EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 79

EXTENSION OF EMERGENCY ORDER REGARDING WAIVER OF CERTAIN LOCAL LAWS  
RELATED TO DEMOLITION

November 2, 2014

WHEREAS Emergency Executive Order 75, issued October 18, 2014, contains a proclamation extending a state of emergency in the City of New York, and such a proclamation remains in effect for a period not to exceed thirty days or until rescinded, whichever occurs first; and

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2012, the Governor issued a Declaration of Emergency for all counties in the State of New York, including the City of New York and contiguous counties, and on August 6, 2014, extended such Declaration for the counties of Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and Richmond and such declaration remains in effect for 180 days;

WHEREAS, Executive Order 234, issued February 5, 2013, contains an emergency order regarding waiver of certain local laws related to demolition;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered:

§ 1. The emergency order regarding waiver of certain local laws related to demolition set forth in Executive Order 234 and subsequently extended most recently in Emergency Executive Order 78 dated October 28, 2014, is hereby extended for five days.

§ 2. This Order shall take effect immediately. It shall remain in effect for (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
