DEAR SIR-In accordance with section 1544, of the Charter of The City of New York, I repectfully submit the following report of the operations of the Department of Highways for the quarter ending March 31, 1899

BOROUGH OF MANHATTAN.

During the quarter the Department entered into three paving contracts, involving an estimated cost of \$17,857, and nine regulating and grading contracts, the estimated cost of which is

\$68,159.41.

Work was completed on six paving contracts at a total cost of \$38,513.37, and on seven regulating and grading contracts costing \$122,366.53.

The repair force took up and relaid about 40,051 square yards of stone pavement, which was found to be defective; relaid a large number of crosswalks, and made a great many examinations of defective pavements complained of by residents of various localities.

The mileage of paved streets was increased as follows: Asphalt pavement, 35, and asphalt-block pavement, 14.

Permits were issued as follows: For vaults, 36; for repairs to vaults, 48; for placing guy posts, 6; for placing kettles on streets, 172; for placing boilers and engines on streets, 86; for repairs to pavement at expense of property-owners, 6; for making and repairing house service connections for gas, electricity, steam, etc., 2,603; for making openings to repair all mains other than Croton water-mains and main sewers and for making and repairing house service connections for water, sewage, gas, electricity, steam, etc., 5,661, and for making openings to repair Croton water-mains and main sewers, 360.

The number of inspections of pavements made was 13,071, and 200 notices were served on corporations and others to repair defects in pavements where openings had been made by them.

There have been many washouts on the unpaved and macadamized roads during the quarter, particularly on the Boulevard Lafayette and Terrace View avenue. These washouts have been repaired as promptly as possible, and most of the material used in the work has been obtained without expense to the City.

A number of crosswalks of a temporary character have been constructed at the most important crossings on unpaved roadways, the material used being steamed ashes.

Seventh avenue, being the main driveway from Central Park to the Speedway, has received special attention. The resurfacing of the upper section, from One Hundred and Forty-fifth to One Hundred and Fifty-third street, is about to be begun, and it is expected that the work will

be finished during the early summer.

The more important macadamized and gravel roadways are regularly sprinkled to prevent dust, and the surfaces are frequently scraped and tolled to keep them clean and in good

During the quarter the Bureau of Incumbrances received and attended to 818 complaints of obstructions; seized and removed obstructions in 218 cases where notices to make the removals were not complied with; issued 787 permits to place building material on streets; 126 permits to cross sidewalks and two permits to cut down dead or dangerous trees. Eight notices were also served to repair defective vault covers, and 113 permits were issued to erect temporary sheds over

For information in detail regarding the operations of this Department in the Borough of Manhattan during the quarter, I refer you to documents "A," "B," "C," "D," E," "F," "G" and "H.

BOROUGH OF THE BRONX.

The Department awarded during the quarter 14 contracts for regulating and grading streets in this Borough, the total estimated cost of these improvements being \$320,048.83.

Work has been in progress under 26 contracts for regulating and grading streets, involving an estimated expenditure of \$1,775,613.61. Of these, two have been completed; also one contract for fencing vacant lots.

In maintaining macadamized and unpaved streets the following items of work have been done: 215,547 square feet of macadamized roadways repaired, scraped and cleaned; 10,184 square feet of paved roadway repaired with granite and trap-block pavement; 62,372 square teet of unpaved roadway repaired, surfaced and scraped; 392,604 linear feet of gutters formed and cleaned; 745 linear feet of curbstones reset and formed with native stone; 231,171 square feet of sidewalks repaired, formed and surfaced with ashes; 9,767 linear feet of sidewalks planked and repaired; 8,628 square feet of bridges replanked, and 56,364 square feet of bridges

The Bureau of Incumbrances issued 231 permits to place material on streets and for other

Upon complaints made to this Department, 38 loads of street obstructions, chiefly brick and lumber, were removed.

Full details of the work accomplished may be found in documents "I," "J," "K," "L" and "M."

BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN.

Contracts have been entered into as follows: Five for grading and paving streets with Bel-

Contracts have been entered into as follows: Five for grading and paving streets with Belgian-block pavement; 4 for grading and paving streets with asphalt pavement, and 1 for grading and paving with macadam pavement.

Under the supervision of this Department, 9,209 square of bluestone flagging have been laid, as well as 9 driveways across sidewalks. Inspections were made and reports rendered on 674 complaints, 102 notices to repair sidewalks were served, also 204 notices to correct house numbers. Authority has 62en granted by the Board of Public Improvements to repave with asphalt 27 streets or parts of streets, and with granite 7 streets or parts of streets. Ten contracts have been entered into for flagging sidewalks in various localities and the work is now in progress.

