5) A unique boat number shall be assigned to the boat.
6) The boat number shall be painted by NYCDEP on both sides of the bow hull above the anticipated mmersion line using permanent white or black paint, whichever color is most visible given the color of the boat.
(7) An appropriately dated Boat Tag shall be completed in permanent ink and affixed to the exterior port-side bow. Boat Tag completion shal nclude: writing the boat owner's Access Perm eservoir prefix, if any, and boat number in the appropriate field; and punching out the appropriate [water supply] Water Supply location abbreviation.
(8) [The boat owner shall receive from NYCDEP at] At the processing appointment the boat owner shall eceive the following information [including]: a copy of the current rules, if the boat owner does not already have one[;], a current Watershed Recreation newsletter, if desired[;], a map and/or directions to he designated Boat Storage Area for their boat;;], a erbal summary of important rules and conditiol incuing the Boat Tag expiration and re the procedures for boat removal and disposal.
(9) Upon completion of the boat cleaning and processing appointment, the boat owner shall
immediately place the registered boat on the appropriate water body or at the assigned Boat Storage Area without storing or placing the boat in any other location or water body.
(f) Eligible Boats. Boats eligible for Boat Tags shall be aluminum or metal-alloy row boats, except boats on record as March 31,2006 may be wooden or fiberglass row boats. Only owboats that are a minimum of $11^{\prime} 6$ " in inss row boats. Only width and are a maximum of of $16^{\prime}$ in length are permitted on City Property. Other vessels, including but not limited to sailboats, motorized boats, canoes, kayaks, sculls, inflatable ailboats, motorized boats, canoes, kayaks, sculls, inflatable
boats and collapsible boats are prohibited, except as provided in $\$ 16-07$ of these rules.
(i) Display. Boat Tags shall be affixed to the upper port-side exterior bow (top left outside front) of the corresponding
registered boat. It shall be the Boat Tag holder's registered boat. It shall be the Boat Tag holder's
responsibility to keep a Boat Tag affixed and clea responsibility to keep a Boat Tag affixed and clearly legible at all times. It shall also be the responsibility of the boat owner to ensure the boat numbers are clearly legible and visible. Boats with missing or illegible Boat Tags and/or boat numbers are subject to removal by NYCDEP.
(k) Renewal. A renewal Boat Tag application shall be sent via electronic or USPS mail to the address on file for each valid boat owner generally in the spring of the Boat Tag expiration year. Content of the renewal Boat Tag application shall include confirmation of boat owner and boat information on file, as well as any angler survey questions. Renewed Boat Tags shall be [mailed] sent to the address on file for the boat owner generally within two weeks of application receipt.
(n) Boat Storage Area. Each registered boat shall be assigned to a Boat Storage Area. The boat must be stored in he assigned Boat Storage Area when not in use on the water , except that during the months from April through Boat Storage Area on the same reservoir or lake for convenience of Fishing, provided there is storage space available as determined by NYCDEP]. NYCDEP may limit the number and location of boats assigned to any particular Boat Storage Area. Information about Boat Storage Areas closed to additional boats shall be available from NYCDEP and, when applicable, on the NYCDEP website. (e) Penalty Schedule. First offenses of the rules shall result in a suspension that has a duration of one-third the maximum suspension duration for the specific violation. Second offenses shall result in a suspension that has a duration of one-half the maximum suspension period for the specific violation, and third offenses shall result in a suspension that has the maximum suspension period for the specific violation. Violations of multiple sections of the rules during a single incident will result in the maximum penalty for the single most egregious violation. In addition, certain violations of the rules can result in the issuance of a summons for trespass and/or arrest.

Individuals who have committed four or more offenses within a five-year period, or who have seriously threatened public safety, water supply safety or security, or the personal safety of individuals through means not specifically enumerated in this penalty schedule will be subject to the revocation of all Watershed Lands and Community Planning.

## STATEMENT OF BASIS AND PURPOSE

The rules have a number of purposes. First, the rules make the definition of "group" consistent with the number of people eligible to receive a Group Access Permit. Second, the rules prohibit certain fishing equipment due to the threat of invasive species from such equipment. Third, the rules establish a maximum amount that NYCDEP can charge to retrieve a boat that has been removed from the water and stored by NYCDEP and limit boaters' abilities to change Boat Storage Areas to facilitate NYCDEP's management of Boat Storage Areas. Fourth, the rules expand year-round boating to the Kensico and New Croton reservoirs and, when belonging to non-NYCDEP entities, Fifth the rules establish benalty shedule for vilation of the rules.

