IN THE MATTER OF an application, submitted by the Department of Transportation, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, for an amendment to the City Map involving the modification of street lines and grades on Granite Avenue between Walker Street and LaSalle Street, in Community District 1, Borough of Staten Island, in accordance with Map No. 4125 dated May 14, 1993, revised August 11, 2009, and signed by the Borough President.

The application (C 900624 MMR) for an amendment to the City Map was filed by the Department of Transportation on March 8, 1990 in order to facilitate the reconstruction of the Granite Avenue Bridge over the Staten Island Railroad right-of-way, and its approaches between LaSalle Street and Walker Street in Staten Island.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Transportation (DOT) is requesting a change to the City Map to reflect the reconstruction of the Granite Avenue Bridge over the Staten Island Railroad right-of-way, and its approaches between LaSalle Street and Walker Street in the Elm Park neighborhood of Staten Island's central north shore. The reconstruction of the bridge and it approaches was completed in 1993. DOT requests that the legal grades on the City Map be modified to reflect the new grades used for the reconstruction of the bridge. DOT also requests the modification of street lines and dimensions on the portion of Granite Avenue that abuts the southerly end of the bridge in order to reflect the bridge's expanded length of approximately 10 feet at that location.

The approximately 100-foot-long bridge is a sectional box-girder type commonly used for spanning short distances. This portion of Staten Island Railway's North Shore Branch was abandoned in the early 1950's, though there has been a call in recent years for its restoration to help relieve congestion on Staten Island's roadways. The bottom side of the new bridge's structure is higher than that of the previous bridge, providing greater clearance distances over the tracks and improving the feasibility of future railroad use.

Granite Avenue, located two blocks or approximately 1,000 feet east of Simonson Avenue, is Cityowned, open for two-way traffic, and is mapped to a width of 50 feet along the bridge, and to a width of 60 feet north and south of the bridge. The area affected by the grade changes along Granite Avenue is approximately 400 feet in length (200 feet on each side of the bridge). The modification of grades is due to an improved bridge design whose goal is to avoid extreme changes in slope. The maximum change in grade occurs on the new bridge itself which is approximately 1.5 feet lower than the previously existing grade on the old bridge. The maximum grade change for the approaches to the bridge is approximately 1 foot. A standard curbed sidewalk drainage design was used to ensure that run-off would not spill into properties adjacent to the site.

The site is located within an M3-1 zoning district and is surrounded by various automobile and construction-related uses, as well as a school for autistic children. An R3-2 zoning district is located further to the south of the site.

In response to a polling letter issued to affected City agencies and utilities, no agencies had indicated any opposition to the proposed map change.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 900624 MMR) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq., and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The lead agency is the Department of Transportation. This application was determined to be a Type II action which requires no further review.

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 900624 MMR), was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on March 22, 2010, and was duly referred to Community Board 1 and the Staten Island Borough

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President in accordance with Title 62 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-02(b).

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 1 held a public hearing on this application (C 900624 MMR) on May 3, 2010, and on May 11, 2010, by a vote of 27 to 0 with 0 abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending approval of the application.

Borough President Recommendation

This application (C 900624 MMR) was considered by the Borough President of Staten Island, who issued a recommendation approving the application on June 17, 2010.

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On June 9, 2010 (Calendar No. 3), the City Planning Commission scheduled June 23, 2010 for a public hearing on this application (C 900624 MMR). The hearing was duly held on June 23, 2010 (Calendar No. 15).

There was one speaker on this application. The speaker, a representative of the applicant, described the application to the City Planning Commission. There were no other speakers and the hearing was closed.

CONSIDERATION

The City Planning Commission believes that this amendment to the City Map is appropriate. The Commission notes that many of the city's 1,500 bridges, which are owned, operated and maintained by DOT, are nearly a century old, and from time to time need to be replaced. . Such was the case with the subject bridge on Granite Avenue. The Commission further notes that, due to a new bridge design, the elevations on top of the bridge and the length of the bridge required modification. The Commission believes that proposed grade changes are necessary to accommodate the new structure and complete the reconstruction of a formerly failing bridge.

RESOLVED, that the City Planning Commission finds that the action described herein will have no significant impact on the environment; and be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, that based on the environmental determination and the consideration described in this report, the application (C 900624 MMR) for the amendment to the City Map involving the modification of street lines and grades on Granite Avenue between Walker Street and LaSalle Street, including authorization for any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto, in Community District 1, Borough of Staten Island, in accordance with Map No. 4125 dated May 14, 1993, revised August 11, 2009, and signed by the Borough President, is approved;


All such approvals being subject to the following condition:






