Whereas, This Board is desirous of acquiring, in the name and for the benefit of the Corporation of the City of New York, all riparian and wharfage rights and interests in or annexed to or appurtenant to all that certain bulkhead or wharf structures, with the platform in front of same, fronting on the East river, opposite South street, extending from the easterly line of Pier, old

to or appurtenant to all that certain bulkhead or wharf structures, with the platform in front of same, fronting on the East river, opposite South street, extending from the easterly line of Pier, old 35, East river, and running thence 109.69 feet easterly, with all right of wharfage, cranage, emoluments, advantages and appurtenances therewith connected and to the same belonging; and Whereas, It appears that Olcott & Olcott are the attorneys for the owner, in fee simple, with all its hereditaments of the premises above named, including the riparian and wharfage rights.

Resolved, That this Board offers to purchase the said riparian and wharfage rights, with all its hereditaments, and pay for a good and sufficient title therefor, free from all incumbrances, the sum of fifty (50) dollars per front foot, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

Resolved, That a copy of the above preamble and resolutions be served upon Olcott & Olcott, attorneys for E. A. Hoffmann, and they be and hereby are requested, within ten days from receipt hereof, to notify this Board in writing whether they will sell said riparian and wharlage rights and interests, as aforesaid, to The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York for the price above mentioned, and in the event that they shall fail to notify this Board of their willingness to so convey the respective riparian and wharfage rights and interests as aforesaid, it shall be deemed that no price can be agreed upon for the said rights and interests between the owners thereof and this Department.

Motions to Fill Vacancies in Commissions.

It will be noticed that no reports have been confirmed during this quarter. The cause of this is that on March 11 a statute was passed by the Legislature changing the rate of compensation for referees from \$6 a session to \$10 a session. As section 1000 of the Consolidation Act provides that the Commissioner in Street Opening proceedings shall receive the like fees as are allowed by law to referees, there arose a question as to what rate the Commissioners, whose costs had been noticed for taxation, should be paid. This matter was not disposed of in time to have a number of reports in other respects ready, confirmed before the end of the quarter.

As appears from the report, there are 22 proceedings in which objections to the reports have already been heard, and 14 additional proceedings in which reports have been filed, but objections not yet fully heard. Of these 36 reports 25 were filed during the quarter—a greater number we believe than were ever filed in a quarter before, and involving more than five hundred and sixty-one thousand dollars in awards.

It seems proper for us to call attention here to the additional expense to this Bureau, caused by the change in the law referred to above, making the fees of commissioners \$10 instead of \$6 a session, although this matter has already been informally laid before you, and a bill dealing with the matter has, we believe, been prepared by you and submitted to the Legislature.

During the past quarter there were held 950 meetings in proceedings pending in this Bureau. If all commissioners attended all meetings, the change in the law would add to the expense of opening streets for a single quarter the sum of \$11,400. If our work continues at the same rate during the whole year, the increased expense amounts to \$45,600, most of which will be assessed upon property in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, deemed to be benefited by the improvements.

But as the work of the Bureau is constantly increasing, the additional expense involved in this

change of the law will probably be nearer \$50,000 than \$45,000 per annum.

While the bar for many years has felt that \$6 a day for referees is inadequate compensation, street opening proceedings are somewhat different from ordinary references, and the question naturally arises as to whether the increase indirectly made in the fees of commissioners by the change in the law affecting referee's fees is just and proper, and whether it would not be for the change in the feet of the reconstruction of the Consolidation Act as to interest of the property-owners and the City to so amend section 1000 of the Consolidation Act as to leave the compensation of Commissioners the same as it was before chapter 90 of the Laws of 1896 was passed.

In our opinion, the number of necessary meetings at which, in even important proceedings very little time or work is required of the commissioners, make their compensation at the rate of \$6 a session ample. If it is not, an application may always be made to the court, pursuant to section 1000, for an extra allowance. But, in most cases, every one who has had experience in these matters will agree that the compensation which was formerly the rule is adequate com-

We have not discovered that there is any difficulty in procuring competent and well-qualified commissioners to serve at the old rate. Among our commissioners during the past year have been most of the candidates for the high judicial offices before the people at the last election.

