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COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, at a Meeting held at the Mayor's Office at 12 o'clock M., on Thursday, June 20, 1921.

Present-Rubert A. Van Wyck, Mayor; Edgar J. Levey, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Patrick Kseman, Chambertain; Randelph Guggenheimer, President of the Council, and Robert Mult, Chaleman, Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen.

On motion of the Deputy Comptroller Mr. Reeves E. Selmes was ununimously elected temporary secretary for the meeting.

The minutes of the meeting held June 13, 1901, were approved as printed.

The Deputy Comptroller presented the following report of the Regisser of the Department of Finance relative to the improvement of the water-front on the North river, between Seventyseventh and Eighty-first streets, and offered the following resolution :

MAY 29, 1901.

Size—The Department of Ducks and Ferries in communication to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund May 21, 1501, says:

"At a meeting of the Board of Ducks held on the 17th instant the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That the map or plan submitted by the Engineer-in-Chief for the improvement of the water-front on the North river, between Seventy-seventh and Eighty-first streets, he and hereby is approved and directed to be transmitted to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for their approval."

"This plan provides for the improvement of that portion of the water-front between Seventy-seventh and Eighty-first streets, North river, which, by the terms of chapter 152 of the Laws of 1804, providing for the extension of Riverside Park, remains under the control of this Department. It comprises a stretch of water-front, running from a point 500 feet south of the southerly line of Seventy-sinth street, being at or near the centre line of Seventy-seventh affect, to a point 500 feet much of the mertherly line of Seventy-aloth street, being ut or near the centre line of Highty-firm street, in all a distance of 1, too feet.

"The adoption of this plan is necessary for the purpose of enabling the Department to proceed with the construction of new piers as laid out under the plan, and which are required for commercial use and to relieve the congestion in this district.

"The bolkhead-ing as proposed is substantially on a line with the present erising bulkhead and runs in a straight line from the outermost point of the crib-bulkhead at or near the centre line of Seventy-seventh street. It is not intended at the present time to district the existing bulkhead. The construction of piers in this locality is, however, extremely desirable and necessary, abstended in the Department to proceed with the work under the new plan."

A reference to the plans salusited, in connection with the description given in the above communication, gives a clear idea of what it is intended to fo.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Pand hereby approve of the map or plan submitted by the Department of Docks and Ferries for the improvement of the water-front on the North river, between Seventy-seventh and Eighty-first streets, in the Borough of Manhattan, as adopted by the Board of Docks on May 17, 1901.

The report was accepted and the resolution unanimously adopted.



It would, however, appear from this sketch that part of the City's dock has been constructed upon the uplands, not the property of The City of New York, and that in order to reach the dock from Fifty-second street use must be made of private property.

It now appears that the F. & M. Schneffer Brewing Company, who claim to be the owners of the uplands, object to the continued use of the same by the City, except a formal acknowledgment is made by the City that the uplands so used are private property, and they therefore offer to rent to The City of New York and uplands as new used at the nominal sum of \$1 for a term of five years.



Employees will be assigned to their posts by the Dock Superintendent and no one shall leave the post thus assigned, except for the purpose of going to the assistance of another employee, or under orders from the Dock Superintendent, and shall not be absent from the pier while on duty, except as hereinafter specified, unless excused, in writing, by the Dock Superintendent.

Employees on day duty shall be allowed an hour for lunch. One half of the Attendants and one-half of the Cleaners on night duty shall be excused for supper at 5.30 until 6.15 P. M., and the other half from 6.15 until 7 P. M., and all employees on night duty must be at their respective

other half from 0.15 until 7 P.M., and all employees on night duty must be at their respective posts not later than 7 P.M.

Employees must be quiet, civil and orderly in the performance of their duties, and be patient and discreet at all times, and refrain from harsh, violent, coarse, profane or insolent language, and shall give their names to all persons who may inquire for same.

No conversing with visitors or with each other or with any one else on the pier, while on duty, will be permitted, unless in the performance of duty.

In case of sickness or accident to a visitor on the pier, it shall be the duty of the Attendant to at once notify the Police Officer.

The fountains must be kept clean, and it shall be the duty of the Attendants to see that the

The fountains must be kept clean, and it shall be the duty of the Attendants to see that the cups are kept in place, not to allow them to become detached, and to see that no water is thrown

The Attendants must prevent all dancing, rough play, standing on benches, moving of benches, whistling and other obnoxious noises, as well as spitting on the floor.

No dogs or bicycles shall be allowed on the upper deck of the pier, and no pillows or bed-clothes shall be permitted on either the upper or lower deck of the pier.

The passageways must be kept clear, and no one allowed to loiter near the band-stand or stairways, and no males allowed near the tadies' toilets or the stairways leading thereto.

No intoxicating liquor of any kind shall, on any pretext, be permitted on the pier, and no employee while on duty shall drink any kind of intoxicating liquor, or smoke.

It shall be the duty of the Cleaners to see that the piers are kept perfectly clean, and in case the piers should become soiled the Attendants shall immediately notify the famile Cleaners the It shall be the duty of the Cleaners to see that the piers are kept perfectly clean, and in case the piers should become soiled the Attendants shall immediately notify the female Cleaner, who

shall clean the pier immediately.

Attendants while on duty shall wear the Department badge on the outside of the outer

garment over the left breast. The uniform of the Female Attendants and Cleaners shall consist of black dress, white

The uniform of the Female Attendants and Cleaners snail consist of black cleaning collars and cuffs and white apron.

The uniform of Male Attendants shall consist of dark trousers, single-breasted sack coat of gray cloth, buttoned to the neck, and gray hat, in accordance with sample in the office of the Dock Superintendent. The coat shall be kept buttoned at all times when on duty.

Employees in charge of recreation piers shall make daily report in regular form and mail same to the Dock Superintendent every night after closing of the pier.

Whenever the words Dock Superintendent are used in the above rules and regulations they refer to and designate the Dock Superintendent of the Department of Docks and Ferries or the Assistant Dock Superintendent or such other employee designated by him as may for the time have charge of the recreation piers.
