



## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC PARKS.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 1892—ADJOURNED MEETING, 10 A. M.

Present—Commissioners Dana (President), Gallup, Tappen.

The following communications were received:

From the Captain of Police—

1st. In relation to the policing of Duane Street Park and other small parks. Filed.

2d. Recommending that the unoccupied rooms on the first floor of the Arsenal building in Central Park be added to those used by the police. Referred to Commissioner Tappen.

From C. Marion Digges, withdrawing his application for permission to occupy the "Hoyt House," on Twin Island in Pelham Bay Park. Filed.

From the Landscape Architect, submitting a plan showing proposed increase of four feet in the distance between the north line of the sidewalk of One Hundred and Twenty-third street and the south line of the plinth of the pedestal of the Hancock statue. Approved.

From Cornelius O'Reilly, Chairman of the Building Committee of the Hancock Memorial Association, asking permission to commence work on the foundation for the Hancock statue at a location shown on a plan submitted.

Mr. O'Reilly appeared and was heard in relation to the matter, and was requested to confer with the Landscape Architect.

From the Chairman of the Building Committee of the Grant Monument Association, asking permission to erect a shelter-house in the vicinity of the monument site for the use of the association. Granted.

From the Landscape Architect, reporting in relation to a site for the Thorwaldsen statue and recommending a location near the Artist's Gate, in Central Park, as shown on an accompanying plan. Approved.

From Park Policeman William J. Capper, applying for leave of absence for one month without pay. Granted.

From Gabriel Case, submitting bills for repairs to the boiler at McGown's Pass Tavern. Referred to Commissioner Tappen.

On motion of Commissioner Dana, the assignment made by John Peirce to the First National Bank of Bangor of certain money to be paid under his contract with this Department for erecting the north wing of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, was approved.

At the hour of eleven o'clock Mr. E. G. Marsh, representing the Comptroller, being present, and the meeting open to the public, the President, in the presence of the representative of the Comptroller, and such of the parties making proposals as were present, opened the estimate box and publicly opened and read all the estimates or proposals which had been received in accordance with advertisements duly published in the CITY RECORD for making alterations and repairs to the Castle Garden building in Battery Park.

#### TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

**ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT** act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets, shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act: When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance, direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.
