



Health and Safety Mandate for Disaster Recovery Centers

The General Public, Staff, Volunteers and Contractors will be required to provide proof of vaccination or take a rapid COVID test to enter the Service Center. Those assisting in a center should:

- Complete the e-HSA before reporting to your shift: <u>Health and Safety</u>
 Screening survey
- Bring proof of vaccination (if available).
- Wear your CERT issued uniform
- Wear comfortable footwear.
- Wear a face covering while inside the Service Center and self-monitor for potential illness.
- Bring a reusable water bottle, as well as an additional personal supply of water/drinks as needed.
- Use the provided hand sanitizer and routinely wash hands throughout the operational period.