Under the supervision of the Bureau of Streets and Roads, defective pavement was taken up and relaid as f-llows: Cobble-stone, 4,505 square yards; granite blocks, 3,831 square yards; belgian blocks, 899 square yards; brick, 30 square yards.

The Bureau of Incumbrances received and attended to 263 complaints; issued 170 permits to place building material on streets, 181 permits to cross sidewalks, 152 permits to cut down

to place building material on streets, 181 permits to cross sidewalks, 152 permits to cut down trees, and 1,856 permits for miscellaneous purposes.

#### EOROUGH OF QUEENS.

In repairing and maintaining the streets and roads under the charge of the Department of Highways, Borough of Queens, the following items of work were done: 36 square yards of granite-block pavement repaired; 13 square yards of cobble-stone gutter repaired; 570,596 square yards of macadam streets sanded; 29,958 square yards of macadam pavement scraped and cleaned; 1,491 square yards of macadam pavement repaired; 4,572 square yards of unpaved streets repaired, crowned and graded; 171,963 linear feet of gutters formed and cleaned, and 274 linear feet of worden culverts built

linear feet of wooden culverts built.

While the winter season was not severe, the storms were so violent that great damage was done to the macadam streets throughout the borough, especially those in the Fifth Ward extend-

ing to the ocean front.

The maintenance force has been energetically employed restoring washouts and other defects in these roadways, which are speedily being restored to excellent condition.

I refer you to documents "T," "U," and "V," hereto attached, for detailed statements of the work of the Department in the Borough of Queens.

# BOROUGH OF RICHMOND.

The macadamized and unpaved roads in the Borough of Richmond have been kept in fairly good condition during the quarter. The washouts caused by the heavy storms were filled up as promptly as possible to avoid accidents; 13,635 square yards of roadway were surfaced with sand; 63 square yards of feetive roadway were repaired in patches, and about 2 miles of roads were scraped and cleaned.

Permits were issued as follows: 31 to open streets to tap water-pipes; 213 to open streets to repair water connections; 21 to open streets to make sewer connections; 17 to open streets to repair sewer connections; 13 to place building material on streets, and 196 to lay flagging, curb and gutter and to lay and repair gas-pipes; making a total of 491.

The operations of this Bureau consist of the maintenance of 21.60 miles of gravel and macadamized roads and 33.26 miles of dirt roads in the Borough of Manhattan. This includes the repairing of washouts, repaying the gutters where necessary to insure proper drainage, also resetting curbing and dagging where necessary.

An examination of these reports will show that a great amount of work of this bureau cannot well be tabulated, yet calls for a considerable expenditure on the part of the City, such as the sprinkling, scraping and rolling of the macadam and gravel roadways; this work, particularly on Lenox, Seventh and St. Nicholas avenues, is very important, owing to large building interests along these avenues, necessitating a very careful and constant attention on the part of this bureau to prevent the roadway being irretrievably ruined by the repeated tearing up of the roadway for house connections and the excessive traffic of heavy building material trucks.

Seventh avenue being the main driveway from Central Park to the Speedway has received careful attention from this bureau, the resurfacing of the upper section, from One Hundred and Forty-fifth to One Hundred and Fifty-third street, is about to begin and will be finished during the early summer.

It will be seen from the above lists that a large number of original improvements will probably be made in this borough this year, and in addition to those named a large number of others have been approved by the Board of Public Improvements, but have not yet been acted upon by the Municipal Assembly. It is also a matter for congratulation that in only one instance do the resolutions call for macadam pavement, nearly all the others being for asphalt or granite block.

I regret that I must again report that the failure to make contracts for maintaining our asphalt pavements is resulting in a very serious state of affairs. These pavements, which are not covered by original maintenance contracts, have had no work whatever done on them since August 23, 1899, a period of over seven months, including an entire winter. The results are simply what might have been expected. A great many bad holes have developed which are extremely dangerous, and will, I fear, involve claims for many thousands of dollars for accidents, which will necessarily occur, or have already occurred. The reason for this delay is that an injunction has been issued restraining the Commissioner from awarding contracts for repaving with asphalt, bids for which were received on January 11, the date on which bids for repaving the Brooklyn pavements were submitted.

Complaints are being received avery day by this Department from the Police and cities.

Complaints are being received every day by this Department from the Police and citizens, calling attention to dangerous holes now existing, and these complaints appear to place the responsibility for the present condition of our pavements upon this Department. The delay in the execution of these contracts may cost the City thousands of dollars, and I think it should be made clear that this Department is not responsible for the existing condition.

Besides the Street Improvement contracts above noted, ten others have been made for flagging sidewalks in various parts of the borough. Upon these contracts work has just been begun, and

will be completed during the quarter.

A large number of other contracts for flagging sidewalks and fencing vacant lots have been forwarded, but have not yet been awarded.