The proposed rules are derived from historical recreationa uses of the lands that are recognized in the New York City Watershed Memorandum of Agreement dated Janua
1997, and are not intended to establish supervised 1997, and are not intended to establish
recreational activities on these lands.

(e) The applicant made a false statement on her/his application, or failed to disclose her/his complete arrest history, including sealed arrests. Sealed arrests are mad available to the License Division pursuant to Article 160 of the Criminal Procedure Law when an application has been made for a license to possess a gun.
(f) The applicant is the subject of an order of protection or a temporary order of protection
(g) The applicant has a history of one or more incidents of domestic violence.
(h) The applicant has a poor driving history, has multiple driver license suspensions or has been declared a scofflaw by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. (i) The applicant has failed to comply with federal, state or local law or with Police Department rules governing possession an

## STATEMENT OF BASIS AND PURPOSE

The Police Commissioner is responsible for the licensing and regulation of handguns, rifles, shotguns and other weapons in New York City, including activities such as possessing, carrying, selling, manufacturing, transporting or repairing such weapons. The administrative arm of the Police Department, which fulfills these functions at his direction, is
the New York City Police Department's License Division. the New York City Police Department's License Division.
As part of a comprehensive revision of the City's laws, rules and procedures for gun licensing in order to improve their mended the rules administered by the License Division.

The rules pertaining to the issuance of handgun licenses and rifle/shotgun permits have been amended to provide applicants with additional guidance regarding the potential grounds for denial of an application for such license or permit. Based upon comments received, the language of the pening paragraphs of sections $3-03$ and $5-10$ has been further modified to clarify that the factors enumerated therein are to be considered in reaching a determination on lack of good cause for denial. good moral character and the lack of good cause for denial

The rules have also been amended to provide licensees and permittees with additional guidance regarding the ground license or permit

In addition, the rules have been amended to remove the requirement that various documents be notarized, in acknowledgment of the ability of the License Division to verify identity through in-person visits and available technology.

The requirement for a judge's signature on a Certificate of Relief from Disabilities has been removed as such certificate can be issued by a court or the Board of Parole. Finally, based upon comment within the agency, the rules have been amended to remove the requirement that Certificates of Relief from Disabilities include a statement granting the and 400 .

Consistent with the intent of the New York State Penal Law and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and 434(b) and 1043 of the New York City Charter, Title 10 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and Article 400 of the New York State Penal Law, the Police Department has amended its rules to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the licensing of handguns, rifles and shotguns.

Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above $\$ 100,000$ for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above $\$ 50,000$ for other services, and above $\$ 25,000$ for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in the City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Mondays thru Fridays from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. except legal holidays.

## NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptrollers Office at
www.comptroller.nyc.gov, click on Labor Law Schedules to view rates.
New York City's "Burma Law" (Local Law No. 33 of 1997) No Longer to be Enforced. In light of the United States Supreme Court's decision in Crosby v. National Foreign Trade Council, 530 U.S. 363 (2000), the City has (cermined that New York City's Local Law No. 33 of 1997 (codified in Administrative Code Section 6-115 and Charter companies doing business in Burma, is unconstitutional. This is to advise, therefore, that the language relating to Burma contained in existing New York City contracts may not be enforced.

## VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately $\$ 7$ billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. To register for these lists--free of charge-, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor

## PRE-QUALIFIED LIST

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstance. When it is decided by an agency to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the $C R$.
Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such list may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency, (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification Questionnaire may be submitted to the Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, (OATH), Section 3-11 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre qualified lists.

## NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board rules and do not follow all of the above Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health \& Hospitals Corporation, Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders list should contact these entities directly

## PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related informatio through on-line computer access. ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent ( $51 \%$ ) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. ## PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City now pays interest on all late invoices. The grace period that formerly existed wa eliminated on July 1, 2000. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest. Thes are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year, in January and in July

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES
Procurement Notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) Awards; and Lists \& Miscell subsections: Solicitations, subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.
Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section. At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans,
specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified UNLESS a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed. The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR
