

DEAR Siz—I inclose herewith a copy of communication from the Deputy Commissioner of Highways, Borough of Brooklyn, dated April 10, 1900, in which he requests that this Department should kindly take up the matter of the construction of sewers and street basins where necessary in the streets the grading and paying of which are contemplated by his department.

The Chief Engineer of Sewers in this borough has reported to me that the sewer improvements have been completed in the streets mentioned in the Deputy Commissioner of Highways' letter, except the following, and I respectfully recommend that the matter of sewering the streets now mentioned should be initiated in the Local Board of Improvements.
