

Safe Home Heating Tips

Improper use of portable heating equipment can lead to fire or dangerous levels of carbon monoxide. Take precautions to ensure you are heating your home safely.

Fire Safety Tips

Use only portable heating equipment that is approved for indoor use. Keep combustible materials, including furniture, drapes, and carpeting at least three feet away from the heat source. *never* drape clothes over a space heater to dry.

Always keep an eye on heating equipment. Never leave children alone in the room where a space heater is running. Turn it off when you are unable to closely monitor it.

Be careful not to overload electrical circuits.

Make sure you have a working smoke alarm in every room. Check and change batteries often.

The USACE New York District, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), and the City of New York (NYC) will host a series of public meetings to facilitate stakeholder engagement and solicit public feedback about the tentative plan. Information about public meetings will be posted to the study website, and USACE New York District Twitter and Facebook pages.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) New York District wishes to announce an in-person public meeting for the New York New Jersey Harbor and Tributaries (NYNJHAT) Coastal Storm Risk Management (CSRM) Feasibility Study. The purpose of the meeting is to inform the public of the NYNJHAT Study Draft Integrated Feasibility Report (FR) and Tier 1 Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and the Tentatively Selected Plan (TSP), and to solicit public feedback on this tentative plan selection to manage coastal storm risk in the Study Area. The Draft Integrated FR/Tier 1 EIS is posted to the Study website at https://www.nan.usace.army.mil/NYNJHATS. Information on the public meeting is as follows:

DATE: Thursday, December 15, 2022

TIME: 2-4pm and 6-8pm

LOCATION: Alexander Hamilton U.S. Custom House, 1 Bowling Green, New York, NY 10004. Sessions will be in the Auditorium.

DIRECTIONS: Subway: 4/5 to Bowling Green; 1 to Rector Street or South Ferry; J/Z to Broad Street; 2/3 to Wall Street; R to Whitehall Street. Bus: M5, M15, M20. Parking garages in the vicinity.

Additional public meetings in locations around the study area are being planned and will be advertised to the public in advance. The <u>study website</u> will provide details of upcoming public meetings.

Additionally, The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) New York District announces an extension to the public comment period for the New York-New Jersey Harbor and Tributaries Study Draft Integrated Feasibility and Tier 1
Environmental Impact Statement that was released in September 2022. The public comment period closing date has been extended to March 7, 2023. The previous comment period closing date was January 6, 2023.

- Flooding / Climate Change Adaptation


