as required by section 18-c(2) of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. It shall also include a copy any certificate of membership or other documentation issued by the Livery Fund.

(2) Every base station that is not an independent base station must, as a condition of obtaining a license, including a renewal license, secure compensation under the New York State Workers' Compensation Law for all drivers of liveries affiliated with and dispatched by the base station, and provide proof to the Chairperson that it has secured such compensation in the form of a current certificate of insurance issued by a provider of workers compensation insurance. Such provider must be licensed by the New York State Insurance Department and must provide to the Commission evidence of such licensure, together with a list of authorized signatories.

Section 5. It is hereby proposed that section 6-07 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended by adding a new subdivision (1), to read as follows:

(1) Workers' Compensation.(1) Each base station must comply with the provisions of Article 6-G of the New York Executive Law.

(2) Each base station that is not an independent base station must secure and maintain compensation under the Workers' Compensation Law for each driver of a vehicle dispatched by the base station.

(3) Independent base stations. (i) Each base station that is an independent base station must maintain membership in the Livery Fund.

(ii) The Chairperson may audit any independent base station as provided in section 18-c(2)(g) of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law.

(iii) (A) Each independent base station must pay any assessment by the Livery Fund within 30 days of the assessment.

(B) The license of any independent base station which has been suspended or revoked for failure to pay any assessment by the Livery Fund will not be reinstated, and such independent base station can not apply for a new or renewal license, unless the independent base station has either paid all such assessments, interest and penalties imposed by the Livery Fund, or the independent base station has agreed with the Livery Fund on a payment plan.

(iv) (A) An independent base station shall not make a materially false statement in the sworn affirmation required by section 18-c(2) of the Workers' Compensation Law.

(B) Any independent base station found to have violated clause (A) of this subparagraph on two separate occasions may not apply for or hold a base station license.

(v) An independent base station shall not make any material misrepresentation regarding the number of for-hire vehicles affiliated with the base station, the number of owners of such vehicles, and/or the number of drivers dispatched by the base station. Material misrepresentation shall include, but not be limited to, any temporary alteration of records to reduce the numbers of vehicles or drivers.

(vi) An independent base station shall not coerce any driver or vehicle owner into making any false statements or refrain

from reporting any violations of Article 6-G of the New York State Executive Law

(vii) The Livery Fund may request that the Chairperson enforce the provisions of this paragraph by filing with the Chairperson a complaint against a base station, together with sufficient documentation to show a violation of the provisions of this paragraph by such base station.

Section 6. It is hereby proposed that the provisions of section 6-28 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended by amending the penalties for sections 6-04(h)(3) and (4) and by adding new penalties for sections 6-07(l)(1) to (3) to read as follows:

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rules

These rules amend chapter 6 of the rules of the Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") in two respects. Primarily, the rules implement a recently enacted state law, the Workers' Compensation Law, which provides certain workers' compensation benefits to livery drivers. Secondarily, the rules amend existing TLC rules governing the enforcement of the New York Black Car Operators' Injury Compensation Fund Law, by correcting a technical omission in those rules.

The Livery Workers' Compensation Law created the Independent Livery Driver Benefit Fund (the "Livery Fund"), which will act as livery drivers' employer for purposes of providing workers' compensation benefits to covered livery drivers

The Livery Fund, which is funded by assessments on the "independent" bases dispatching covered drivers, provides these drivers with workers' compensation insurance coverage for statutorily specified injuries, including death, loss of a limb, and injuries resulting from a crime committed against the driver. Coverage for injuries arising from accidents of a less serious nature will not be covered by the Livery Fund but remain compensable through no-fault automobile

Livery drivers who are not covered by the Livery Fund are those driving for bases not eligible for membership in the Livery Fund. Bases that are ineligible for membership in the Livery Fund must provide workers' compensation coverage to the drivers they dispatch.

The proposed rules implement the Livery Workers' Compensation Law by requiring a livery base station to obtain workers' compensation coverage, either through the Livery Fund or through the base's own workers' compensation insurance policy, and to maintain such coverage at all times during its licensure. The rules also implement enforcement procedures provided for by the Livery Workers' Compensation Law. Penalties for violations include substantial fines and suspension of base license and Livery Fund membership.

In addition, the proposed rules also clarify certain provisions of the TLC's existing rules regarding the Black Car Fund to provide (as permitted by the law establishing the Black Car Fund) that penalties for a failure by a base required to be a member of the Black Car Fund to collect and remit surcharges to the Black Car Fund can include revocation of membership in the Black Car Fund. The Black Car Fund can request that the TLC bring an enforcement action to implement those penalties.

Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptrollers Office at www.comptroller.nyc.gov, click on Labor Law Schedules to view rates

New York City's "Burma Law" (Local Law No. 33 of 1997) No Longer to be Enforced. In light of the United States Supreme Court's decision in **Crosby v. National Foreign** Trade Council, 530 U.S. 363 (2000), the City has determined that New York City's Local Law No. 33 of 1997 (codified in Administrative Code Section 6-115 and Charter Section 1524), which restricts City business with banks and companies doing business in Burma, is unconstitutional. This is to advise, therefore, that the language relating to Burma contained in existing New York City contracts may

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$7 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. To register for these lists--free of charge-, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application.

Attention Existing Suppliers:

Even if you already do business with NYC agencies, be sure to fill out an application. We are switching over to citywide, centralized Bidders Lists instead of the agency-specific lists previously used to issue notices about upcoming contract opportunities. To continue receiving notices of New York City contract opportunities, you must fill out and submit a NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application.

PRE-QUALIFIED LIST

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstance. When it is decided by an agency to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR.

Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such list may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency, (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification Questionnaire may be submitted to the Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, (OATH), Section 3-11 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of prequalified lists.

NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders list should contact these entities directly (see Vendor Information Manual) at the addresses given.

PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 A.M to 3:00 P.M. ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City now pays interest on all late invoices. The grace period that formerly existed was eliminated on July 1, 2000. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest. These are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year, in January and in July.

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement Notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section. At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified UNLESS a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed. The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
