The Comptroller presented the following:

OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF NEW YORK,
NEW YORK, April 12, 1886.

To the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of the City of New York:

During the month of December last your Board appropriated the sum of thirty thousand dollars for the purchase by the City, from Mr. Robert J. Leaycraft, of certain indices claimed by him to be his property. The sale then contemplated by you has been consummated, and the indices in question are now in my custody and are in daily use by me in making the searches called for by persons having business with this office. At the time of the discussion before your Board, the claim upon the part of Mr. Leaycraft, as well as numerous gentlemen who appeared in his behalf, was, as I am informed, that unless these indices in question were purchased by and became the property of the City it would be impossible for the County Clerk to make the searches except at very great inconvenience to the legal profession, caused by the delay which would necessarily ensue in making the searches direct from the public docket. Since the consummation of the purchase from Mr. Leaycraft, a number of demands have been made upon me by various individuals, lawyers as well as persons representing private corporations, for permission to use the indices in making their own searches. I have refused in all cases such permission, because it could not be granted without, in the first place, seriously inconveniencing the business of this office, as, owing to the multitude of requisitions for searches which have been received by me since the first of January, the indices are in constant use by the searchers, and their work would be seriously delayed if these indices were in use by persons other than searchers of this office. Another reason for my refusal is that I had supposed the purchase was made simply to facilitate and expedite the labors of the searchers in this office, and that these indices were not in any sense to be considered as public records, not having been made in pursuance of any law, and not being competent to be used in evidence in any court or before any tribunal as to their contents. I consider them simply as a method devised by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to put in the hands of the County Clerk the necessary implements to enable him to perform the duty imposed on him by law. My refusal has caused dissatisfaction to some members of the bar, and I see by the public prints that notice of such refusal has been taken by the Bar Association, who have appointed a committee to take such steps as they may deem necessary to compel the granting of the right to use these indices and to make extracts from them at all times.

I write now to you to obtain your views and advice as to my duty in the premises. I do not desire to do anything which is going to conflict with the proper administration of the public service, nor do I intend to do anything which would deprive the City of the revenue to which it is justly entitled. When these indices were originally commenced it was a private enterprise, intended only as a temporary convenience. They were not substantially prepared even when they were found to be of permanent value, but were continued thereafter in the same manner. The indices are written upon very inferior paper, are bound in the most unsubstantial manner, and were only bound when it became absolutely necessary for their protection. Under all these circumstances these indices require the greatest care in handling to preserve them and keep them from destruction. Indiscriminate use of them by the legal profession, or by other parties desiring to inspect them, will not only speedily wear them out and destroy them, but as a natural consequence will materially reduce the revenue of the City, which it would otherwise receive were this inspection not made. The public records of the office, consisting of the dockets and other records required by law to be kept, are always open to the inspection of whoever desires to use them. These indices are of course a means of saving the time of lawyers in making their own individual searches, and could each lawyer make his own search, the Legislature might as well abolish all revenue to be derived from searches and relieve the County Clerk from the obligation of collecting any fees whatever for those services. For these reasons and these alone, I have heretofore declined to permit the public to use such indices or make extracts therefrom, believing that in so doing I have been faithfully discharging the duties of the office of County Clerk, as my official oath requires me to do.

AN ACT to amend chapter four hundred and ten of the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled "An act to consolidate into one act, and to declare the special and local laws affecting public interests in the city of New York."

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows : Section 1. Section eight hundred and fifty-three of chapter four hundred and ten of the laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled "An act to consolidate into one act and to declare the special and local laws affecting public interests in the city of New York," is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

§ 853. It shall be lawful for the said receiver, if any tax for personal property and the interest thereon, as hereinbefore provided, shall remain unpaid on the fifteenth day of January succeeding the receipt by him of the rolls, to issue his warrant, under his hand and seal, directed to the sheriff of the city and county of New York, commanding him to levy the said tax with interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent. per annum, from the day of the delivering of the assessment-rolls and warrants to the said receiver to the time when the same shall be paid by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the persons against whom the said warrants shall be issued, or of any goods or chattels in his or her possession wheresoever the same shall be found within the said city and county, and to pay the same to the said receiver, and return such warrant within sixty days after the date thereof.

§ 2. Section eight hundred and fifty-four of the said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

§ 854. In all cases where the said receiver shall proceed by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of any person for the payment of any tax due and payable, it shall be lawful for him to authorize and empower the sheriff to collect, in addition to the tax and the interest thereon, the costs of such distress and sale.

§ 3. Section eight hundred and fifty-five of the said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

§ 855. The sheriff to whom a warrant for the collection of any tax is issued shall give public notice of the time and place of sale of any property distrained by virtue thereof, and of the property to be sold, at least six days previous to the sale, by advertisements to be posted up in at least three public places in the ward where such sale shall be made. The sale shall be by public auction.

§ 4. Section eight hundred and fifty-nine of the said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

§ 859. It shall be the duty of the receiver of taxes to send or cause to be sent to the attorney for the collection of arrears of personal taxes, monthly, all cases of personal taxes embraced in the assessment-rolls, when the assessment is one thousand dollars or more, and upon which a warrant to the sheriff of said city and county has been issued and unsatisfied for a period of sixty days, or returned unsatisfied in whole or in part, and of all other cases of personal taxes, except in those cases where the receiver of taxes may extend the warrant, when application to any court may be made for the collection of the tax, and the said attorney is authorized to make requisitions upon the said receiver for all such cases.

§ 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

The Chairman moved that it be referred to the Comptroller, with the request that he address a communication to the Legislature, protesting against the passage of the said act, and that the same be presented to the members of this Board for their signatures.

AN ACT to facilitate communication between Staten Island and the City of New York.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Section 1. Whenever fifty residents of Staten Island who are freeholders therein, and twenty-five residents of the city of New York who are freeholders therein, shall file in the office of the clerk of the county of New York a certificate signed by them stating that an increase of the facilities for communication by water transportation between Staten Island and New York city is necessary, and will prove advantageous to the residents of Staten Island and of New York city, and shall designate therein for that purpose a suitable landing place in the city of New York other than one then regularly employed in the business of transporting passengers and freight between New York city and Staten Island and a suitable landing place on Staten Island, and also a person or corporation deemed by them suitable for engaging in such business and affording such increased facilities, it shall be the duty of the clerk of said county to forthwith file in the office of the clerk of the common council of the city of New York a certified copy of such certificate.

§ 2. Within ten days after the filing of such copy of said certificate in the office of the clerk of said common council, the mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York, acting through said common council and mayor, if they claim or possess the power so to do, shall establish a ferry between said designated landing places.

§ 3. In case of failure or refusal so to do by the mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York, no injunction order, judgment or decree of any court or judge restraining such person or corporation named in said certificate from carrying on such transportation between said landing places upon a claim that the mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York have any interest or authority of any kind in or over the transportation by water of passengers, animals, vehicles or freight between said landing places, or that such transportation between such points will interfere with any ferry previously established by the city of New York, shall be granted on the application of any one or shall possess any validity.

§ 4. All actions or legal proceedings instituted by the mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York, or any person or corporation against any person or corporation engaged under authority of this act in the aforesaid transportation business, for the purpose of establishing or maintaining any interest, authority or right of the said mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York, in, over or against the said transportation business, or of any person or corporation claiming under said municipal corporation, shall be brought elsewhere than in the city and county of New York, and in case any such interest, authority or right shall for any reason be therein established and allowed, the relief therein granted to said plaintiffs shall be limited to a recovery of the profits of the defendants from said transportation business over and above actual operating expenses thereof lawful interest on the value of the property therein employed.