Section 984 of the Consolidated Act provides for the filing of the report of the Commissioners and also requires that "they shall publish a notice for fifteen days in the CITY RECORD." * **

stating their intention to present their report for confirmation to the said Court at a time and place to be specified in said notice, and that all persons interested in such proceedings or in any of the lands affected thereby, having objections thereto, shall file the same in writing with said commissioners within twenty days after the first publication of said notice, and that the said commissioners will hear such objections within the ten week days next after the expiration of said twenty days.

* * At the time and place named in said notice the said commissioners shall hear the person or persons objecting to the said report, and shall have power to adjourn, from time to time, until all such persons shall be fully heard."

This section is taken from the Laws of 1862, and the ten-day hearings are a survival from the times when, according to the old practice, claimants were not heard until after the filing of the preliminary report. At present claimants are fully heard before any report is made up.

It is to be noted that the Commissioners are required to sit ten consecutive week days; that the time within which to file objections expires before these ten-day hearings commence, and that in case there are no objections filed, the ten meetings must, notwithstanding, be held. There is

usually some actual work to be done at three or four of these ten-day hearings. If serious and important objections to the report have been filed, it is usually the case that counsel have to be given additional time, after the ten days have expired, when they can offer testimony and be heard, and as the evidence offered in support of the attack upon the report cannot be known beforehand, it is rarely the case that the City can put in its rebutting testimony within the ten days. We think all the lawyers who are engaged in these proceedings will agree, that while it is very important to have plenty of time for the purpose of hearing objections, the ten-day hearings as required by section 984 of the Consolidation Act are a useless expense. It is at that stage of the proceedings more than any other when reasonable adjournments should be taken to enable counsel to prepare their proofs and procure their witnesses. And in a case where no objections have been filed, no one has any standing to be heard; but the ten-day so-called hearings go on. The Bureau confirmed forty proceedings during the year 1895. Of these the awards were merely nominal in six; in seven no objections were filed; consequently, in these cases, the Commissioners had nothing to do at the ten hearings required by section 984, except to meet and earn their ers had nothing to do at the ten hearings required by section 984, except to meet and earn their fees thereby.

It is also to be noted that the expenses of the proceedings are increased by reason of these tenday hearings—not only to the amount of the fees of the Commissioners (\$300 if all attend), but also by additional office expenses which are thereby incurred.

We are therefore of the opinion that the ten-day hearings might be safely done away with, and section 984 amended so as to require the Commissioners to meet at a time to be stated in the advertised notice to hear objections as is the provision in the so-called Small Parks Act, chapter 320 of the Laws of 1887, and which is deemed sufficient in the condemnation of public parks.

The people in the district beyond the Harlem river have suffered for many years on account of the delay in opening their streets. They have now a population so large as to require the work to be pushed rapidly, and we are doing now the work which most people up there think should have been spread over the last twenty-five years. The consequence is, that the assessments for benefit are falling upon the real estate of that section of the city with startling rapidity and to an amount which often wipes out the equities of the imprudent. The property-owners in this part of the city would, we are sure, appreciate such relief as may be offered through reducing or, at least, not increasing the expense incident to opening streets.

Resolved, That the application for wiring, furnishing fixtures and connections for lighting the Seventh Regiment Armory by electricity be approved, and that the same is hereby authorized; that E. T. Birdsall be and he is hereby employed as electrical engineer to prepare contract and specifications and superintend the work, at a compensation of five per cent. on the total cost of the same. That the Secretary be authorized to have the contract and specifications printed, and when approved by the Counsel to the Corporation as to the form, that advertisements be inserted in the City Record, inviting proposals for doing said work, and that the sum of thirty-thousand dollars (\$30,000) is hereby deemed necessary and appropriated for said work, and that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be respectfully requested to concur in the same.

Which was adopted by the following vote: Ayes—The Mayor, the Commissioner of Public Works, Brigadier-General Fitzgerald, and Colonel Seward.

Communications were received from Captain David Wilson, commanding Second Battery, N.G., N.Y., of dates June 3, June 6 and June 11, making application for stalls for horses, with mangers, hay-racks, etc., to be placed in the armory of that organization.

They were referred to Brigadier-General Fitzgerald for examination and report.

