No Trash, Recycling or Curbside Compost Collection, nor Street Cleaning, on Lincoln's Birthday, Wednesday, February 12, 2020

In observance of the Lincoln's Birthday holiday, the New York City Department of Sanitation announced that there will be no trash, recycling, or curbside composting collection on Wednesday, February 12, 2020.

- Residents who normally receive **Wednesday trash and curbside compost collection** should place their materials at curbside after 4 p.m. on Wednesday, February 12 for collection.
- Residents who normally receive **Wednesday recycling collection** should place their materials at curbside after 4 p.m. on Tuesday, February 18 for collection starting Wednesday, February 19.

## **About the New York City Department of Sanitation**

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