§ 5. In case the said mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York shall, in the manner and within the time hereby designated, establish a ferry between the said designated landing places, such establishment of a ferry or the operation thereof shall not operate to limit or exclude the establishment or operation of any other ferry, but the same shall be offered for leasing by the commissioners of the sinking fund of the city of New York at a public auction, to be held within twenty days after such ferry is established, to the highest bidder of a specific sum of money as the rental thereof, and no upset price shall be fixed therefor, but no award shall be made to any bidder who shall not at the time of making a bid exhibit to the person or officer representing said city at said sale a written and valid authorization from the owner or owners of said landing places to use the same for the purpose of said ferry in case the privilege to operate the same is awarded to such bidder. Neither the said mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the city of New York, nor any officer, department or agent thereof shall impose upon any bidder at such auction or any lessee of such ferry any terms or conditions with respect to the same more burdensome or exacting than those imposed upon bidders for or the lessee of any other ferry from New York city to Staten Island, and in case violation of provision is attempted it shall be void and may be designated at such direction, or if contained in such lease, and the supreme court shall have power, on the application of any person who has signed the certificate hereinbefore designated, by any appropriate remedy, to compel obedience to this provision and shall compel such obedience.

§ 6. Nothing contained in this act is intended or shall be construed to admit, deny or establish any rights or asserted rights of the city of New York in or to any ferries between said city and Staten Island.

§ 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

The Chairman moved that the same be referred to the Comptroller, with the request that he address a communication to the Legislature, protesting against the passage of the act, and that the same be presented to the members of this Board for their signatures.

Bidders are required to state in their estimates the district or several streets, avenues, piers, parks and places, or parts of streets, avenues, piers, parks and places in which they propose to perform the requirements herein contained, and also the illuminating or candle-power of the light they propose to furnish, when tested at a distance of not less than one mile from the place of manufacture.

Bidders are also required to state the price per year for which they will furnish the lights for the period from May 1, 1886, to April 30, 1887, both days inclusive; stating the price, for the above named period of one year, for each lamp.

Bidders proposing to furnish electric-lights must state the kind of system of light (whether the Voltaic Arc or Incandescent) they propose to furnish, also the candle-power of the light by photometric test, according to the London standard, and also whether the electric lamps are to be used on the ordinary lamp-posts of the city, or on special lamp-posts to be fitted up by the bidder without cost to the city for such lamp-posts or their fittings. No estimate will be received or considered unless accompanied by either a certified check upon one of the National Banks of the City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money, to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the security required for the faithful performance of the contract. Such check or money must not be inclosed in the sealed envelope containing the estimate, but must be handed to the officer or clerk of the Department who has charge of the Estimate-box, and no estimate can be deposited in said box until such check or money has been examined by said officer or clerk and found to be correct. All such deposits, except that of the successful bidder, will be returned to the persons making the same within three days after the contract is awarded. If the successful bidder shall neglect or refuse, within five days after notice that the contract has been awarded to him, to execute the same, the amount of the deposit made by him shall be forfeited to and retained by the City of New York as liquidated damages for such neglect or refusal; but, if he shall execute the contract within the time aforesaid, the amount of his deposit will be returned to him.

The award of any contract, if awarded, will be made as soon as practicable after the opening of the bids.

Should the person or persons to whom any contract is so awarded neglect or refuse to accept the contract within five days after written notice that the same has been awarded to his bid or estimate, or if he accept, but does not execute the contract and give the proper security, it may be re-advertised and relet as provided by law and ordinance.

But no payment to such bidder, on account of any such lamps, will be made for the time so allowed, nor until the same shall have been connected with the mains or conductors of such bidder, nor except for the time during which all the requirements herein mentioned shall have been fully performed.

SIR—There were 726 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, April 3, 1886, which is a decrease of 67, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 65 less than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1885. The actual mortality for the week ending March 27, 1886, was 758, which is 29.8 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 27.60 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,428,099.