A report was presented from the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, showing the work necessary for completing the Ninth Regiment Armory, accompanied with specifications for furniture, opera-chairs, fixtures, pump, tools and window-shades, etc., for fixtures for gas and electrical lighting and iron railing, etc., with estimates of the cost of the same; also specification for setting curb and laying concrete sidewalk on the Fifteenth street side was amended to read: At a cost not to exceed \$990, an increase of \$300, and the deduction of a like amount to be made from his contract dated October 24, 1894, for the erection o

Resolved, That James D. Murphy be directed to excavate and remove the present Fifteenth street sidewalk at the Ninth Regiment Armory and construct a sidewalk and granite curbing, in accordance with the following specifications:

Curbing—Provide and lay rounded granite curbing to Fifteenth street sidewalk, six inches by twenty inches, accurately leveled and graded.

Paving—The sidewalk on Fifteenth street to be excavated to a depth of fifteen inches, and brought to an even surface and well rammed.

Fill in with ten inches of clean cinders thoroughly wet and rammed. Upon this lay a composition pavement equal to the very best manufactured, consisting of three and three-quarters inches of best Portland cement concrete and one and one-quarter inches of a finishing coat, consisting of the very best Portland cement and fine-crushed stone and sand.

The concrete to be mixed in the following proportions: one part cement, three of sand and five of broken stone, and the finishing coat to be mixed one part of cement and two of crushed stone and sand. Samples of the walk to be submitted to and approved by the architects before the work is started. All to be accurately fitted to curbing, vault lights, etc. The paving to fill up to entrances and to be laid to slope as may be directed.

At a cost not to exceed nine hundred and ninety dollars (\$990).

Resolved, That the Architects, Messrs. Cable & Sargent, be and the same are hereby further employed in connection with the doing of work and materials required in the completion and furnishing of works.

A communication, addressed to the Mayor, was received from the Deputy Commissioner of Public Works, transmitting an application of Colonel Camp, commanding Twenty-second Regiment, N. G., N. Y., dated April 13, 1896, for enlarging and improving the rifle range in the armory of that organization, and his reply of May 6, 1896, stating the inability of the Department of Public Works to do the work from lack of funds in the appropriation for construction and

repairs.
On motion of General Fitzgerald it was referred to the Secretary, with the request that he have

prepared a description of the work required and an estimate of the cost of the same.

A communication was received from the Commissioner of Public Works, dated May 11, 1896, A communication was received from the Commissioner of Public Works, dated May 11, 1896, transmitting a map, of date May 8, 1896, of the proposed site for an armory for the First Battery, N. G., N. Y., on the south side of Sixty-sixth street, one hundred and fifty feet east of Columbus avenue, stating that the site, as surveyed and in possession, has a frontage of one hundred and seventy-lour feet four and one-half inches by one hundred feet five inches in depth.

On motion of Brigadier-General Fitzgerald, it was resolved that the preamble and resolution of the Armory Board of March 31, 1896, be amended to agree with the survey of the side as now presented by the Commissioner of Public Works, and offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Secretary of this Board be and he is hereby directed, in pursuance of the provisions of chapter 330 of the Laws of 1887, to submit the survey, map or plan, with field notes and explanatory remarks, of the site for armory purposes, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Sixty-sixth street, distant one hundred and fifty feet easterly from the easterly line of Columbus avenue; thence southerly and parallel with said avenue distance one hundred feet five inches; thence easterly and parallel with said street distance one hundred and seventy-four feet four and one-half inches; thence northerly and parallel with Columbus avenue distance one hundred feet one-half inches; thence northerly and parallel with Columbus avenue distance one hundred feet five inches to the southerly line of Sixty-sixth street; thence westerly along said street distance one hundred and seventy-four feet four and one-half inches to the point or place of beginning, heretofore selected by this Board, which has been prepared by the Department of Public Works, at the request of this Board, to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, with the request that the said Commissioners approve or disapprove the same, as provided in said chapter 330 of the Laws of 1887; and if said Commissioners of the Sinking Fund shall approve said site so selected, and consent to the acquisition thereof for said purposes, that they may indicate such approval and consent by a certificate to that effect indorsed upon or attached to said survey, map or plan so as aforesaid submitted to said Commissioners.
