

In both Long and Short Term Buildings there were put up by outside contract two new heavy slate wash sinks, 54 feet long each, with nickel plated legs, pipes, faucers, etc., requiring a wooden shelf on the top, which was made of half-inch pine, 8 inches wide, with moulding,
