

To the Honorable the Common Council of the City of New York :

To the Honorable the Common Council of the City of New York: The Public Administrator in the City of New York, pursuant to section 39 of article 1, entitled "Of the Public Administrator in the City of New York," itile 6, chapter 6, part 2 of the Revised Statutes, herewith exhibits to the Common Council of the City of New York, a statement on oath of the moneys received by him for commissions and expenses, and the total amount of his receipts and expenditures in each case in which he took charge of and collected any effects, or on which he administered on any estate during the year 1880, with the name of the deceased, his occupation, the place of his residence at the time of his death, where known, and the country or place from which he came if he were not a resident of this State at the time of his death. And in compliance with the Revised Ordinances of the Common Council he also transmits a transcript of such of his accounts as has been closed or finally settled during the year 1880. The statement heretofore referred to shows in what estates any money was received by him during the past year and the amount so received.
